The annual Warsop Carnival is traditionally held on the first Sunday in July. #### **GARDENING MONTHLY...**



#### **General Tasks and garden maintenance**

The most important thing this month is to enjoy your garden; heady scents, glorious colours, an abundance of fruits and vegetables and hopefully more sunshine. What could be more enjoyable and satisfying than surveying the results of your hard work throughout the year?

#### **Watering**

Remember to water and feed your plants regularly, especially those in hanging baskets, pots or containers as well as climbers and roses growing against a sunny wall. Many a plant will not recover from a drought, so water regularly and do not resort to

Water hydrangeas with hydrangea colourant for true blue hydrangeas next year.

If possible, set up an automatic watering system for your vegetable plot, borders and even containers. They are worth their weight in gold and can work on a sensor system that detects how dry the soil is. Once you have one you will wonder why you did not install one years ago. Going on holiday will no longer involve wondering if your precious plants will survive a dry spell or paying someone else to hold a hose!

If it stays warm and dry, water saving strategies include using bathwater and washing up water, provided they are neither too dirty or oily. Keep your pond topped up, free of pond weed and clean - green algae can be toxic to pets.

#### Weeding

Boring but vital. Keep on top of weeds in borders, the vegetable garden and all your pots and containers. Little and often will reduce what will become a Herculean task if left to spiral out of control.

Weeds not only look messy but use valuable moisture in the ground. The best and easiest way to weed is to use a Dutch hoe which will cut the weeds just below the surface. Weeding on a sunny day will ensure weeds left on the surface dry out and die

#### **Birds**

Birds need fresh water for bathing and drinking, especially during hot and dry spells, so keep supplies plentiful and regularly changed. Throw out mouldy food on bird tables and remember that birds cannot digest milk - it can kill them.

#### Lawns

Mow regularly but do not bother to feed or water; it is a waste of time and will promote vigorous growth that may not stand up to the rigours of winter. Come autumn, feed with a high phosphate content fertiliser to promote root growth and strengthen the grass for winter.

If it has grown out of control whilst you have been away cut it first with the mower blades on the highest setting and then on progressively lower settings until back to the usual level – this will train the grass to grow leafily again. If you are planning a new lawn, start preparing the area by digging and clearing weeds.

#### **Bulbs, flowers and containers**

Plant autumn flowering bulbs and start to plant spring flowering bulbs, especially tulips, daffodils, alliums, iris and crocus. Always use the side bulbs of tulips and daffodils as they make perfectly good bulbs in their own right. Plant specially prepared hyacinth bulbs for Christmas.

Put poinsettias in the dark for 14 hours a day and full light for the remaining 10 hours to encourage the formation of those cheery festive red bracts.

# Frack Free Warsop

A big thank you to the hardworking **Carnival Committee who delivered** a wonderful, fun-filled day for the people of our area. It was also a great opportunity to raise awareness of the threat to our beautiful countryside from the unconventional gas industry: so many people signed our petitions that we ran out of forms!

#### **Seismic Surveys**

Many locals will have received flyers from Ineos Shale telling us about the seismic surveys they are about to carry out. What the leaflet does not tell us are the risks that are associated with our countryside becoming an unconventional gas field. The seismic surveys are taking place all around us. Blue and red flags are appearing in fields; these will be followed by cables and monitoring equipment, then the Vibroseis trucks will arrive. Once the survey starts, there will be loud noise and vibrations as the trucks thump the earth beneath them or explosive charges are detonated underground. Buildings can shake, not to mention the disturbance to our fields and wildlife. The information gathered will help Ineos plan where to start sinking the wells, up to ten drill pads in each licence area, possibly more once in full production.

#### Risks to our area


There are many possible risks which our community may face including reduced house values and increased house insurance premiums; disruption and pollution of wildlife habitats; air pollution and water contamination which lead, most importantly, to significant risks to public health for which there is a growing body of evidence and is the reason this industry has been banned in several countries.

#### **Water contamination**

Statistics show around 6% failure rates on this type of well which allows pollutants like methane, gas and fracking fluid to migrate into surrounding rock or groundwater. This figure rises the longer the well exists. Once drilled, the wells remain in the ground indefinitely and, even when plugged, may continue to leak for up to thirty years after they have been abandoned. Over time, all wells could eventually fail. Surface spills can also lead to pollutants escaping into surrounding fields, risking crop contamination and harm to animals. Each well drilled will go through the aquifer that supplies drinking water to 8 million people. Add in the heavily faulted geology, old mine workings and the increased risk of earthquake in our area and that figure may be optimistic. Well failure could lead to permanent contamination of our water supply.





























Fracking companies DO NOT have any right to access your land/property without prior agreement. Rather than obtaining permission for access from smaller landowners and residents their contractors may turn up unannounced. If you are surprised by workers on your property you should refuse access and document their activity, times, dates, location, details of any damage and take pictures. If your area is licensed for fracking, consider forming a group to network with neighbours and share information about potentia.

#### Water shortages

Each well uses millions of gallons of water mixed with chemicals and sand which is pumped under high pressure into the shale layer to break it up and release the gas. The water which flows back to the surface can contain new materials from the fracked shale including naturally occurring radioactive materials, arsenic, chromium, cadmium, lead and various waste gases which cannot be allowed back into the water system as it is toxic. Taking such huge amounts of water out of the locality could lead to water shortages affecting local farms, businesses and residents and could cause the die back of our ancient woodlands.

Emissions can occur across the whole process including methane, benzene, formaldehyde and toluene as well as radon and oxides of nitrogen. In addition to this, our air quality will be affected by emissions from diesel engines, compressors and heavy transport vehicles which service each site. HGV vehicles

may be a particular health hazard when large numbers of truck journeys are required to tanker away the toxic flow back water to special facilities. The impact of methane on global warming is many times higher than CO2.

#### If we do nothing...

...this industry could take over our countryside bringing risks to our environment for many years to come.

#### **Actions you can take are:**

- · Contact your MP Ben Bradley and voice your concerns.
- Notts County Council Policy Committee is to make a decision on whether or not to allow Seismic Surveying to take place on their land. Write to the committee members to let them know how you
- · Object to Planning Applications as they come up.
- Find out more there is a lot of information online about unconventional gas fields and fracking.
- Raise awareness of the threat to our environment with your neighbours and friends.



#### The Friends of Thynghowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of

#### Summer is not the best time for practical woodland archaeology due to the dense vegetation so our focus shifts onto research with documents rather than investigations on site.

The recently published Welbeck Atlas is a rich source of information. This includes nearly 80 maps of the Estates of William Cavendish, Earl of Newcastle compiled by William Senior between 1629 and 1640. These maps cover the Earl's lands in Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Staffordshire, Northumberland, Gloucestershire and Somerset. The local maps of his Welbeck Estate and surrounding areas are most fascinating. The 1629 map of Sookholme shows the original courses of the River Meden and Sookholme Brook. The area now called the Rhein o'Thorns was named as "Reynold Thornes" (Reynolds may have been a Sookholme farmer). Owners of the barn conversions at Sookholme who are thinking of a traditional name for their home may be interested to know that a nearby field was referred to as "Shittin Hole"! The maps of Gleadthorpe and Edwinstowe have provided insights that have helped our research into the trackways around Thynghowe and into the area of the Forest named Prestwich.

A couple of original documents that have come into the possession of the Friends of Thynghowe refer to "The Absolute Order No 156 of the Board of Agriculture bearing date the twenty seventh day November One thousand eight hundred and ninety issued persuant to ... The Limited Owners Residences Act 1870 ... sum of £8264 11/9 for the improvement of the mansion called Welbeck Abbey ... by Sanitary Works, Hot and Cold Water Supply, Hydrants, etcetera ..." These manuscripts list the properties and their occupiers in Welbeck Abbey and the surrounding villages in 1890 that were associated with the financing of the improvements to the abbey. We will be lodging these documents with the Nottinghamshire Archives but if anybody has an interest in viewing them whilst we still hold them, please contact us.

Another interesting read is the latest issue of the Transactions of The Thoroton Society that describes the latest research into Nottinghamshire's history. Along with an update on the 2016 Thynghowe excavation it includes articles covering the changes to the northern boundary of Sherwood Forest in the 16th century and also the development of water meadows along the rivers Poulter, Meden and Maun with particular reference to the system near Norton.

# Footpath & Countryside Group

After an unpromising start 2017 has been a brilliant year for orchids around Warsop. The late arrival of the cows on the Hills & Holes allowed a fine crop of Fragrant Orchids to flower without getting trampled.



Bee Orchids appeared in several spots where I have not previously seen them and they have appeared for a second time near the viewpoint on the top of Warsop Vale. It is pleasing that Nottinghamshire County Council have agreed to delay the mowing of that area to allow them to finish flowering.

By the end of June, most of the banks of Warsop's waterways have been checked at least once for the problem invasive plant, Himalayan Balsam. Some areas are much clearer than in previous years but some bad patches remain. The riverbanks near Hammerwater Bridge have been particularly bad this spring with over five thousand plants needing to be removed, possibly due to heavy rain last autumn carrying seeds downstream from other affected sites. The wetlands of The Bottoms at Meden Vale appear to have many fewer balsam plants compared with last year when we put a lot of effort into pulling them before they could seed.

The wildflower grassland area next to the river on The Carrs was looking good earlier this year. I counted 15 different flower species together with a Common Blue butterfly showing its approval. The taller grasses were waving in the breeze and the area was alive with insects and birds. By now the meadow may be past its best but it remains a valuable habitat although you may have to look more closely to see all of the different flowers.

We shouldn't welcome the shortening day lengths but they usually coincide with the slowing of the rate of grass growth. We have already given many of Warsop's footpaths their second cut of the year and there is a possibility that some may have to be given a third or a fourth. When we started this work twenty years ago, the paths received at most, two cuts!

Our next group walk will be on Saturday 19th August. This will be the last of our walks celebrating the anniversary of the Charter of the Forest, focussing on the landscape along the rivers that once formed the Sherwood Forest boundary. We will meet outside Warsop Library at 10am before embarking on a local walk following sections of the Forest boundary along the River Meden in Warsop parish. 

## Man Ordered to Pay £2023 for Fly Tipping

#### A Mansfield man has been ordered by magistrates to pay a total of £2023 in fines and costs for fly tipping.

Christopher Moles, 26, of Sadler Street, Mansfield, admitted depositing bags of waste, contrary to section 33 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

Building materials, including bags of tiles, a sink with taps and a toilet - the waste from a bathroom refurbishment - were found on Green Lane in Pleasley on 4 November, which had been fly tipped from the back of his van.

A passing motorist witnessed the items being thrown from the van, noted the vehicle registration and reported the matter to council officers who then investigated the offence.

After hearing the details of the case magistrates imposed a fine of £1230, victim surcharge of £123, compensation of £173.24 and costs of £497, making a total of £2023.24.

Cllr Bill Drewett, Portfolio Holder for Safer Communities said:

"Fly tipping continues to be a major problem. It creates a health hazard and blights the landscape. We will not tolerate the actions of people who dump their waste and damage the environment, which then costs thousands of pounds of tax payers' money to clear up. I am sure that residents across the district would find this behaviour very upsetting and totally unacceptable.

"If people fly tip waste, they need to realise that they will be caught and prosecuted, and could end up with a hefty fine via the courts and a

## **Woman Ordered to** Pay £584 for Littering

#### A Mansfield woman was ordered to pay £584 in fines and charges after **Mansfield District Council** prosecuted her for littering.

Caroline Rowley (26) of Church Street, Sutton in Ashfield, committed an offence of littering, on 8 February 2017 outside Mansfield bus station. No plea was entered and the matter was proved in her

A neighbourhood warden had seen Rowley drop a cigarette outside

Southern Derbyshire Magistrates' Court fined Rowley £440 on 14 June 2017 and ordered her to pay a contribution towards prosecution costs of £100 and a victim surcharge of £44. The total of £584 was to be paid in full by 28 June 2017.

Cllr Bill Drewett, Portfolio Holder for Safer Communities, said:

"We take littering seriously and we will prosecute those who drop litter. There are plenty of litter bins around the town, so there's no excuse for not using them. It could end up being a costly mistake so the advice is to dispose of your litter properly - and avoid a hefty fine and a criminal record."

## Hundreds of people are expected to descend on the Mansfield Summer Festival this school holiday to celebrate a summer of cycling.

With the fourth stage of the OVO Energy Tour of Britain cycling race starting in Mansfield on 6 September, the town is gearing up to encourage cycling and physical activity to inspire the next generation of world-class cyclists.

With that in mind, Mansfield District Council has organised the annual Summer Festival events, with a cycling and health and wellbeing theme, that run from 10am to 3pm.

The first of three events will take place at Titchfield Park on Friday 28 July. There will be an array of family entertainment including a charity duck race to raise funds for local soup kitchens.

The second festival at King George V Park, off Blackscotch Lane, on Wednesday 9 August will mark the official local launch for Tour of Britain. 

The Object is Alive has invited British artist Matthew Darbyshire to develop a new exhibition that actively engages with Nottingham Castle Museum & Art Gallery and its collection, and is influenced by the work of Polish artist and theatre maker Tadeusz Kantor, who was interested in the role and status of the object. Matthew has reimagined 14 objects from Nottingham Castle's collections – including 18th century Wedgwood, 20th century studio pottery, modernist sculpture and even a grenade from the Regimental Museum. By playing with scale and devising new materials and techniques, including experimenting with different concrete formulas, he has created a series of new works exclusively for the Castle.

The Object is Alive: Matthew Darbyshire is the first in a series of exhibitions that actively explore the role of object as discussed in Kantor's writing and artistic outputs. Funded by Arts Council England and the Henry Moore Foundation, this exhibition is part of a collaborative project with Radar at Loughborough University, and will be followed by Mike Cooter at New Walk Museum, Leicester (Winter 2017), and Giles Round at Derby Museums (Spring 2018).

Brick Wonders - Ancient, Natural and Modern Marvels in Lego created by Warren Elsmore - will take visitors on a journey through history and round the globe featuring both old and new wonders of the world.

The seven wonders of the ancient world, including the Lighthouse at Alexandria and The Hanging Gardens of Babylon, are recreated in full to great effect. In all, the show will present more than 70 fantastically detailed models.

As well as ancient wonders, visitors can marvel at the recreation in miniature of some of the world's most spectacular natural landmarks from The Great Barrier Reef and The Great Wall of China to the Matterhorn. Hodsock Priory's snowdrop and winter gardens will open to visitors daily from Saturday 4 February to Sunday 5 March 2017. The historic north Nottinghamshire attraction is celebrating the estate's scents, smells, tastes, sounds and textures this season.

Each year at Snowdrops at Hodsock, visitors enjoy the opportunity to roam five acres of formal planted gardens, landscaped in the 1820s, and a further 12 acres of stunning snowdrop and beech covered woodland. The woodland walk is suitable for all abilities with regular resting places, and footpaths throughout the woodland and gardens are passable in most weather conditions with wheelchairs and buggies.

The gift and plant sale area run by locally-based Floral Media will be located aside Hodsock's iconic Tudor Gatehouse again, with direct access into the Snowdrop woods. Each day, the campfire will be lit in the Glade where picnics can be eaten, or hot drinks and snacks bought from the Woodland Cafe.
