Remembrance Day - Lest We Forget

The Royal British Legion had invited all Parish Councils to take part in the Nottinghamshire 'Lamp Post Poppy' Campaign. Warsop Parish Council was happy to join in with this project and support the RBL.

Cllr John Kerr (WPC & MDC) kindly purchased 66 Poppies and organised the installation of these along the Remembrance Day Parade route and around Warsop Town Centre. This was paid for with Cllr Kerr's District Council Ward allowance.

Warsop Parish Council worked with Warsop's 'Real Poppy' Campaign, local schools including Netherfield School, Hetts Lane Holiday Club and Sherwood Junior School. Warsop's 'Real Poppy' Campaign created artwork to line the route of the parade which included, knitted and crocheted poppies, along with a hand-made poppy blanket to hang from the Town Hall's balcony. Sherwood Junior School were very enthusiastic to work with the Parish Council and show their support to this fantastic campaign Every year group contributed to the creation of poppy plates which were displayed on and in shop windows on the parade route.

The cost of the road closure for the parade was kindly donated by Councillor Andy Wetton (WPC, MDC & NCC) from his Notts County Council allowance. The route of parade was changed to include the newly named road Robert Bye Way, named after Robert Bye who was awarded the VC for bravery.

The Parish of Warsop remembered its veterans of the British Armed Forces and all who fought and lost their lives.

GARDENING MONTHLY...



General Tasks and Garden Maintenance

Carry on digging over beds and borders and incorporate as much organic matter as you can. Forking over not only helps prepare the soil for next year, it helps reduce pests by exposing them to hungry birds.

Protect pots and taps from frost by wrapping insulation around them. Bubble wrap is ideal and probably in plentiful supply if you are ordering Christmas presents over the

Clear paths of moss and lichen, treat timber with preservative, repair fences, check sheds and walls (but avoid any concreting until there is no chance of frost), clean and insulate greenhouses (that bubble wrap again!) and ensure heaters are working properly. Even a little insulation will make a huge difference to your heating bill.

Clean and repair your garden tools and clock the lawn mower in for a service. New tools are always a welcome present, as are new gardening gloves... especially good quality ones.

Clear debris - this is vital to prevent slugs and snails from setting up home in those lovely warm and damp conditions! However, a plea for wildlife... An artless pile of sticks and logs will make a wonderful 'des res' for hibernating hedgehogs and the like, so please don't be too ferocious on the tidying front. Make leaf mould out of fallen leaves - they will rot down into fantastically fertile matter after a year (2 for oak leaves). Store wet leaves (they must be wet to rot) in large black plastic sacks forked with holes or piled into a chicken wire container or similar. Failing that, add them to the compost

Take care not to let leaves accumulate around alpines - they will die if left damp for long. Cover bare patches around clumps with gritty compost to encourage regrowth.

Trees, shrubs and climbers

From now until March is the ideal time to plant bare rooted deciduous hedging - the most economical way to establish a hedge. Beech and hornbeam (similar to beech but more suitable for heavy soils) both keep their leaves over the winter and are therefore good for screening, whilst hawthorn is the 'country classic' - perfect for a natural looking yet almost impenetrable barrier.

Prepare a trench, preferably a week or so before planting to give the soil a chance to settle. Wait until the ground is neither sodden nor frozen and plant away - it's worth waiting for the right conditions; your plants will be perfectly happy sitting in the pots of compost they came in for weeks!

Rhododendrons and camellias make excellent Christmas presents - if your soil is unsuitable (alkaline), the centre has a great choice of elegant pots. Don't forget the

Tidy up trees and shrubs, cutting out any dead, diseased or damaged wood where necessary. (And on the Christmas present front, sharp new secateurs and loppers are a gardener's dream!)

Cut shoots and branches for winter decoration. If you have holly berries, net some of them for Christmas, otherwise the birds will have the lot. Secure netting firmly to prevent birds becoming trapped in loose folds.

 ${\it Make a Christ mas wreath using evergreen sprigs from your garden, decorations such}$ as berries and fir cones, dried orange slices, cinnamon sticks and wide, wired ribbon.

Flowers and containers

Put bark chips around hellebores to protect the delicate blooms from rain splashes and cut off any leaves with black spots on them - this is a fungal disease and not to be tolerated! Bring in any tender plants that are not already in shelter.

Bulbs - they should really be planted already, but if you haven't quite got around to it, put them in the ground as soon as you can. It's not exactly text book stuff, but they will probably come up and flower in the spring, even if a little later than normal - worth a go!

Repetitive, we know, but do raise containers onto feet or bricks to protect them from wet and cold and lag them with bubble wrap, hessian or fleece if not frost proof. In really cold weather even hardy plants may need protecting so hunt out any insulating

Remove debris regularly to prevent pests from taking up residence and brighten up dull pots and containers with winter pansies and winter flowering heathers.

Lawns

If the weather allows, repair holes and tatty patches in your lawn. If it is waterlogged, as most will be after the November deluges, or even frozen, try and avoid walking on it - damage is easily inflicted!

This month birds will really need our help - make sure clean water is available and that after a frost it does not remain frozen. Buy good quality bird food and fat or suet balls, ensure feeding stations are well out of the way of cats and enjoy the company of our feathered friends throughout the winter!



Warsop's Fight to be

Ineos has been carrying out seismic surveys in the fields and woods surrounding Warsop – you may well have seen the red and blue painted posts, cabling and monitoring equipment, big white Vibroseis trucks or drilling equipment for placing explosive charges where the trucks cannot reach.

This survey is building up a 3D image of the shale resources, giving lneos the information they need to decide the best places to site exploratory drilling rigs which, depending on what they find, could lead to lots more wells and the development of a gas field across our countryside.

People often think,

'Well, it's going to happen anyway, no matter what I do' and 'We need the energy, let them get on with it' so the following information may be of interest.

Future Gas Supplies

In its own recent report on "Gas Security of Supply" the government states that the UK is NOT reliant on the shale gas industry for our gas supplies; Shale gas may increase supply diversity but, according to Mike Hill, B.Sc (Hons) C.ÉNG MIET, hydraulic fracturing regulation expert and contributor to several reports including the Medact

"High Volume Hydraulic Fracturing is likely, at best and at its height, to provide between 10-15% of the UKs gas needs. So 85% will still need to come from elsewhere."

To get that 15%, according to Professor Davies at Newcastle University, would require around 52,000 wells to be drilled across our countryside. A drill site requires lots of ancillary machinery, compressors, equipment and thousands of HGV vehicle movements that will basically industrialize the rural area.

Well Density

The following map shows PEDL 307 (Petroleum Exploration & Development Licence), one of 21 which were awarded to Ineos in the UK Government's 14th licensing round. Ineos are looking at developing up to 10 drill sites per 10k square PEDL area, with 10 to 12 wells per site, but actual number will be dependent on gas resources found. If resources are plentiful, Ineos could develop more sites, as the government has refused to set an upper limit on well density or a minimum distance from homes. It is not commercially viable for Ineos to have the odd drill site dotted about - they need

a gas field with hundreds of wells to extract all the gas. The map shows an illustration (not actual site locations) of what 10 sites could look like.

Ineos is a huge petro-chemical corporation – its sites at Grangemouth have massive energy requirements and need gas as a feedstock for its processes that produce chemicals and plastic. Currently, they import shale gas from the US and have invested in developing the industry in England in order to produce their own gas supplies; the gas they don't need for their own use would be sold on the open market and expert opinion has said that this is highly unlikely to affect UK gas prices due to the British and European energy market being significantly different to the American.

The question this prompts: are the negative health and environmental impacts plus extensive industrialization across such a large area of rural England worth the end result of adding only 15% at best to the gas market for a limited time, especially with a large amount of Ineos' gas intended for its own use in Grangemouth?

Democracy

The government is moving towards making non-fracking drilling permitted development so that it does not require planning permission, thereby taking away our democratic right to object. They have already changed the definition of fracking so it relates to the quantity of water used - around 40% of the fracking wells in the US would not be classed as fracking under this definition! These rubber-stamped exploratory sites could then go on to be full producing well sites.

Clean Growth

In the "Clean Growth Strategy" report, the government states that clean growth is not an option but a duty we owe to the next generation. Yet the Conservative government is still going "all out for shale" even in light of many recent studies giving scientifically-proven evidence of its damaging impacts. The Scottish Environmental Protection Agency has just released 2016 data on the top polluters in Scotland; by far the highest carbon dioxide emitter

was Ineos with three of its Grangemouth plants coming in the top ten (The Herald Scotland).

The fracking process requires millions of gallons of water, a large amount of which comes back up to the surface as toxic and radioactive flow back waste which has to be tankered away along our roads to an, as yet unknown, destination as the infrastructure for handling a hugely increased volume of toxic waste currently does not exist. The fracking process will increase air pollution, increase the risk of water contamination, and cause greenhouse gas emissions. Impacts on surrounding communities include loss in house value and saleability; increased insurance premiums; negative impact or historic cultural sites and tourism and high risk of damage to wildlife ecosystems. Not exactly clean growth!

Industry Progress Report

Within Nottinghamshire there are currently five sites identified for exploratory drilling:

- Misson, near Doncaster and Tinker Lane, Blyth are both due to start well pad construction in January
- Marsh Lane, Eckington has no date yet set for deciding the planning application
- Harthill was to be decided in November but the decision has been postponed until January/February
- At the time of writing planning permission for a site at Woodsetts is about to be submitted.

The drill rig at Kirby Misperton in Yorkshire is about to start fracking and will be the first in 6 years to lead to gas production.

Protesting has slowed down the progress of the industry – the drill site at Preston New Road in Lancashire is months behind schedule due to protests and direct action. As more people become aware and more vocal, local councils are starting to listen. Scotland has recently banned this industry; Ireland already has and Wales has a moratorium. Rotherham Metropolitan Borough has recently banned seismic surveys and fracking from taking place on their land. But it all depends on people making their feelings known – please, get out that pen, tablet or laptop and start writing to the people who are making these decisions on your behalf! The latest government survey shows that public support for fracking is down to 13% - they are pushing ahead with no social license.

CALL TO ACTION please get involved!

 Frack Free United are running a national campaign asking groups, organisations and businesses to declare their anti-fracking stance – please collect a form from the Town Hall or download from their website

then ask your organisation to sign!

- Object to planning applications; you do not have to be a resident of the area to object. Comments are still being accepted for Harthill and Eckington; Woodsetts should be open for comment by the time this is published.
- Contact your elected representatives and tell them of your concerns contact Ben Bradley MP about proposed changes to the rules on permitted development which take away our democratic right to object to the drill sites; Mansfield District Councillors John Kerr, Sharron Adey and Andy Burgin will be interested in your views on impacts on Warsop. Main decisions will be taken at County level, so contact Notts County Councillor Andy Wetton and ask him to vote against any motion that supports the Shale Gas industry and fracking.
- FFW are currently collecting signatures to petition our MP, Ben Bradley, to oppose any motion supporting fracking. These can be found at various places around Warsop, including the Town Hall - pop in and sign! We met with Ben in October and presented the case against fracking to him. He understood our concerns and has promised to read the report we gave him.

Your Local MP's Update

Westminster with lots to report. I've held my local surgeries and drop ins at the town hall as usual and wanted to thank local residents for their attendance and support at these. It's great to hear from you and obviously I'm happy to help where I can.

The Mayor's Warsop Commission comes to a close very soon and I've found it to be a useful discussion. The real test though of course is in delivering some useful outcomes, and that will ultimately come down to the Mayor and local Councils. I hope that recommendations that come out of the Commission, particularly those for the District Council which are obviously her direct responsibility, will be actioned to support the town. For my part, I've raised some ideas and am talking direct to Government about funding possibilities for both improvements to our road and rail connections, and also support to improve the facilities at Meden School, Arquably the biggest priority though has to be the Sports Centre, as obviously its under threat right now and it simply makes no sense for Warsop to lose that vital facility. I have said during the Commission in no uncertain terms that this must be top of the list, and I know there are a number of possibilities under discussion so the pressure is on for Councils to deliver.

Recently I attended a concert in support of a little girl from Warsop, Elsie Novell. She's 4 years old and suffers from a degenerative muscular condition that ultimately will make it tough for her to eat and drink, and then ultimately hard to breathe. Her family and friends are working to raise money to give her the best possible quality of life, and there are few good causes more worthy of support than that! The choir event at St Peter Neri Church in town raised close to £2500, and was a breathtaking and beautiful evening with some incredible voices on display. I particularly wanted to mention Rebecca Von Lipinski, who grew up in Warsop and now leads the Stuttgart Opera in Germany. Both her voice and her success story are inspirational and what a fantastic role model for local kids in Warsop! She flew back in from Germany to support Elsie and her family at the event. The 27th Annual Christmas Prize Draw

This year will be our 27th Annual **Christmas Prize Draw, during which** time the participating Charities, **Clubs and Organisations will have** raised over £120,000 between themselves for their causes.

This year alone, we will have sold 45,000 tickets through approx. 25 participating organisations, and they will have raised in excess of £8,000-00.

The process works very simply, the organisations buy tickets from our Club in monetary values from £20-00 upwards. This would buy you 50 books of 10 tickets with a selling price of 25p each or £2-50 per book. If you sell all of the tickets you would make £105-00 for your organisation, if you bought 100 books and sold all of the tickets, you would make £210-00 and so on.

The cost of the tickets which we sell to these organisations covers the cost of the printing and prizes which we provide. Last year, there were around 150 prizes which varied greatly from, hampers to turkeys(fresh), chickens, pork pies, chocolates, biscuits, bottles of wines and spirits, cases of beers/lagers etc., small electrical goods, seasonal gift boxes and last but most importantly children's toys. So you see we try to cater for everyone.

The Prize Draw takes place at The Fretwell Centre, Sookholme with representatives present from all participating organisations, who are able to take all of their winning prizes away with them to distribute to Their Winners.

If you feel that your organisation would like to take part in Next Year's Prize Draw and Raise Money for yourselves, we are looking to make it an even bigger event with even more prizes. Unfortunately, we are unable to sell more tickets this year.

Bin Your Gum Campaign to Help Clean up Town Centre

People in Mansfield are being urged to back a new campaign to put a stop to the sticky issue of chewing gum on the town's pavements.

Mansfield District Council's campaign aims to raise awareness of the growing problem of gum littering around town and encourage people to bin their gum.

Chewing gum is not biogradable and can be removed only by using expensive, specialist gum removing equipment. While the average piece of gum costs about 3p to buy, it costs up to £1.50 per square metre to clean off pavements.

"Like most high streets across the country, Mansfield's pavements are increasingly splattered with chewing gum,

said Cllr Andrew Tristram, Portfolio Holder for Environment and Wellbeing.

"We work hard to make the town a cleaner, more attractive environment for residents, visitors and businesses and we hope the campaign will encourage people to walk the short distance to their nearest bin and throw their gum away. People may not realise that this type of littering is difficult and expensive remove."

Posters and promotional material will be used to try and raise awareness of the problem and encourage people to think twice before dropping gum on the floor.

Entries were reviewed, not just against the specific award criteria, but also in light of how they contributed to the pioneering nature of the Co-operative movement.

Over the last decade, the Pioneer Awards (formerly CRTG Supplier Awards) have become established as a key date in the industry's event calendar. During the last 9 years, working closely with

Warm Homes on Prescription for Patients

Financial help to reduce heating bills is on offer in Mansfield to homeowners on a low income who have a health condition that could be made worse or put them at risk if they live in a cold property.

People with various illnesses and conditions could qualify for help as part of Mansfield District Council's Warm Homes on Prescription programme which is for people who live in their own home or privately rented accommodation.

Assistance offered depends on the financial means and health of the occupant and can include:

- Grants for boiler repairs, replacement, or improvements (home owners only)
- Help to make heating more affordable, such as guidance on switching energy supplier, ensuring all benefits are claimed, and using heating efficiently
- Advice on keeping warm and safe.

People with heart, blood pressure, respiratory and circulation problems, osteoporosis (brittle bones), strokes, diabetes and cancer can seek this support.

The council can also negotiate with landlords to secure energy efficiency improvements to privately rented properties, subject to a property assessment.

According to Government statistics, 4,395 households in Mansfield - 9.6% of all homes in the district - are fuel poor. Fuel poverty and low incomes are more prevalent in the private rented sector with 19% of households being fuel poor. Properties in this sector are also more likely to have poor energy efficiency ratings.

Cllr Barry Answer, the council's Portfolio Holder for Housing, said: "Staying warm and safe is especially important for people with a health problem and this scheme will help some of our most

"If anyone knows someone who could benefit from this scheme I urge them to let them know about it and encourage them to get in touch. They might even qualify for a grant to get a new boile

Many hundreds turned out on a crisp November morning to join in this year's act of remembrance. The annual event organised by the Royal British Legion in partnership with Warsop Parish Council was this year enhanced by a few changes to previous years.



Firstly, huge thanks and congratulations must go to Warsop's Real Poppy Campaign who pulled out all of the stops and really ensured the town was appropriately decorated with a plethora of poppies - many handmade by local residents. It was a wonderful view that greeted the participants in the parade as they journeyed past decorated shops and trees lining the route with skirts of poppies to go with the poppy covered lampposts.

For the first time, the parade journeyed down the newly renamed Robert Bye Way - every year from now on as the parade travels to the cenotaph, Warop's VC hero will be part of the procession.

The Friends of Thynghowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

Last month I mentioned how the Charter of the Forest of 1217 may have affected local folk as the Sherwood Forest boundary reverted to following the River Meden.

However, any hopes that the land outside the royal forest would be free from the restrictions of Forest Law would have been misplaced. The large area of Rumwood to the north of Gleadthorpe was retained as crown land and was subject to the same restrictions as the land inside the forest boundary.

Private hunting rights were given to the king's supporters. John of Lexington from Laxton was granted rights for Warsop in 1239. The monks of Welbeck Abbey were given privileges to graze livestock that were not enjoyed by local folk.

It took ten years after the charter before the local changes were finally agreed and in 1232 the freemen of the area had to pay for a charter to ratify the changes.

On Friday 15th December, you are welcome to join us at 10am when we meet at the Warsop Windmill forest barrier for a few hours in the forest managing the landscape around Thynghowe. Tasks could include clearing the birch and bracken regrowth on the slopes of Thynghowe, planting hawthorn to restore the ancient hedgerow alongside the track leading to Thynghowe and checking for rhododendron regrowth on the areas previously cleared. Good fun and good exercise - and there may be cake!

Early next year there will be another landscape management session on Friday 19th January and a walk exploring the ancient routes through Birklands on Saturday 13th January. Check our Facebook page or website for more details if you would like to join us.

An interesting exhibition with local connections will be held at Nottingham University Museum between Saturday 25 November and Sunday 4 March.

Viking: Rediscover the legend will include nationally and internationally significant Anglo-Saxon and Viking artifacts from the British Museum and Yorkshire Museum Trust alongside current research providing a new interpretation and a fresh perspective on how Vikings transformed and shaped every aspect of life in Britain.

As Warsop was at the heart of tenth century Viking settlement along the Meden Valley there should be insights into our local heritage. This free exhibition is in the Djanogly Gallery, University Park, Nottingham NG7 2RD and is open on Tuesdays to Saturdays between 11am and 5pm and on Sundays from 12noon to 4pm

2018 Boundary Review

revised proposals for new Parliamentary constituency boundaries

The Boundary Commission for England has published its Revised Proposals for new constituency boundaries and this marks the start of an eight week consultation period on the proposals during which the Boundary Commission are inviting people to view and comment on the new boundaries.

The proposals for the East Midlands Region can be inspected at Mansfield District Council, Civic Centre, Chesterfield Road South, Mansfield, NG19 7BH until 11 December 2017.

The BCE is an independent apolitical impartial public body and must make its recommendations for new Parliamentary boundaries to Parliament in September 2018. This is the last round of public consultation.

How to have your say

The commission encourage everyone to use this final opportunity to contribute to the design of the new constituencies and ask everyone wishing to contribute to first look at the revised proposals report, and accompanying maps, before responding to them. The best way to respond is through their consultation website www.bce2018.org.uk

Proposals and maps for the East Midlands area and the rest of England have been published on this website. The revised proposal for the Mansfield Constituency remains unchanged from the initial proposal and will remain completely unchanged and will be conterminous with the Mansfield district.

In this feature, we are offering a chance for the many talented artists we have residing in our parish to showcase their artwork.



Footpath & **Countryside Group**

As we approach the Winter Solstice the hours of daylight become more precious. The Christmas break is a fine time to get outdoors and take a walk along one of the many excellent routes through our local countryside.



How about a resolution to take a regular walk? If you are not sure where to go check the Town Hall or Library for our walks leaflets and take a look at our website: wfcg.org.uk.

If you have a shed or outhouse, you may spot a hibernating butterfly or you may see one flying around on a sunny day in winter. Several species of butterfly hibernate as adult butterflies, including the Red Admiral, Peacock, Small Tortoiseshell and Brimstone Most species survive the winter as a caterpillar with a chrysalis being the next most common method, followed by eggs then overwintering as an adult.

This summer's Big Butterfly Count produced mixed results, partly due to the wet weather during the survey period. Some species had done well in the warm spring weather and were past their peak numbers during the count. However, 2017 appears to have been a good year for Red Admirals, Commas, Common Blues, Speckled Woods and Gatekeepers but Ringlets, Peacocks, Small Tortoiseshells and most of the white butterflies were less successful.

2017 has been another busy year for Warsop Footpaths & Countryside Group. We have clocked up over 500 hours of volunteer time. We have mown over 12 miles of paths, removed over 18,000 invasive Himalayan balsam plants, worked on four wildlife sites, cleared brambles and trimmed hedges along several miles of path, surveyed riverbanks for water voles and even found time to write these notes! Most of this work was done by only four volunteers. None of us are getting any younger and without any offers of help we cannot guarantee that all this work will continue.

It is pleasing to see that the path alongside the hedge on The Carrs has been widened and its surface improved. The riverside path between the mill dam and the steps has also been resurfaced. If you have not been round The Carrs recently take a walk along these new paths and check out the work that the Friends of The Carrs have been doing clearing the riverbanks. The wildflower meadow has received its annual cut with the vegetation removed to reduce the fertility of the area to encourage more flowers. In early 2018, we should be working at other end of The Carrs Local Nature Reserve giving the annual trim to hedges and trees that we planted many years ago. We will also cut back a large patch of brambles to encourage the woodland flowers that appear each spring.

One of those people is Marie, who completed the SIA training and gained her SIA licence in April. Following a change in her family circumstances, Marie needed to work more hours. She felt that the security training would provide her with new skills and a qualification that would allow her to earn some extra money for

"When I was younger, I worked in bars and I always envied the security staff," Marie said. "They definitely had a presence and were well respected. Since then I've often thought about training for security work, but I couldn't afford the course fee. When I heard that Big Warsop was funding security training for local people, I knew it was my chance to qualify and get my security badge.

"The training covered things like conflict management and basic physical interventions, but there was also a focus on customer service. We also learned about the relevant leaislation and what you can and can't do as a security officer. At the end of each of the five days of training, there was a multiple choice test. You needed to achieve a certain percentage each day to pass and gain the security

"The people on the training course were very friendly and supportive of each other. Those qualities are important because you need people you can rely on when you work in this industry.'

Before gaining her qualification, Marie had already started doing some football stewarding and, once she gained her SIA licence, she was promoted to a security role at the football club. She has also taken on security work at music festivals in Leeds and

"Recently I've started to do door work at night clubs," said Marie. "It was a bit daunting at first, but I'm really enjoying it. The football work is regular, but the festivals come and go and I work them according to my availability. Security work is flexible, which suits me because it fits in with my family commitments. The extra income I'm earning through my security work is very welcome as it helps me support my family and means I will be able to afford to give my son the kind of Christmas and birthday he deserves."

The preferred bidder for the site on Stockwell Gate North can now be revealed as Arba Group, which has plans to build an 80-bed hotel with roof terrace, restaurant, café, bar and gym. The proposed scheme also includes a piazza, open space and other landscaping.

Local firm Arba Group, based on Broadway, Mansfield, is in negotiations with Mansfield District Council and national hotel. food and drinks operators to bring the plans to fruition over the next two years.

The company specialises in retail, leisure and industrial development. Its senior management team has combined experience of over 70 years in property development, estate management and construction.

Arba Group has an excellent track record of delivering projects and recently acquired and redeveloped the former Lloyds Bank building on Stockwell Gate which is now Capo Lounge. It has recently developed 80,000sq ft offices at Meadowhall in

A delegated decision in relation to the disposal of the former bus station site is due to be taken by Cllr Roger Sutcliffe, Portfolio Holder for Finance on Friday 3 November.

In a report by the Director of Economic Growth at Mansfield District Council, Mike Robinson, he recommends that the site at Stockwell Gate North is declared surplus to the council's requirements and that it is sold to the Arba Group. The council has continually looked for opportunities to redevelop the site since the old bus station was relocated in 2013 to address the regeneration aspirations for the town.

In September 2017, the council asked for expressions of interest from developers to buy the site and develop it in line with the council's regeneration aims. This resulted in two formal submissions being received by Colliers, the council's development agents appointed to help secure a successful developer and end users. The two submissions included one from Arba Group and one on behalf of Mr John Radford, Chairman of Mansfield Town Football Club.

The Arba Group's plans offer strong links to the town centre with a direct entrance to the hotel from Stockwell Gate. The combination of a quality hotel, other leisure uses and strong links to the town centre would significantly increase the number of visitors in this location.

The chosen proposal also gives the council the option to buy back the completed development, which could form part of the council's long-term investment strategy. Further investigation into this will take place at a later date.

Executive Mayor of Mansfield Kate Allsop said:

"We are very excited that our long term regeneration vision for the town centre and desire for a much-needed hotel in Mansfield are moving forward. The redevelopment of this key gateway site will make the town centre an even more inviting and enjoyable place to visit and in turn help to create a thriving, vibrant and sustainable district."

The portal is one of the first major developments emerging from the council's Digital Transformation Strategy. 


