

Mansfield District Local Plan

The Parish Council of Warsop have been working on a Neighbourhood Plan which will be published over the coming months. Mansfield District Council have devised their own local plan which is now open to public consultation.



The Distirct council has produced a document called the Local Plan to guide future development in the district to the year 2033.

It will ensure new homes, jobs and services are located in the most sustainable locations, along with the necessary infrastructure and facilities. They have developed their Local Plan Consultation Draft which maps out Mansfield's future and are keen to seek

The Consultation Draft contains a vision and strategy that sets out how the council would like the district to look in 2033.

The development strategy includes the following:

- Distribution and allocation of residential development and employment land, with a focus on the urban areas of Mansfield and Market Warsop
- New retail development in Mansfield town centre
- Policies for making decisions on planning applications.

Warsop Parish is home to 11.5% of the district's population (according to the 2011 census) and within the parish lies the important market town of Market Warsop. This provides a range of retail and leisure facilities for the town and plays a particularly important role as a service centre for the nearby villages and smaller settlements. Market Warsop has seen significant change, particularly at the former Royal Estate where a large area of poor quality housing was demolished and rebuilt. This regeneration project has offered greater housing choice for existing and new residents.

The current picture of the district highlights the social, economic and environmental challenges facing Warsop Parish. These challenges are addressed through the vision for the parish.

A range of policies set out the broad context for sustainable development within Market Warsop district.

Proposals will be supported which direct new housing, employment and retail growth within Market Warsop urban area, particularly where they:

- a. assist the continued regeneration of the town
- b. help maintain/strengthen the district centre and support Market Warsop's role as a service centre for the surrounding villages
- c. support the reopening of the Dukeries railway line, in accordance with Policy ST1
- d. provide opportunities for people to walk, cycle and use public transport, including to nearby employment areas
- e. provide places where local businesses can start-up and grow. Limited development will be permitted within the villages in accordance with Policy S3, and within the countryside in accordance with Policy S9.

Proposed Warsop Parish Development Sites

465 new homes and around 3 hectares (ha) of industrial land proposed at Market Warsop and district.

Residential sites identified at:

- · 30-40 homes, Wood Lane (Miners Welfare), Church Warsop
- 30-40 homes, Sherwood Street/Oakfield Lane, Warsop
- 225-270 homes, Stonebridge Lane/Sookholme Lane, Warsop
- 180-220 homes, Sookholme Lane/Sookholme Drive, Warsop

Industrial land identified at:

- 0.7 ha, Mansfield Road (former railway station), Warsop
- Oakfield Lane (land adjacent recycling depot), Warsop

Small scale development of approximately 700 sqm of retail floorspace and 100 sqm of food and drink. Leisure floorspace will be focused on or close to the district centre.

Proposed central area sites at:

- 200 sgm, High Street (land adjacent Crates & Grapes PH), Warsop
- 300 sqm, Church Street (car park), Market Warsop
- 300 sqm, Burns Lane/Church Street, Market Warsop

GARDENING MONTHLY...

General tasks and garden maintenance



Continue to dig over existing beds and borders, again incorporating as much organic matter as you can. Forking over not only helps prepare the soil for spring, it helps reduce pests by exposing them to hungry birds.

Although temperatures should start to rise this month, there is still a risk of frost and even snow. Protect vulnerable plants, pots and taps from frost by wrapping insulation such as garden fleece around them and check pots and containers are raised off the ground if possible. Tender trees and shrubs will thank you for a generous application of dry mulch to protect their roots from freezing conditions.

Once the ground isn't frozen, make new beds and borders - mark the shape with sand trickled from a bottle, remove the top layer of growing vegetation and dig the ground over, incorporating as much organic matter as possible. If you are making a bed in the lawn, remove the turf and stack it upside down somewhere out of the way - after a year or two it will rot down into fantastic compost. Alternatively chop it up and bury upside down in the planting hole a good spade's depth down. Beware - if you just dig it in the buried grass will regrow and regrow and regrow and...

Remember not to let leaves accumulate around alpines - they will die if left damp for long. Cover bare patches around clumps with gritty compost to encourage regrowth.

When the weather allows, carry on clearing paths, check walls (but avoid concreting until there is no chance of frost), clean and insulate greenhouses and ensure heaters are working properly. Even a little insulation will make a huge difference to your heating bill.

Clean and repair your garden tools, book the lawn mower in for a service and check garden furniture for any rot. When it is warm enough, treat sheds, fences and trellis with wood preservative; brushes and rollers are fine for most things, however a sprayer is well worth buying for tricky projects such as woven panels!

Birds

It's another lean month for wildlife and especially birds. Putting out fresh water and food is really important, especially on cold days. You've heard it all before, but please do buy good quality bird food or fat/suet balls and check that water is not frozen.

Lawns

Keep off the lawn as much as possible whilst it is still wet - damage to waterlogged lawns is easily inflicted. If, towards the end of the month, the weather turns dry and mild, the lawn is firm and the grass is starting to look a little shaggy, give it a very gentle mow with the blades on the highest setting - don't be tempted if conditions are wet! Also, if you are planning a new lawn, now is probably the earliest you could start preparing the ground for seeding or laying turf. Ask for advice in your local garden centre if you are unsure as to how to begin!

Bulbs, flowers and containers

Buy and plant container-grown snowdrops - add some compost to the soil plus a sprinkling of bonemeal and plant them slightly deeper than they were in the pot.

Pot up lily bulbs to flower in early summer in barely moist compost and keep somewhere light and frost free. Only increase watering if the compost dries out or you see shoots appear above the surface; lily bulbs rot easily in overly wet conditions. Bring dahlias out of hibernation and pot them in compost singly or dormitory style in a tray! Keep them somewhere light and frost free.

Sow sweet peas under a cloche or in the greenhouse for a cheery reminder that spring is on the way.

Brighten up a dull month with pansies, violas, primroses and heathers - pansies densely packed make for a truly striking display. Once the ground is less sodden plant pots of flowering spring bulbs and primroses in empty gaps - a bit of a cheat, but who cares!

If the weather really does turn dry, do remember pots and containers will need watering, especially if they are near a wall and in a sheltered position. Take care not to overwater.

Hellebores - or Lenten roses - in their many lovely colours will be opening from now on well into the spring. Trim off their old leaves, both to display the flowers better and to prevent the spread of disease. Fresh new leaves will emerge in the spring.

Hostas - although there is no sign of these above ground yet it is not too early by the middle of the month to water liquid slug killer around them to deal with the pests which are down there waiting for spring. Do this again after a fortnight and again a fortnight later, and your hostas will have their best ever chance of not being devoured by their worst enemies by midsummer.



Footpath & **Countryside Group**



The floods experienced in the north of the country over the new year period are a reminder of the importance of the management of the land alongside our waterways. Although the level of the River Meden had risen, the flood meadows upstream of the remodeled weir at Stonebridge were absorbing a lot of the excess water therefore preventing problems further downstream.

The colour of the river was a reminder of the origins of the water entering the river. The main source of the sediment in the river is agricultural land although the run-offs from the built up areas of Skegby and Pleasley and from the roads that drain into the river also make significant contributions. Most farmers value their soil as their most valuable asset and take measures to prevent it from disappearing downstream whenever there is heavy rainfall. Good agricultural practice includes grass buffer strips of at least four metres width alongside waterways, excluding livestock from riverbanks, winter cover crops to avoid exposing soil, managing maize crops to reduce harm to the land, ploughing across slopes to reduce water run-off, maintaining hedges to help retain water and preventing farm tracks from becoming channels for rainfall. These types of soil and water management measures can qualify for payments to farmers under the revised Countryside Stewardship scheme.

Unless the countryside is covered by a blanket of snow, we could be seeing the first of the spring flowers this month. Celandines, Germander Speedwell, Red Dead-nettle and Dog's Mercury were all seen in Warsop last February as well as the frequently overlooked Chickweed, Daisies and Dandelions.

If conditions allow, the Footpaths Group should be completing our winter hedgerow management work alongside footpaths in the next few weeks and also performing some tasks on local wildlife sites. Without this hedge work, the paths would gradually become narrower once the summer growth starts and horse riders would be complaining about overhanging branches on bridleways! Contact us if you would like to join us for a couple of hours on a Thursday morning. As I frequently mention, without new volunteers some aspects of our work may not be continuing for much

Our next group walk should be on Saturday 20th February with the destination depending on the depth of the mud along the alternative routes! We usually meet at 10am outside Warsop Library but the date and time may change so get in touch if to confirm details if you would like to join us.



It was reported that the hand dryer in the gent's toilets was defective, this has been taken out of service and will be replaced.

The next meeting of Welbeck Colliery the Future is scheduled for 10 December 2015 however, the Chairman had visited the site and reported the following:- the restoration of the pit tip was proceeding according to schedule, an area facing Cuckney has been grassed and tree planting planned for the new year. Work on the Bio-gas Plant has started and site cleared to allow the foundations for the digester vessels to be started. The intention is to have the Plant up and running in test mode for March/April 2016. If all statutory and safety requirements have been met then the Plant will commence full production in the summer after the site has been stocked up with locally grown feed stock to digest. Staff recruitment will start in the new year with emphasis on employing local people wherever possible. The Planning application for the remainder of the site has been submitted to Bassetlaw District Council. To date there have been no objections and a decision is expected after the January Planning meeting. A site visit to the Bio-gas Plant and the restoration work is to be arranged for end of January/ beginning of February

The Treasurer reported that the Accounts were satisfactory and that income was just ahead of expenditure.

Next meeting will be on Tuesday 19 January 2016 at 7.30pm. All welcome.

The Friends of Thynghowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

2016 will be an important year for The Friends of Thynghowe with a focus on the events of a thousand years ago when the Dane Canute became the king of England. Our Spring Thing re-enactment at Sherwood Pines over the weekend of 14th and 15th May will celebrate this anniversary and our Vikings of Sherwood project will investigate the origins of the Viking Age assembly of Thynghowe.

Canute was in England with the army of his father Swein Forkbeard. Based at Gainsborough on the River Trent, Swein was acknowledged as king by most of the English leaders in place of the unpopular Æthelred the Unready. When Swein died six weeks later, the Danish army pledged allegiance to Canute but the leading Englishmen approached Æthelred to return from exile and Canute withdrew to Denmark.

Two years later he returned, invading Wessex in the south of England where he was confronted by Æthelred's son Edmund Ironside who had rebelled against his father. By 1016 Æthelred, Canute and Edmund were each established in different parts of England but on 23rd April King Æthelred died in London and Edmund was chosen as his successor. After several inconclusive confrontations the country was divided with Edmund ruling Wessex and Canute controlling lands to the north of the Thames. However, Edmund died on 30th November 1016 and Wessex accepted Canute as king making him ruler of all England.

These events will be marked at May's Spring Thing and the Danish influence on life in Sherwood will be investigated as part of our Vikings of Sherwood project. During February, we will be leading a walk around the landscape of Thynghowe on Saturday 13th and the first of the workshops preparing volunteers for April's excavation will be held at Sherwood Pines on Saturday 27th

Mansfield District takes a stand against Hate Crime

On Friday 18 December 2015, Deputy Mayor Cllr Mick Barton of Mansfield District Council signed a "No to hate!" pledge at the National Holocaust Centre, Laxton.

The aims of the pledge are to show commitment to tackling hate crime and to raise awareness of it in our communities. This comes after the council re-endorsed and updated its policy on reporting hate crime earlier this year in a delegated decision by the Deputy Mayor, who is Portfolio Holder for Public Protection.

A hate crime is an incident that can be perceived as being racist, homophobic or transphobic, or due to a person's religion, beliefs, gender identity, sexual orientation or disability.

The "No to hate!" pledge encourages organisations to do their best to tackle prejudice, reach out to support those who are targets of hate, and to better educate the community about the serious nature of these crimes.

Hate crimes can include threatening behaviour, assault, robbery, damage to property, harassment and enticing others to commit hate crime. Cyber bullying (using Facebook and Twitter etc) to share abusive comments and threats is also considered a hate incident. Hate incidents could ultimately lead to arrest by the police and possibly a prison sentence.

"In Mansfield we recognise that everybody has a role to play in tackling hate and discrimination to promote a safer community.

"We are working hard to help people recognise exactly what a hate crime is.

"At this time when we are welcoming those affected by war to our town, we hope the community can come together to show respect and understanding."

People can report hate incidents to the police and more information on how to do this can be found on the Nottinghamshire Police website.

You can also report to the council either on the council website or by filling in a form in person or by calling 01623 463463.

Warsop woman convicted over fly tipping

A Warsop woman pleaded guilty to an offence connected to a fly-tipping incident after she used a scrap man to dispose of rubbish for her.

Joanne Dunkley, 43, of Sherwood Street, Warsop, admitted one charge of failing in her Duty of Care contrary to contrary to s34(2A) and (6) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

At Mansfield Magistrates' Court on Tuesday 15 December, she was sentenced to a two-year conditional discharge and ordered to pay a £15 victim surcharge and £285 legal costs and £145 Community Safety costs.

Her charge relates to waste found in Oakfield Lane on 7 February 2015 and on the service road between B6035 Forest road and A6075 Peafield Lane, in Mansfield on 12 February 2015.

The court heard she had disposed of household waste through a scrap man collecting on the street and failed in her household duty of care by not checking for a waste carrier's

Cllr Mick Barton, Portfolio Holder for Public Protection at Mansfield District Council, said after the case:

"People who use a scrap man on the street to get rid of their waste can be doing so at their own peril if that waste is later fly-tipped.

"People must ensure they use only licensed waste carriers to dispose of waste. Protect yourself from this kind of prosecution by always getting a receipt and verified contact details of the person removing their waste.

"At the end of the day, the cost of clearing up fly-tipped waste falls on council tax payers so we will always seek to take legal action where possible."

The Rotary International Polio Eradication Program

The Rotary Club continues to work towards its goal of eradicating polio. Until 1957, when the Salk vaccine was introduced, polio was considered one of the most frightening public health problems in the world.



Jonas Edward Salk (1914 – 1995) was an American medical researcher and virologist. He discovered and developed the first successful polio vaccine.

The Salk vaccine is still used today to combat Polio, never being bettered or improved over the 60 years since its introduction.

Because of the devastating, uncontrollable spread of the disease, starting in 1985, Rotary International embarked on a worldwide programme to eradicate this awful disease. RI organised volunteers to administer the Salk vaccine in every country in the world. A most difficult venture in countries with challenging cultural and religious objections, and countries ravished by war.

Polio is now confined to only two countries in the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan, which have proved to be immensely challenging for obvious reasons, but Rotary International is determined to continue until it is eradicated.

The Purple Crocus symbolises our efforts and is used worldwide to promote awareness and the importance of the fight against Polio.

The Rotary Club of Warsop, Shirebrook & District recently provided 5,000 Purple crocus bulbs to Netherfield Infants, Eastlands Junior and Sherwood Street Junior schools, as well as Warsop Scout group, to plant as part of the Rotary International Polio Eradication program.




