

Greenwood Community Awards Recognises Volunteers from Warsop and Woodhouse

Three individual volunteers from Warsop and Mansfield Woodhouse were recognised with Greenwood Community Awards (Thursday 2nd July) at Rufford Country Park, Ollerton.

Greenwood Partnership Board Chair, Councillor John Knight presented the awards to community groups and individual volunteers, for outstanding contribution towards improving the environment. He praised volunteers in his welcome speech: "We will only notice when Friends groups aren't around that they do such a marvellous job."

Nominations had been received from groups and organisations for environmental work carried out over the last year working towards the creation of Greenwood, Nottinghamshire's Community Forest.

One Hundred and thirty guests enjoyed a review of achievements by volunteers and organisations presented by Friends of Brinsley Headstock's Colin Barson, Chair of the Friends of Greenwood Community Forum.

Twelve awards were presented on the night to volunteers from all areas of Greenwood and included awards for individuals and teams of all ages and abilities who take part in conservation tasks or work behind the scenes.

A highlight of the evening was the presentation of an engraved spade to Friends of Greenwood Community Forum Chair, Colin Barson, who has presented a review of achievements every year since 2005. Colin will step down as Chair of the Forum this August. He said: "I have been involved for fifteen years and have relished every one of those years. Being the Chair of such a worthwhile and valued group has been a pleasure and a delight".

He added: "Tonight has been another successful and enjoyable evening and I will leave with a spring in my step after hearing about some inspirational stories. Congratulations to every one of the award winners, it's always very pleasant to know that you are valued by your peers and that your efforts have been recognised."

She also liaised with a history student who was putting together a historical exhibition and an artist who is creating a public sculpture.

All of these activities have enhanced the park, some in lasting ways others in less tangible ways but all have inspired even more people and community groups to use Yeoman Hill Park. It was certainly a remarkable and memorable centenary year.

As volunteers go they don't come better than Steve Horne. If he isn't planning the next Friends of Thynghowe event or out pulling balsam, he is installing waymarkers or clearing vegetation with the Warsop footpaths group. Steve is a key member of the Friends of Thynghowe. He doesn't hold a formal position but the treasurer, secretary and chairman would all struggle if Steve wasn't there to lend a hand. His enthusiasm for archaeology and local history shine through whenever talking to people about Sherwood. He gives talks, leads walks and more. He attends events to display the work of the groups he is involved with, recruit members and help enhance people's understanding of their environment.

Steve's computer skills enable him to manage the Friends of Thynghowe website, emails, Facebook, collate information about events, fill in funding bids and keep track of accounts. His map wizardry is amazing.

This year, he has helped remove rhododendron from Thynghowe, a rotten job made easier by his enthusiasm for completing the task. Steve has destroyed the population of Himalayan Balsam at Shirebrook Wood. In 2013, Steve and his team removed 17,000 plants on the river Meden.

GARDENING MONTHLY...



General tasks and garden maintenance

The most important thing this month is to enjoy your garden; heady scents, glorious colours, an abundance of fruits and vegetables and hopefully more sunshine. What could be more enjoyable and satisfying than surveying the results of your hard work throughout the year?

Remember to water and feed your plants regularly, especially those in hanging baskets, pots or containers as well as climbers and roses growing against a sunny wall. Many a plant will not recover from a drought, so water regularly and do not resort to

Water hydrangeas with hydrangea colourant for true blue hydrangeas next year.

If possible, set up an automatic watering system for your vegetable plot, borders and even containers. They are worth their weight in gold and can work on a sensor system that detects how dry the soil is. Once you have one you will wonder why you did not install one years ago. Going on holiday will no longer involve wondering if your precious plants will survive a dry spell or paying someone else to hold a hose!

If it stays warm and dry, water saving strategies include using bathwater and washing up water, provided they are neither too dirty or oily.

Keep your pond topped up, free of pond weed and clean - green algae can be

Weeding

Boring but vital. Keep on top of weeds in borders, the vegetable garden and all your pots and containers. Little and often will reduce what will become a Herculean task if left to spiral out of control.

Weeds not only look messy but use valuable moisture in the ground. The best and easiest way to weed is to use a Dutch hoe which will cut the weeds just below the surface. Weeding on a sunny day will ensure weeds left on the surface dry out and die in the warmth.

Footpath & Countryside Group

The Footpaths Group has now been active in Warsop's countryside for almost 20 years although many people are not aware of what we get up to. At a time when a lack of new volunteers may jeopardize our future, I thought I would mention some of our activities.

The group was originally set up with maintaining the local footpaths network as a priority. Initially, we were part of the Nottinghamshire County Council's Parish Paths Partnership scheme and we have continued to manage the paths following the council's abolition of the scheme. Last year, our footpaths work programme ran smoothly and we recorded a total of nearly 400 volunteer hours on our workdays, a record number for the last fourteen years. We mowed over 10 miles of footpath, 20 if you count cutting both sides! In addition to the routine autumn hedge trimming, we had to clear several paths following the collapse of blackthorn due to the winter weather. In addition, we replaced only one waymark post this year, in past years we have had to replace many more signs and waymarks.



We also complete conservation tasks on Warsop's wildlife sites, managing grasslands and removing bracken, brambles and gorse. We have recently coppiced some of the trees we planted on the edge of the Carrs Local Nature Reserve sixteen years ago and the adjoining hedgerow has been trimmed. We have also planted a new length of hedge. We continue to monitor non-native invasive species in the parish, passing the data to Nottinghamshire Biodiversity Action Group and we last year we devoted around 70 hours to Himalayan balsam management alongside the River Meden, Sookholme Brook and Shire Brook, removing over 17000 plants. This May, we surveyed a stretch of the river for water vole activity for the fourth year.

Our programme of monthly walks is attracting a steady level of support for these outings both locally and further afield. We also share our enthusiasm for our local countryside through these Warsop News notes and we recently published a new Parish Paths map leaflet with support from the Big Warsop ROLO fund. We also designed posters about Warsop's wildlife and we have promoted Warsop's countryside at the Major Oak Woodland Festival in Sherwood Forest

We raise our concerns about threats to Warsop's countryside with the appropriate authorities. We are members of the Greenwood Community Forest Forum and we attend Sherwood Catchment Management meetings.

As I suggested earlier, new volunteers are needed if we are to continue with all of these tasks. Please get in touch if you feel you can help in any way. Our activities are suitable for younger folk who may be wanting experience of conservation work which may help with their CV, retired people looking for worthwhile tasks in the outdoors, or anybody who wishes to contribute to keeping our countryside accessible and well managed.

We do not organise a group walk in August but we plan to be walking again on the third Saturday of September.



Public donations of paint accepted at these sites are checked by the site staff and any tins that contain good quality reusable paint are put aside in a designated shelved paint cabin.

This reusable paint is then given away free of charge, throughout the year, to community and voluntary groups registered on the scheme. The paint cabins at Beeston, Newark and Warsop started collecting paint in March and are filling up well with reusable paint so we're inviting groups in your area to apply so that they can get their hands on some free paint.

Over 100 groups have received around 12,000 litres of reusable paint so far but we're always keen to help even more.



Police Update

Proposed reduction in PCSOs

We knew at the start of this financial year that some very difficult decisions would need to be taken to meet the demands placed upon us to save money. Unfortunately, that time has arrived and we are forced to consider reducing some PCSO posts in order to meet future demands with a greatly reduced funding allocation.

Over the past three years, Nottinghamshire Police has had to make savings of £42m which represents a budget reduction of 20%. Last year, our plan was to save £12.7m – this target was not fully achieved which means that from 1 April 2015, further savings of £12m are necessary. On top of this, the Government's spending plans indicate further savings through to 2019-20 which are likely to mean a 50% reduction in our budget between 2010 and 2020.

As about 80% of our money is earmarked to pay for officers and staff, it is inevitable that reductions have to be made. A new model of working has been created to meet the different levels of crime, risk and demand in different areas and this potentially could reduce the numbers of PCSOs by 72.59 (FTE) and neighbourhood police officers by 18.5 (FTE).

While this is a small fraction of the total workforce, it is nonetheless a regrettable situation that we find ourselves in, and is entirely due to the current financial challenges. The number of PCSOs in Nottinghamshire has grown by 50 to 317 since I came to office and this is recognition of the value they bring to community safety. However, looking at the scale of the savings required the only way of achieving such targets realistically is a major reconfiguration of the services we offer.

Discussions are still taking place including with trade unions, about how the new neighbourhood model will best take place. However, the Chief Constable and myself remain committed to neighbourhood policing and all areas of Nottinghamshire will continue to receive support.

Should the reductions go ahead as currently planned, the number of PCSOs in Nottinghamshire will remain higher than the other forces in the region.

Rural Round-up

Over the last few weeks rural residents and workers across the country have been able to make their voices count in a national survey about crime and policing in the countryside.

Run by the National Rural Crime Network (NRCN), this is the largest ever survey regarding crime and anti-social behaviour in rural areas. The findings will help to lift the lid on the reality of criminality in the countryside and drive forward positive change and reform.

This supports the rural focus that I have made a priority in my Police and Crime Plan, which is now gaining pace across the county. Later in the year, we will be unveiling a new website, dedicated to rural crime, to support those living in rural areas.

Keeping safe this summer

With the summer upon us and the promise of more hot weather ahead, long, bright days are just what we need to relax after a hard day's work and it's equally enjoyable to combine such relaxation with your favourite tipple.

There's nothing wrong with this. It's drinking to excess that is the problem. Taking care with the amount of alcohol we consume is not only respectful of our own health but is also being courteous to the people around us. Excessive alcohol can lead to disorder and this . doesn't just mean the local nightclub on a Friday and Saturday night - it happens as much at civilised garden parties and barbecues and wherever there is heavy drinking involved.

The message this summer is to stay in control. Drinking responsibly is not boring. It makes sense. We also need to remember lock up our valuables and take greater care of our personal belongings. Windows and doors should always be closed and locked when you go out, regardless of the temperature. Don't allow the heat to melt your judgement. Always be vigilant.

The 24th meeting of Meden Vale the **Future, incorporating Meden Vale Community Association, was held at** the Village Hall on Tuesday 12 May 2015. 10 members of the Committee were present. Two apologies were received and also the 25th meeting held on 23 June. 9 members of the **Committee were present. Three** apologies were received.

The Chairman reported that he had been in communication with Welbeck Miners Trust (our Landlord) regarding the Village Hall Lease. The annual rent would include the building insurance, electrical testing and the annual fire inspection by Mansfield Mines Rescue. The Committee would have the responsibility for the Public Liability Insurance. A general discussion was held around this proposal and the Chairman was instructed to continue negotiations with the Trust members and to draw up a joint memorandum of understanding between the parties, to cover the responsibilities of both the landlord and the tenants. The Caretaker reported that the guttering, down pipes and soakaways required urgent attention. The Treasurer reported that monies had been raised to cover the cost of a new central heating boiler and replacement of the main hall light fittings. This work to proceed as soon as possible.

A Welbeck Colliery the Future meeting was held on 10 June, progress on the pit tip restoration was proceeding according to plan but unfortunately recent vandalism to a dumper truck and screening plant had not helped matters. Trial borings were being taken on the Biogas site to test the depth of foundations required. The Plans for the colliery site were nearing completion and would be promoted at the Warsop Carnival on Sunday 5 July. The next meeting will be held on 16 September.

In addition, it was reported that the two firms on the Netherfield Lane Industrial Estate wished to expand and will be offered larger premises on the pit site and the wood chipping business is planning to locate to the colliery site, subject to planning and financial consideration.

The Treasurer reported that funds were depleted following payment of the winter utility bills. The Chairman reported that the annual returns to the Inland Revenue had been completed. It was reported that the Neighbourhood Watch meeting held at the Three Lions in April was well attended.

It was advised that 20 mph speed restriction signs would be placed outside all local schools in the Warsop Parish area.

Next meeting will be on Tuesday 21 July, 2015 at 7.30 pm. All welcome.

The Friends of Thynghowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

This recent post on the fascinating Archaeology & History of King's Clipstone Facebook page highlighted the hardships suffered by Warsop folk 700 years ago. Climate change, food shortages and seizure of communal resources by a ruling elite are not new issues, maybe all we now need is a modern Robin Hood!

"In the winter of 1316 during a devastating famine brought about by extreme climate change the ruler of England - Edward II - ordered a 200 acre expanse of Sherwood Forest to be enclosed to provide a fortified agricultural enclosure specifically to feed the royal family when they were in residence at Clipstone. This was known as Clipstone Peel and it was located on what is today Snake Hill and Spa Ponds.

The tragic fall out of this decision was the removal of common rights for the ordinary people of Warsop, Mansfield Woodhouse and Clipstone. Already facing starvation due to the appalling lack of food available, these people now lost an enormous amount of woodland which had previously provided grazing land for their pigs, undergrowth for animal bedding, timber for building shelter and creating warmth as firewood.

By 1327-8 a crisis point had been reached and a delegation was sent to entreat with the new king Edward III. Edward agreed to dismantle the fortress, however, crucially he retained ownership of the 200 acres. It was a very hollow victory for the

Perhaps 50 years later, we get the first ever reference to the heroic outlaw Robin Hood fighting his fight for the common man of Sherwood Forest. It can be surely no accident that such harsh treatment at the hands of the monarchy in the 14th century led to the creation of this story of the heroic freedom-fighter of Sherwood Forest...."

I will let you decide whether there are any lessons to be learned from these events. Perhaps our rulers ought to be more aware of how some accounts tell us Edward II ended his days!
