# Warsop Remembrance Service

Warsop residents joined the Meden Vale District Branch of the Royal British Legion as they remembered the dead of two world wars and all service personnel killed since then, at a service at the town's Cenotaph led by the Rector, the Rev Angela Fletcher assisted by the new curate Reverend Jennie Sharpe.

On 13th November 2016, the remembrance day parade made its way through the town marching from Carr Lane to the Cenotaph.

They were also joined by the Queen's representative - Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire, Mrs Nicky Weston, plus Parish, District and County Councillors, the Police and Fire Brigade, as well as members of local groups and organisations. A two-minutes' silence observed at 11am was followed by the Reveille

Wreaths were laid both at the cenotaph and at the post 1945 memorial whilst all the names of soldiers killed during the two world wars were read out. The parade then made its way back to Carr Lane. Organisers commented on how nice it was to see so many people turn out to participate in the ceremony including lots of youngsters.

# **GARDENING MONTHLY...**



### **General Tasks and Garden Maintenance**

Carry on digging over beds and borders and incorporate as much organic matter as you can. Forking over not only helps prepare the soil for next year, it helps reduce pests by exposing them to hungry birds.

Protect pots and taps from frost by wrapping insulation around them. Bubble wrap is ideal and probably in plentiful supply if you are ordering Christmas presents over the

Clear paths of moss and lichen, treat timber with preservative, repair fences, check sheds and walls (but avoid any concreting until there is no chance of frost), clean and insulate greenhouses (that bubble wrap again!) and ensure heaters are working properly. Even a little insulation will make a huge difference to your heating bill.

Clean and repair your garden tools and clock the lawn mower in for a service. New tools are always a welcome present, as are new gardening gloves... especially good quality ones.

Clear debris - this is vital to prevent slugs and snails from setting up home in those lovely warm and damp conditions! However, a plea for wildlife... An artless pile of sticks and logs will make a wonderful 'des res' for hibernating hedgehogs and the like, so please don't be too ferocious on the tidying front. Make leaf mould out of fallen leaves - they will rot down into fantastically fertile matter after a year (2 for oak leaves). Store wet leaves (they must be wet to rot) in large black plastic sacks forked with holes or piled into a chicken wire container or similar. Failing that, add them to the compost heap.

Take care not to let leaves accumulate around alpines - they will die if left damp for long. Cover bare patches around clumps with gritty compost to encourage regrowth.

### Trees, shrubs and climbers

From now until March is the ideal time to plant bare rooted deciduous hedging - the most economical way to establish a hedge. Beech and hornbeam (similar to beech but more suitable for heavy soils) both keep their leaves over the winter and are therefore good for screening, whilst hawthorn is the 'country classic' - perfect for a natural looking yet almost impenetrable barrier.

Prepare a trench, preferably a week or so before planting to give the soil a chance to settle. Wait until the ground is neither sodden nor frozen and plant away - it's worth waiting for the right conditions; your plants will be perfectly happy sitting in the pots of compost they came in for weeks!

Rhododendrons and camellias make excellent Christmas presents - if your soil is unsuitable (alkaline), the centre has a great choice of elegant pots. Don't forget the ericaceous compost..

Tidy up trees and shrubs, cutting out any dead, diseased or damaged wood where necessary. (And on the Christmas present front, sharp new secateurs and loppers are a gardener's dream!)

Cut shoots and branches for winter decoration. If you have holly berries, net some of them for Christmas, otherwise the birds will have the lot. Secure netting firmly to prevent birds becoming trapped in loose folds.

Make a Christmas wreath using evergreen sprigs from your garden, decorations such as berries and fir cones, dried orange slices, cinnamon sticks and wide, wired ribbon.

### Flowers and containers

Put bark chips around hellebores to protect the delicate blooms from rain splashes and cut off any leaves with black spots on them - this is a fungal disease and not to be tolerated! Bring in any tender plants that are not already in shelter.

Bulbs - they should really be planted already, but if you haven't quite got around to it, put them in the ground as soon as you can. It's not exactly text book stuff, but they will probably come up and flower in the spring, even if a little later than normal - worth a go!

Repetitive, we know, but do raise containers onto feet or bricks to protect them from wet and cold and lag them with bubble wrap, hessian or fleece if not frost proof. In really cold weather even hardy plants may need protecting so hunt out any insulating

Remove debris regularly to prevent pests from taking up residence and brighten up dull pots and containers with winter pansies and winter flowering heathers.

If the weather allows, repair holes and tatty patches in your lawn. If it is waterlogged, as most will be after the November deluges, or even frozen, try and avoid walking on it - damage is easily inflicted!

### **Birds**

This month birds will really need our help - make sure clean water is available and that after a frost it does not remain frozen. Buy good quality bird food and fat or suet balls, ensure feeding stations are well out of the way of cats and enjoy the company of our feathered friends throughout the winter!



On the third Saturday in October, we successfully finished the complete perambulation of Warsop Parish, marking the 200th anniversary of the 1816 perambulation of the Manor of Warsop.

It was an enjoyable experience with excellent autumn weather and fine company. We covered a longer distance than our predecessors as we kept to modern rights-of-way which made a twenty mile walk rather than the sixteen mile length of the boundary. It has been suggested that we should repeat the walk next year although we may follow the example of the walkers from 1816 who split the walk into two sections.

Our new free leaflet (pictured above) describing five walks along the best sections of Warsop's parish boundary is now be available. You should be able to pick up a copy at the Town Hall or the library and we plan to attend Warsop's Christmas Fair on Friday 9th December for a final celebration of our 'Warsop 1816 to 2016' project.

Another aspect this project has been the preparation of packs of local history resources for each of Warsop's four primary schools. These packs cover changes to local buildings and landscape, occupations, schooling, housing, health, games and money. Resources include: games, clothing, photos, maps, worksheets and lots of information. All of these walks, leaflets and packs have been supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund and Big Warsop ROLO.

At this time of year, it is easy to spend most of our time indoors but a short walk in the fresh air can make us feel a lot better. Shorter walks can be just as rewarding as longer expeditions and we are lucky in Warsop to have lots of options for a local walk, particularly along the river and The Carrs and also on the restored colliery sites at Warsop Vale and Shirebrook Wood.

2016 has been an excellent year for grass, bracken and brambles which have enjoyed ideal conditions and have grown with unusual vigour. Another plant that has thrived is Himalayan balsam, a non-native invasive species that can cause damage to our riverbanks. This year we have removed around 18,000 plants from our parish and in some areas it has been greatly reduced, elsewhere it is just being kept in check.

National survey results appear to confirm my impression that 2016 has not been a good year for butterflies. Around Warsop there seem to have been fewer Small Tortoiseshells and Marbled Whites. Interestingly, in the national Big Butterfly Count the number of Small Tortoiseshells recorded fell by 47% compared with 2015 whereas there was a 58% increase for Marbled Whites. Gatekeepers, Commas and Small Coppers recorded their lowest numbers ever in this survey.

We are continuing our work sessions during the winter months with the focus shifting towards hedge, tree and bramble management. However, this may change if we experience heavy snowfall as we may then have to clear paths that have been blocked by collapsed vegetation! Get in touch if you fancy joining us for a couple of hours in the fresh air on a Thursday morning.

Our next group walk will be on Saturday 21st January. We will meet outside Warsop Library at 10am and then set off on a walk around the local countryside. Contact us if you would like to join us as arrangements may





# **Nottinghamshire** authorities lead the way on safer licensing practices

The Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group has worked collaboratively to improve safety for passengers, road users and professional drivers across the county.

At a Pre Inquest Review into the death of Mark Buckley, a motorcyclist who was hit and unlawfully killed by licensed taxi driver Kevin Wiesztort, the Coroner highlighted four specific points that were worthy of consideration and was keen that all Nottinghamshire councils should be involved and work together to try and prevent further deaths on our roads.

The areas to be looked at included:

- Complaints procedures
- Driver hours
- Fitness of drivers
- · Vehicle maintenance

The inquest concluded on Wednesday 26 October in Nottingham. In her findings, the Coroner was reassured that all of areas had been addressed through revised policies or contained within existing policies.

The Coroner commended the efforts of NALG and recognised that Nottinghamshire authorities are leading the way nationally on licensing policy since the tragic death of Mark Buckley.

John Miley, Licensing Manager at Broxtowe Borough Council and Chair of the Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group said: "I am very pleased that the Coroner has made note of the work of the Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group (NALG) to address these issues and her comments demonstrate the ethos and efficacy of the group.

"We are extremely proud of the work undertaken by NALG, in particular its collaborative working which demonstrates partnership working at its best because it achieves results.

"I am confident that through NALG, all Authorities in Nottinghamshire will continue to work together to promote public safety throughout the County"

Further changes to be considered by NALG include:

- Increased online information specifically relating to taxi licensing
- Guidance for dispatchers
- · To consider drug and alcohol testing for drivers
- To request that all licensed operators share information on driver motoring offences with the Licensing Authority, as soon as this is made known to them
- Guidance regarding the use of mobile phones for text messaging and calls
- Guidance on the use of hands free kits
- To collate information for consumers on the operators and drivers who have been licensed by NALG and who have adopted the guidance on best practice.

### In the early part of 2017 our focus will be on the landscape around Gleadthorpe, the area to the north-west of Thynghowe.

On Saturday January 28th, we will be walking through the landscape looking for signs of ancient trackways, boundaries and other features that have been suggested by cropmarks and LiDAR images. Check our Facebook page for more information if you would like to join us. In February, we plan to survey a section of an ancient trackway that may have survived in Budby Forest.

On 9th December and 27th January, we will be assisting the Forestry Commission with landscape management around Thynghowe. This could involve birch coppicing, hedgerow restoration, rhododendron control and cake consumption. Check Facebook.com/Thynghowe for more details if you would like to take part.

2017 is the 800th anniversary of the Forest Charter. Whilst the Magna Carta attracted a lot of attention in 2015, this charte possibly had a greater impact on the folk living in Sherwood.

This charter expanded on the five clauses in the original Magna Carta that dealt with issues relating to the lands designated as Crown Forests since the time of William the Conqueror.

Under the Charter of the Forests, any land seized to extend the royal Forests by Henry II, Richard and John was disafforested.

Penalties for breaking Forest Law would no longer include death or mutilation and any abuse of their powers by Forest officials would be investigated.

All freemen who owned land within a Crown Forest could develop it unless they destroyed any cover used by game.

As a result of the charter, the boundary of Sherwood Forest reverted to a line following the River Meden with Market Warsop inside the Forest and subject to Forest Law and Church Warsop outside the boundary.

Discussions are taking place over celebrations to mark this anniversary with walks along accessible parts of this boundary.



# Fishing on the Mill Dam and River

Contractual permit has been given to the Friends of the Carrs group to allow fishing to continue on the Mill Dam (EA.MDC)

Bailiffs have now been appointed to patrol the dam and river.

Ticket prices are: Adults £3 - 2 rods. Under 12s £1 - single rod only Season tickets available. Closed season is March 15th - June 16th.

### The rules for fishing are:

- Fishing licences to be shown
- The right to fish will be by day ticket and monies collected by bailiffs
- Fishing allowed from dawn till dusk on designated sites
- Fishing is to be rod pole and line only. No use of nets for capture of fish is permitted.
- Rod and line is not allowed to be left unattended in the water.
- No keep nets or sacks.
- · No fising from the bridge, weir and island
- The use of barb-less hooks is compulsary
- The use of lead weights is forbidden
- · No nut based food to be used as bait
- No catapults
- Unhooking mats, landing nets and disgorger are compulsory
- Removal of any fish is forbidden

The bailiffs have the power to refuse consent to fish if these rules are not adhered to.




