## Your Vote Matters, So Don't Lose It!

## Canvassers from Mansfield District Council are now visiting properties throughout October and November to remind residents to fill in an electoral enquiry form.

In August, all households in the district were issued with a form asking residents to check if the information that appears on the electoral register for those living at their address is correct. This is done on an annual basis to keep the electoral register up to date.

Canvassers from the council, who will all carry an ID card, will be visiting all those households who have not yet returned that form and will be able to help householders to complete it.

The aim of the form is to update the electoral register and identify any residents who are not registered so they can be encouraged to do so.

It is particularly important that anyone who has moved address recently looks out for the form and checks that they are listed on the register. This will ensure that when elections take place, they will easily be able to take part.

Bev Smith, Chief Executive Officer and Electoral Registration Officer at Mansfield District Council, said: "Anyone who wants to vote must be registered. To make sure you are able to have your say at future elections, simply check the form and respond as quickly as possible. The form tells you how you can do this.

"If you're not currently registered, we'll send you information explaining how to do this or you can just go online to apply to register at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote."



### **GARDENING MONTHLY...**



#### **General Tasks and Garden Maintenance**

#### **Tidy borders**

Cut down herbaceous stems and clear the tatty remains of annuals, but do leave a little cover of the perennials that fade relatively elegantly (sedum, astilbes and grasses for example).

They will provide winter interest as well as some much needed wildlife shelter-ladybirds especially appreciate winter quarters and will repay your hospitality by disposing of aphids in industrial quantities next year. Leaving sodden debris and fallen leaves around plants will only encourage pests and disease.

#### Clean out the greenhouse

Clear out the greenhouse, wash pots and trays, clean, mend and oil your tools and throw away anything that is beyond hope or reasonable repair! Cleaning your greenhouse thoroughly will prevent pests from hibernating and leaping into action next spring. Wash the windows inside and out to allow maximum light in over the winter and scrub benches, fixtures and glazing bars with disinfectant, making sure you hose the whole place down really well, especially dark and dusty corners.

For really effective pest elimination, fumigation is the ticket. Move all plants outside, shut the windows, light a sulphur candle in the middle of the floor, (retreat at speed!), shut the door and wait until the smoke and fumes have completely dispersed several hours later. Your greenhouse should now be delightfully pest free!

#### Drain and lag.

Save yourself untold irritation and expense by draining and lagging standpipes, outdoor taps, irrigation lines and water pumps in advance of sudden hard frosts.

### Prepare your soil for next year

For beds that lie bare in winter, carry on with the winter digging until the soil is too hard - use compost, manure, leaf mould - in fact as much organic matter as you can lay your hands on to replace the goodness in it. It can be left in a pretty rough state over the winter when the elements will break the clods down, making spring planting infinitely easier!

For text book soil improvement, you should add a layer of organic matter and dig it in by turning over spadefuls so it is buried below the surface. If this seems too much like hard work, just mulch the bed and leave the rest to the worms! If your soil is thin or heavy clay, just fork it over now; too much digging on the former will bring up infertile matter from below whilst great chunks of wet clay will remain rock solid over the winter and become nigh on impossible to break up next year.

#### **Planting**

Plant bare-rooted trees, shrubs, hedging and roses as well as fruit trees and bushes (see later). Soak the roots in a bucket of water for an hour first and protect against frost and wind if exposed.

#### Rake fallen leaves

Fallen leaves prevent light and air getting to plants and lawns and these dark, damp conditions are also heaven on earth for slugs, snails and an unwholesome array of fungal diseases. However, don't waste these tumbled treasures - given time they will decompose into fabulously rich leaf mould - aka 'nature's soil conditioner of choice'! Rake them up and throw into a simple frame made of chicken wire or wood. Failing that, black bin liners spiked with air holes will do if you can bear the sight, but remember to dampen the leaves first should they be dry (some hope!). Leaf mould takes about a year to mature (2 in the case of oak leaves), makes a great top dressing for woodland plants such as rhododendrons and is an excellent and FREE homegrown substitute for peat. Don't be tempted to use rose leaves, which can easily carry infection, or evergreens, which take too long to rot down.

#### Lawns

Rule one - keep off the lawn when it is sodden or frozen - a startling degree of damage is remarkably easily inflicted.

Rake up fallen leaves regularly - left in place they will encourage fungal disease and bare patches and make your final cut when the grass is reasonably dry with the blades set high.

Scarify and spike to improve surface drainage and aeration and apply autumn feed and moss killer if you didn't do it last month.

New turf can be laid, weather permitting, and if you are planning to sow or lay a new lawn next spring, there is still time to prepare the ground so it is in tip top condition. Book your mower in for servicing - leaving it until spring just places your machine firmly at the back of a long queue!

#### Birds

Winter is tough for birds - as temperatures fall, regular supplies of food and fresh water become ever more important to help them survive the cold months and emerge in good condition for the breeding season next year.

Do make sure clean water is available, especially in freezing conditions. Buy good quality bird food and fat or suet balls, ensure feeding stations are well out of the way of cats and enjoy the company of our feathered friends throughout the winter!

### Footpath & **Countryside Group**

At this time of year, hedgehogs are finding a warm, dry corner where they can spend the winter. A bonfire may seem an ideal spot. So, if you are planning a fire, please move the material to a new site just before burning it.



Other steps you can take to help hedgehogs include ensuring that there is a five inch square gap in boundary fences and walls to allow access, checking compost heaps before digging a fork in, reducing the amount of garden pesticides and poisons used. covering drains or deep holes and ensuring that there is an easy route out of ponds.

If you only feed birds during the coldest part of the year' it is a good time to start putting the food out so that they know where to go when the weather turns nasty. Don't forget to keep the bird bath topped up, particularly once it starts freezing.



November is the month when you may expect to see the changing colours of our woodlands but you can also view several wildflowers still flowering until the colder weather arrives. Last year if you walked around Warsop at this time of year you could have spotted the blooms of Scabious, Knapweed, Common Mallow, White Dead-nettle, Gorse, Buttercup, Red Campion, White Campion, Red, Dead-nettle, Dandelion, White Clover, Red Clover, Chickweed, Ragwort, Marsh Ragwort, Hawkweed, Groundsel, Ox-Eye Daisy and Yarrow. Take a walk and see how many you can find.

Our 'Warsop 1816 to 2016' project is nearing completion but if you missed out on our series of walks around Warsop's parish boundary you can follow in our footsteps with the help of our new leaflet that should be available soon.

Now that all of our footpaths have received their final trim of the year, the Footpaths Group's work focusses on the management on local wildlife sites. Then we will move onto hedge management once birds have consumed the hedgerow fruits that form a vital part of their diet during the colder months. If you can spare three hours on a Thursday morning come and join us, we have tasks to suit all levels of fitness and energy!

Our next group walk will be on Saturday 19th November. We will meet outside Warsop Library at 10am and then set off on a walk around the local countryside. Contact us if you would like to join us as arrangéments may changé.

With a keen eye for finance, Peter took a lead role within Scrutiny committee, and, Audit and Licensing, ensuring that both Parish and District Council budgets were robust and deliverable. Despite these additional financial pressures, Peter's skills and financial management has helped the Parish Council deliver a Nil Precept increase in recent years.

Peter loved serving the community of Warsop and as Carrs Ward Councillor he has overseen major redevelopments in Warsop Vale, Spion Kop and the Royal Estate in Warsop. The Carrs itself 'Warsop's jewel in the crown' was Peter's other great passion and he was instrumental in our park achieving Green Flag status during the summer - a goal he had treasured and thankfully achieved.

Peter has long been involved in the campaign to first save Meden Baths from closure and now to build a new pool to replace our ageing facilities. Peter began a petition in the summer that we will be finalising soon. I urge you all to sign it if you can, to send MDC a resounding message in Peter's memory.

Peter was a proud family man leaving his wife Irene, daughter Shona, son Paul (Crafty) and his grandchildren who he loved and adored. He also loved his football especially Manchester City F.C.

### Mansfield wins best city category in East Midlands in Bloom awards

### Mansfield has topped the best city category for the third time in the East Midlands in Bloom awards.

# Warsop 1816news

### **Help for the Poor**

Under the Poor Law each parish was responsible for the folk who could not provide for themselves. Help was also available from legacies and donations from more wealthy members of the community.

The entry for Warsop in White's Directory from 1832 described a legacy from a benefactor enabling forty shilling loaves to be sent to the church every Sunday for distribution to poor parishioners. Other legacies provided money to be given to the poor twice a year, cash gifts to some poor single women and gifts of bread to the poor on St Thomas' Day, August 18th and Good Friday.

Meetings were held in Mansfield in 1816 to discuss "Means of relieving the Poor during the Winter". Newspaper reports described how "great numbers are now relieved by a contract entered into with the butchers and dealers in coal, who supply them with meat and coal at a very reduced price". Donations to the Mansfield Penny Society was able to "relieve 102 people: 32 poor women each received a bed-gown, flannel petticoat, chemise and pair of stockings; 32 poor men a hat, shirt & pair of stockings each; 20 other poor persons, a blanket each".

When we think of archaeology an image of uncovering fragments of pot or metalwork often comes to mind. It is easy to overlook the evidence that the natural environment can contribute to revealing the past.

As The Friends of Thynghowe are investigating woodland sites, we are becoming increasingly aware of how the trees and other vegetation can provide clues to the history of the woodlands. Calculating the age of a tree growing on a bank by measuring its girth can suggest the latest date that the bank was created This technique has helped us date a sawpit in Birklands. Moss growing on compacted earth can indicate the line of an ancient trackway. Some trees mark boundaries, others are reminders of the dukes' planting experiments. Ornamental planting indicates the former site of the Russian Log Cabin and the layout of current forestry compartments is a reminder of 4th Duke of Portland's planting plans.

The ancient trackway running along the Warsop - Budby boundary was once lined with a hawthorn hedge. Now all that remain are a few overgrown plants which are very vulnerable to high winds. We are working with the Forestry Commission is protect and enhance this historical feature. The foresters will attempt to extend the life of some of the hawthorns by laying them and we will help restore the hedgeline by planting new hawthorns along the boundary. This will be one of the tasks on our regular work sessions when we help manage the vegetation around Thynghowe. The next Friday sessions are on 11th November, 9th December and 27th January. Get in touch if you would like to come and help. There could be cake!

Another way that the natural environment comes to aid of archaeologists is with the testing of samples following an excavation. Samples from the trenches that we excavated on Thynghowe earlier this year are being subjected to pollen analysis which may provide dating evidence for the mysterious ditches on the hill. We may have some news of the results at our Autumn Workshop at Śherwood Pines on 12th November. This event runs from 10am to 2pm in the classroom and will provide feedback on the excavation, presentations on our local heritage and briefing on this winter's activities in the forest. Apprentices are employed by Futures, but will work from MDC sites. Each apprenticeship offers a 52 week fixed term training programme, which includes on the job training, the opportunity for additional training on day release and a National Vocational Oualification.

MDC painter and decorator, Hayley Waterhouse was offered a permanent contract following her completion of a three year apprenticeship scheme with the council, which resulted in her achieving an NVQ award in painting and decorating.

Hayley said: "My apprenticeship covered a lot of skills and gave me valuable practical experience. As well as learning how to paint and decorate, I learnt how to do joinery, plastering and tiling. I was given a lot of support and I trained with some really good people. I would certainly recommend going for an apprenticeship with the council"

Since 2012, the council has taken on 43 apprentices, of whom 17 have been employed by MDC following completion of their training and 26 have been employed by other local businesses. There are currently 11 apprenticeships operating within the council.

Portfolio Holder for Regeneration at Mansfield District Council, Cllr Dave Saunders said: "The additional funding will enable us to continue to support and attract talented young people into the workforce, helping us to address our business needs and workforce planning for the future. Many young people in the district seek to gain employment with the council, so these apprenticeships will create more pathways for young people to become future council employees."

Louise Hawkings, Employment Adviser at Futures Training, said: "We're delighted to be working with Mansfield District Council to support them with their recruitment of apprenticeships. The opportunities available could provide a solid foundation from which to build a career. Increasing numbers of young people are considering vocational training as a route into full employment, as a key benefit is that they acquire much-needed work experience which employers look for, even in people starting out in their careers."



# Unsafe drivers caught in Warsop Week of Action

### Ten motorists were pulled up for using their mobiles phones while driving or not wearing a seatbelt during the Warsop Week of Action last week.

In addition 12 untaxed vehicles were clamped or seized, two vehicle prohibition notices were served for roadworthy vehicles, and one vehicle was pulled up for being uninsured.

The vehicle checks were carried out by officers from the DVLA and Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency in partnership with Nottinghamshire Police.

Mansfield District Council, which organised the Week of Action from 26 to 30 September, also served legal notices under environmental legislation on 31 private properties for issues relating to waste accumulations on gardens and in outbuildings. Housing officers served notices on seven of the council's tenants for similar issues.

The week of action included a litter pick in Oakfield Lane and footpath maintenance work in Meden Vale by the Heritage Association Partnership, and managed to sign up eight people as being interested in conducting community speed checks.

The council's mascot "Scoop" was also out and about promoting responsible dog ownership and handing out information about the new Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in Warsop centre, Carr Lane Park, The Carrs Local Nature Reserve and Wood Lane Park in Church Warsop.

Mansfield District Council Portfolio Holder for Public Protection Cllr Mick Barton, said:

"These Weeks of Action, which we have held in other parts of the district, too, have proved an effective way to bring people together and make a difference to their neighbourhood.

"Catching more than 20 unsafe drivers and vehicles in just one day, and issuing 38 environmental improvement notices to improve the area, shows just how effective campaigns like this can be when various agencies come together and work to improve a neighbourhood."

### Swimmers to get Freedom of Mansfield

Paralympic swimming stars Ollie Hynd MBE and Charlotte Henshaw are set to receive the Freedom of Mansfield after their successes in Rio.

An Extraordinary Meeting of Mansfield District Council will consider the award proposal on 26 October and if agreed, the swimmers and their coach, Glenn Smith, will receive the honour at a pageant ceremony at the Civic Centre on 10 November.

Freedom of the district is the highest honour the town can give to its citizens and has been awarded on only four occasions since 1974.

For the Hynd family it is becoming something of a tradition after Ollie's brother and fellow Paralympic swimming hero, Sam, received the honour along with Mansfield's Olympic champion swimmer Rebecca Adlington in 2008.

Other recipients in the past have been the Cantamus Girls Choir, who gained a gold medal at the 2006 Choir Olympics in China and side-car world champions Tom and Ben Birchall.

Ollie and Charlotte, who have been coached by Mansfield District Council coach and Swimming Development Officer Glenn Smith for more than a decade, brought home four medals from the Paralympic Games in Rio in September.

Elected Mayor of Mansfield Kate Allsop said: "Ollie and Charlotte have worked so hard for their achievements - training in Mansfield pools.

"They are such inspirational role models for young people as well as great ambassadors for the district, who have helped put the town on the map, so it is only fitting that we, as a district, should show our gratitude in this way.

"Their success is also a huge achievement for their coach, Glenn, who has been inspiring swimmers to achieve great heights for more than two decades."

As well as the official Freedom ceremony, Ollie and Charlotte's latest honour is expected to be marked on the stage at the Big Switch On for the Christmas lights in Mansfield on 20 November. The Freedom of the District is an honour that has been awarded for the past century and among its more historic features is that those granted it are allowed to herd sheep through the town.

Prior to 1974, under the old borough of Mansfield authority, it was awarded on only 19 occasions between 1914 and 1973.

Ollie said: "It will mean so much to me as a local lad to receive this honour - and also because my brother was awarded it, too. I hope it inspires other athletes that there are no limits over what you can achieve - whether disabled or not."

Charlotte added: "I am thrilled to received the Freedom of Mansfield and very humbled, too. It has been an honour to represent Mansfield as well as our country at the Paralympics and other swimming events around the world.

"And I am glad that Glenn is joining us in receiving this Freedom because we could not have achieved as much without him. He has been a brilliant support to both of us."

Glenn Smith said: "What a year! This has been an amazing time for Ollie and Charlotte and I am so proud of them and their achievements.

"I am completely stunned to be given the Freedom of Mansfield, as well as immensely proud."

### How Mansfield Became a Swimming 'Medal Factory'

The people of Mansfield turned out in force on Saturday 24th September to celebrate the success of local Paralympic swimmers Ollie Hynd MBE and Charlotte Henshaw in a sunsoaked Rio themed day of entertainment in the town.



Ollie and Charlotte, who are coached in Mansfield, signed autographs and posed for photos amid a carnival atmosphere in the Market Place that saw samba drummers, jiu jitzu, and capoeira demonstrations plus a Covent Garden street entertainer unicyclist, Joe D'Amour. There was also a Brazilian dance workshop and short tennis sessions. Young visitors made their own medals at a craft activity provided by Mansfield Museum.

The Paralympian heroes were welcomed on stage by Mansfield District Council Chairman Cllr Steven Harvey, who presented them with a bouquet and personalised cupcakes.

Also there to support their achievements was Portfolio Holder for the Environment Cllr Andrew Tristram, who said: "It was a fantastic atmosphere and good to see so many celebrating the success of these two great athletes, who are the pride of Mansfield."

By their side was also Glenn Smith, their swimming coach and the council's Swim Coach and Development Officer.

On Saturday, as Ollie and Charlotte enjoyed in Mansfield a celebration of their achievements, Glenn, later the same day, received his own mark of recognition in Leeds at the British Swimming Coaches Awards where he won the Para-Swimming Coach of the Year Award - for the second year in a row.

He said: "This is a huge honour for me and caps off an unbelievable summer at the Paralympics with Ollie and Charlotte bringing home four medals back to Mansfield.

"It is also testament to the support that swimming in this town gets from Mansfield District Council, Nova Centurion Swimming Club and Nottinghamshire Amateur Swimming Association."

Ollie returned from Rio with a gold medal from the 400m freestyle S8 and a silver from the 100m backstroke S8. Charlotte achieved a bronze medal in the SB6 100m breaststroke.

The Rio Day event was not the first time Mansfield has thrown a party to mark the success of its local swimmers because the town has become something of a swimming "medal factory", thanks to an initiative that nurtures potential local swimming talent.

Mansfield District Council Swim Squad will be marking its 25th anniversary next year. Also for the past 12 years, its Learn to Swim and Talent Development Programme has been identifying and bringing on some of Britain's most successful swimmers, including double gold medal winner at the 2008 Beijing Olympics Rebecca Adlington OBE.

The council, in conjunction now with Mansfield Leisure Trust, teaches thousands of swimmers each year and develops them through the Learn To Swim Programme.

Swimmers showing particular promise are identified and brought on through its Base Club system in local areas. These clubs then talent identify those swimmers good enough for a trial with the Nova Centurion Swimming Club Squad. And the system clearly works.

Rebecca Adlington, (pictured right) who also picked up two bronze medals at the London 2012 Games, joined the Mansfield/Nova Development Squad in 1998, and swam with it in Mansfield until she was 13 years old. She then trained with Bill Furniss in Nottingham.

The Nova squad also has had a long history of integrating talented

Para/Disability Swimmers into the team. Its first success was Callum Lawson, a British record holder who also competed at the Athens Paralympics in 2004 and took a silver medal at the World Championships in South Africa in 2006.

Next the squad identified Sam Hynd at the age of 11 as having potential. He went on to win a number medals at European and World Level and in 2008, won gold and bronze medals at the Paralympic Games in Bejing. He also broke the world record for the S8 400m Freestyle.

Charlotte Henshaw has been swimming with the Squad for more than 16 years and was first spotted when she was 12.

As well as this year's Paralympic success, she has won medals at World and European Level, and was crowned a European Champion in 2009, and again 2016. Her first Paralympics was in 2008. She competed again in 2012, where she took a silver medal.

Ollie Hynd, like his brother, started with the squad as an 11-yearold, and was again identified through Nova's Talent Development Programme.

His breakthrough was in 2011 when he won medals at the European Championships. The following year he won a gold, silver and bronze medal at the London Paralympics and later that year, was awarded an MBE by the Queen for services to Disability Sport.

He has since won a "Grand Slam" of World, European Commonwealth titles and holds the current world record for the S8 400m Freestyle and SM8 200m Individual Medley.

At Rio he took two golds and a silver, making him the most decorated male GB Swimmer at the games.

Nova also has a number of junior internationals coming through their system who could be the swimming stars of the future, including Daniel Mills, who competed at the European Junior Championships, and Karl Morgan, who swam as a European Youth International.

More recently Lily Bosely became the National Age Group Record Holder for the Girls 14yrs 100m Backstroke, and took two golds at the British Summer Championships in 2015. She was voted Nova Swimmer of the year in 2015.




