

# Meden Celebrates 50 Years

# Pupils and staff past and present recently attended the 50th anniversary of the opening of Meden School.

Former teachers present included Mr Ellis, Mr Phoenix, Mrs Davies, Mr Bird and Mrs Buxton.

Mrs Janet Brashaw, current Headteacher, welcomed everyone to the event which included musical entertainment provided by former pupils who played songs from the five decades the school has been open, as well as an exhibition of photos and memorabilia. There were refreshments on offer including a barbecue in the House Court.

Mr Barrie Ellis, who was the first head teacher, returned to the school especially for the celebrations and spoke to a packed hall. He spoke about the changes which have taken place since the 1960s and recalled the first pupil to walk down the school path, who he was reunited with at the anniversary celebrations

He paid tribute to the two deputy head teachers who were appointed with him in 1965, Mr Sid Thompson and Mrs Kate Spiers, both of whom have since passed away.



He also recalled the two caretakers during his time as Head as well as the first Chair of school governors, Alderman William

Mr Ellis, now 88, told how new buildings were built as the school population grew from 600 to 1500 children in the 1970s and the fight he had with the education department at County Hall who wanted to implement an open plan design which he said he managed to alter.

He said 'I always tried to teach pupils the value of courtesy and respect; and spoke of the schools links with the community

Mrs Brashaw presented the former Headteacher with a plaque of the old and new school badges, which Mr Ellis said would have pride of place in his home

On Friday 17th July a time capsule was planted at the front of the school and on the last day of term there was a mass balloon launch.



# **GARDENING MONTHLY...**



# **General tasks and** garden maintenance

#### **Start your compost**

Get your compost going by buying a compost bin or building a partially enclosed and easily accessible area for a heap. It is essential to replace the goodness in soil and autumn produces quantities of garden waste that will add invaluable organic richness

Remember to add a variety of different materials; spent vegetable plants are ideal, but NEVER add diseased or pest-ridden material to your compost heap - it will nurture whatever villain you are trying to eliminate with loving care!

#### Clear garden debris

 $Keep\ weeding; most\ perennial\ weeds\ are\ susceptible\ to\ weedkiller\ this\ month\ and$ systemic weedkillers will carry on working throughout the winter. Also clear any debris and diseased material from your garden. Pests and diseases that overwinter in your garden will reappear next spring with a vengeance so get rid of them now. Burn diseased material and put the rest of your garden rubbish (apart from woody stems) in

#### Clean out the greenhouse

Once to matoes and other greenhouse crops are over, give the greenhouse a thorough clean to prevent pests from making a home in that lovely warm environment, ready to leap into action next spring.

#### Dig clay soil

If your soil is heavy clay, start digging it over now - add plenty of organic matter to improve the quality and pea shingle to improve the drainage. It can be left in a pretty rough state over the winter when the cold will break the lumps down, making spring planting infinitely easier!

#### **Watering**

Should September turn into an Indian summer, remember to keep watering thoroughly once or twice a week rather than little and often. Containers and hanging

For recently planted large shrubs or trees, leave a hose trickling around the base for an hour. The same goes for established plants in dry periods - camellias, rhododendrons, azaleas and hydrangeas will abort next season's flowers if they get too dry.

Ensure trees or shrubs planted in the last couple of years on lawns or in areas of rough grass have a circle of clear earth around them - this MUST be kept clear or grass will prevent essential moisture getting through. Mulching with bark or compost will help.

#### **Planting**

With the ideal planting conditions of autumn (warm moist soil), now is the time to plant container grown shrubs, trees, fruit bushes, perennials and bulbs. The key to successful planting is to water in well. Soak the rootball in a bucket until no air bubbles come to the surface, dig the planting hole, fill with water and allow to drain away. Place the plant in the hole, fill with soil, firm gently and water well with a watering can - this will give the plant a huge advantage over one planted with a dry rootball in a dry hole and watered only on the surface.

# Footpath &



#### **New signposts and waymark posts** have been erected in Church Warsop's **Collier Spring Wood. These highlight** the fact that the bridleway only runs for 210 metres from Wood Lane before it becomes a footpath.

This means that cyclists and horse riders can only legally access the first stretch. The reason for this strange situation is apparent if you look at a map from the time before much of this part of the parish was buried beneath the waste material from Warsop Main Colliery. Spring Lane ran between Church Warsop and William Wood Lane with cottages between the woodlands and William Wood Farm. This explains the truncated bridleways at either end of this buried lane. You can find out more about the changes to this part of Warsop in our hedgerows booklet that can be read online. You can locate it by searching the web for Warsop Hedgerows Issue.

During the summer months we try to avoid cutting hedges but there are times when we have to work on them to keep paths accessible. A recent example was the public footpath running north beside the railway at Meden Vale where blackthorn and other vegetation was encroaching upon the path. We tried to minimize the number of blackthorn stems that we trimmed as many were covered with sloes. These hedgerows fruits provide a vital food source for birds in winter. So sloe gin makers now know a good site to go foraging but there is such a good crop that there should be enough for both humans and birds! Normally we delay our hedge work until the period between the end of the hedgerow fruits and the start of the nesting season.

2015 does not appear to have been a particularly good year for our local orchids. An exception was a fine patch of Fragrant Orchids but there were fewer Bee Orchids on the sites where they appear in most years. The weather and the management of the sites influences orchid numbers so hopefully numbers will recover next year.

Our campaign against Himalayan Balsam along our waterways continues with promising results around Sookholme and a stable situation along the River Meden. However it is not only on riverbanks where this invasive non-native plant is a menace. Small clumps are appearing In some of our woods so if you come across some plants either pull it up or let us know. You only have to look at the condition of the woods alongside the River Maun at Clipstone to see what can occur if Himalayan Balsam is not controlled.

Over the second weekend in September we will be promoting Warsop's countryside and walking routes at the Major Oak Woodland Festival. If you can make it to this excellent event on September 12th and 13th we will be based in the Forestry Commission marquee.

We plan to resume our monthly walks on the third Saturday of September. Get in touch if you would like to join us for a walk of about five or six miles in the local countryside. We usually meet at 10am at Warsop Library but times, meeting places and even the date may change, so check details first.







Inspired by this, we're building a replica trench system to show visitors how they would have looked to the soldiers who fought in them.

This is the second time the cadet's skills have been put to good use, last November saw the cadets creating wooden ammunition and weapon crates to add to the project's realism. These will be added to the site at a later date.

Warsop Air Cadets are always actively recruiting and are looking for new cadets. We offer 12 (year 8 at school) – 17 year olds the opportunity to go flying and gliding, adventure training, target rifle shooting, compete at sports, go on camps in the UK and overseas as well as gain academic qualifications and take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's award scheme. Later that year the meetings changed venue, and met at the Methodist Chapel on Clumber Street, at 7-00pm with children left at home with their dads

Venues have changed serveral times over the years as we have got older, and various circumstances, we are now – very happily settled in the Stable Barn, at the Parish Centre, still meeting on a Tuesday Evening at 7-00pm and still with a membership of 30 plus.

Over the years we have raised thousands of pounds for many charities, the first one was the Childrens Home at Edwinstowe, and we bought camping equipment, and without the loyal support of the people of Warsop, and surrounding areas, and the hard work of all our members, we could not have achieved this, so we say "Thank-You".

We have had trips galore, the very first was to "Paris" in the spring – we flew from a very basic Castle Donnington Airport, now East Midlands, most of us had never set foot in an airport let alone fly. That trip was followed some time later to Boulogne... yes we really did see The World (France) at least. In this country we have visited London, many times, and on our trip to Beamish even the bus driver got lost. Without the help of one of our members, (a Geordie) we would never have got there but we did, just as they were closing but when they heard our story they stayed open another hour, so that we could all buy something to take back for our children. Then there was the day trip to Rhyl for the children – where mums and children played rounders on the beach, but that was fun – no lpods or mobile phones just good 'ol fun.

We have had many Jumble Sales – a thing of the past now.

Then very adventurous, we decided our next Fund Raiser, would be a dance, we had it catered for and held it at "The Lady Margaret Hall" and yes you've guessed it, there was not enough food, good old Pearl and Bryan Herbert, drove back to Warsop – brought a chicken (their Sunday dinner) and two loaves, and we all set on and made sandwiches. When we challenged the local Warsopian Caterer about it she said 'well if you had chicken you weren't suppose to have cheese and if you had trifle you weren't suppose to have cake 'Happy Days!!We did all future catering ourselves, although we never organised another dance.

One of my many memories was a day trip we did, and as always we had a raffle on the bus – we had had a jumble sale a couple of weeks before, where we found a pair of 'Don Estelle' (Some Mothers do Av Em) shorts and for a bit of fun we decided to have them as a raffle prize, and whoever won them had to wear them on the bus...Lovely, quiet, reserved Doreen Tinkler (sadly died) won them, she put them on – but as she told us she had never owned a pair of shorts and she wore them all day, we've had some very happy times. T could write a book but Spae won't allow it.

I married Eric in 1960 and left my native Sheffield and settled here in Warsop now Market Warsop, which I always call it, and I have loved every minute of my life here. I have made lots of friends not least my friends at Warsop Wives. My mum used to come to Warsop and she loved it too, she would go on her own into Warsop and when she got back she said everyone says 'Good Morning' and you're Jean's mum. The very last thing we have done was to knit poppies, and Glenys Fearn made them into two wreaths, and these were laid on our behalf by Jean Hall and Glenys at the Cenotaph on Armistice Dav.

At our next meeting with members and visiting members, we will be having a celebration of Fifty Years of Friendship and Togetherness.

# Mill Dam Update

Members continue to remove debris but the growing cover of algae does not help. The banks are badly in need of cutting as they where not cut last autumn. This is the responsibility of MDC and not FOTC.

The bailiffs are continuing to do their work and we ask all to support them. Rats are increasing in number and a lot of attention to the problem is needed by MDC.

We are to have a meeting with the executive officer of MDC to discuss the Carrs as part 2 of the complain procedure. We also hope to have a discussion with the new Portfolio Holder to ascertain what action is needed to have Green Flag status for the Carrs and also to discuss work that is needed on the Carrs.

The silt trap has had the boards removed and this obviously stops it from doing its job. The silt trap, after a year, needs the silt removing.

FOTC are receiving many complaints from members of the public about the state of the Carrs. We must remind them that the responsibility lies with MDC. FOTC is a Friends group and we carry out works on the Carrs on a voluntary basis. We raise funds and act as a pressure group. We did have an understanding with MDC from when the Group was initiated that items affecting the Carrs would be discussed with us. This no longer happens and MDC rarely attend our meetings. If any member of the public has a complaint please feel free to bring it to the attention of MDC.

# £1.7m development brings homes and jobs

### Work is under way to build 12 family council homes in Mansfield.

The £1.76 million development in Pye Avenue is one of several housing schemes being built for Mansfield District Council, which will see more than 170 homes being built over the next couple of years.

The project is being funded by the council from its own financial resources with help from a £216,000 grant from the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA) which in 2014/15 helped fund more than 50,000 homes in England.

Building on the site began in June and is expected to take a year to complete. It will transform the former disused garage site, which attracted problems such as anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping and was the source of on-going concern to local residents

The 12 houses – five with three bedrooms and seven with two bedrooms - will be owned and let by the council.

To apply to live in one, residents must first register with the council's Homefinder service. The properties are likely to be advertised by Homefinder in spring next year.

The development, constructed by Geda Construction, based in Kegworth, near Derby, will not only provide much needed new housing in the district, it is also expected to provide work for about 120 people, many of them from the district, at some point over the course of the year it takes to build.

In addition, the scheme will create four apprenticeships and provide valuable work experience for at least four construction industry students from West Nottinghamshire College in Mansfield.

#### Portfolio Holder for Housing Cllr Barry Answer said:

"This scheme represents a significant investment in council housing in the area - which was one of the Mayor of Mansfield's pledges - and this will provide 12 much needed family homes, as well as work and business for many local people in course of their construction

"The end result is that we will see an area that was something of a problem area transformed and put to the best possible use.

Cllr Dave Saunders, Portfolio Holder for Regeneration, added: This is an excellent example of a development scheme which will breathe new life into an area that was previously a source of problems for local residents."

Aaron Hughes, General Manager at Geda Construction, said: We are delighted to be working in conjunction with Mansfield District Council on this project.

"Not only will the finished scheme provide much needed new-build general needs housing, but it will also bring back into positive use an area of council land that has been derelict for some time.

# Housing and regeneration in council's top five aims

# Warsop Parish Council Honours Local War Hero

Warsop Parish Councillors are currently looking at renaming the Warsop inner relief road on the A60 from the traffic lights to the junction of Carr Lane in honour of Sgt Robert Bye.

Parish Councillor Adrian Hardy, said;

"It would be wonderful to see this lasting tribute paid to Sgt Bye, which is long overdue.

"Since the inner relief road was opened in the late 70s it has never had a name, some people call it Church Street and others Mansfield Road.

"There are no properties on this stretch of road so it would not inconvenience anyone."

Consultations are currently under way with Mansfield District Council who are responsible for the renaming of roads and an update will be given to Parish Councillors at the September meeting

Sgt Bye was awarded the VC on 31st July 1917 for his actions at the Yser Canal, Belgium

He showed courage and devotion to duty during an attack on the enemy's position in the third battle of Ypres, where he accounted for 70 of the enemy.

He received the VC from King George V on 27th September 1917, and upon receiving the honour, he was reported to have said: "I am proud of the honour conferred upon me, but I only went out to France to do what millions of others are doing, my duty. In honouring me you are honouring my comrades out in France, for they all did well that day."

Born in Wales, he came to live in Warsop in 1925 with his wife, Mabel, and they had two sons and two daughters. He worked at Warsop and Welbeck collieries and was also a temporary constable at Mansfield and took an active part in British Legion activities and served as a marshal for Remembrance Day parades during the 1930s.

He died at his daughter's home in Warsop in 1962 aged 72, and was buried in Warsop Cemetery with full military honours.

Sgt Bye is still proudly remembered by his old regiment where his VC and group of medals are on display at the Guards Museum, Wellington Barracks, London.



# **Changes to car park fees**

# Visitors to Mansfield will soon be able to park for 30 minutes for free in all Mansfield District Council surface car parks.

In addition, drivers parking in the Four Seasons and Walkden Street multi-storey car parks will be able to park for three hours for the price of two hours.

Cashless parking will also be introduced at the council's seventeen car parks with no administration fees for those who pay by mobile phone.

The decision was taken by the Executive Mayor Kate Allsop on Monday 20 July.

The new parking fees, which are designed to encourage visitors and residents to spend longer in the town centre and contribute to revitalising the district, will take effect following a consultation process

The provision of free parking for 30 minutes will help residents to visit the town centre for a short time at no cost.

The new fees will be introduced until 31 March 2016.

Car parking income could potentially reduce by £180,000 a year. The impact of the changes will be monitored monthly ahead of a decision being made on whether to include the revised charges in the 2016/17 budget.

Before the changes are implemented, a Car Park Order (CPO) must be published for consultation. It is hoped that the consultation process will be completed by mid-September.

Executive Mayor Kate Allsop said: "These measures are all about boosting business and enabling our local economy to flourish. Offering an extra free hour when buying two hours car parking in our multi-storeys will encourage people to spend longer in the town centre, where they can make use of our excellent shopping facilities.

"For those people, who wish to make shorter trips without incurring parking charges, the introduction of half hour free parking will provide an added incentive for shoppers to come into the town centre and make that quick purchase."




