

## Don't miss out on your chance to vote

## Residents in Mansfield district are being urged to make sure they can vote at future elections by ensuring they are on the electoral register.

People who have not responded to the Invitation to Register form which was sent last year will be visited by a canvasser between now and the end of March.

The canvassers, who carry official Mansfield District Council identification, will not ask to enter residents' homes and will assist householders to complete the form on the doorstep.

If the canvasser is unable to contact anyone during this time, a reminder form will be delivered to them by 31 March to be completed and returned to the office by 13 April.

Alternatively, those who are eligible can also register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

With Nottinghamshire County Council elections taking place across Nottinghamshire in May, this is an opportunity for residents to make sure they will be able to vote.

Bev Smith, Chief Executive at Mansfield District Council, said: "Registering to vote is very simple, so don't miss out on the chance to vote in future elections and have your say on important national and local issues.

"The County Council elections will be taking place on 4 May so you need to be registered to vote by 13 April if you want to vote." It's particularly important that anyone who has moved home recently checks whether they are registered.

### **Centenary for Sgt Bye**



A decision will be made by Mansfield District Council this month on whether the Warsop inner relief road between the junction of Suretsart and Carr Lane can be renamed 'The Robert Bye Way,' in memory of our towns First World War Victoria Cross Hero Sgt Robert Bye.

The road renaming has the support of the Warsop Meden Vale and District branch of the Royal British Legion and the Parish Council.

It will be one hundred years ago this September when Sgt Bye received the Victoria Cross from King George V, at Buckingham Palace. Upon receiving the honour, he is reported to have said "I am proud of the honour conferred upon me but I only went out to France to do what millions of others are doing, my duty. In honouring me you are honouring my comrades out in France for they all did well that day."

I hope the committee at Mansfield District Council will approve the renaming of the road. If so, I hope to put together a display in Warsop Library to commemorate the First World War when the official renaming of the road takes place. M and M productions came to perform their interpretation of The Railway Children to our Key Stage 2 pupils.


As part of celebrating Roald Dahl's 100th birthday, each class focused on one of his fabulous stories. Year 4 made their own dream jars.

### **GARDENING MONTHLY...**



#### General Tasks and Garden Maintenance

Continue to dig over existing beds and borders, again incorporating as much organic matter as you can. Forking over not only helps prepare the soil for spring, it helps reduce pests by exposing them to hungry birds.

Although temperatures should start to rise this month, there is still a risk of frost and even snow. Protect vulnerable plants, pots and taps from frost by wrapping insulation such as garden fleece around them and check pots and containers are raised off the ground if possible. Tender trees and shrubs will thank you for a generous application of dry mulch to protect their roots from freezing conditions.

Once the ground isn't frozen, make new beds and borders - mark the shape with sand trickled from a bottle, remove the top layer of growing vegetation and dig the ground over, incorporating as much organic matter as possible. If you are making a bed in the lawn, remove the turf and stack it upside down somewhere out of the way - after a year or two it will rot down into fantastic compost. Alternatively chop it up and bury upside down in the planting hole a good spade's depth down. Beware - if you just dig it in the buried grass will regrow and regrow and regrow and...

Remember not to let leaves accumulate around alpines - they will die if left damp for long. Cover bare patches around clumps with gritty compost to encourage regrowth.

When the weather allows, carry on clearing paths, check walls (but avoid concreting until there is no chance of frost), clean and insulate greenhouses and ensure heaters are working properly. Even a little insulation will make a huge difference to your

Clean and repair your garden tools, book the lawn mower in for a service and check garden furniture for any rot. When it is warm enough, treat sheds, fences and trellis with wood preservative; brushes and rollers are fine for most things, however a sprayer is well worth buying for tricky projects such as woven panels!

#### Trees, shrubs and climbers

Plant bare-rooted shrubs and trees and container-grown climbers. As long as the ground isn't frozen, February is a great month for planting as the soil will soon be warming up, encouraging new roots to grow and helping the plant to become established. Remember to plant climbers about 10" away from walls so they are not in a rain shadow.

This is an important month for pruning - cut late summer and autumn flowering clematis down to 12" - seems draconian but they will quickly grow to their old height and produce flowers all the way up into the bargain! Attend to overgrown hardy evergreens, straggly hedges and wisteria if you haven't already done so (cut all shoots coming from the permanent branches to 2-3 buds of the previous season's growth - this will encourage the development of more flowering spurs). Prune deciduous coloured leaved shrubs grown for their foliage, like the purple-leaved elders - be brutal and leave literally a couple of shoots or buds on each stem unless you want a larger specimen, in which case leave a few lightly pruned stems to spring forth. In all cases feed your shorn plant with organic fertiliser and mulch with manure or compost for a great start to the growing season.

Lastly, prune roses by taking out all dead, weak and crossing stems. Cut hybrid tea roses back to about 8" to an outward facing bud and cut floribundas (those with flowers in clusters) down to 10-12".

Once the weather eases off, remove the top layer of soil from pot-grown shrubs and  $\,$ replace with fresh potting compost that contains a slow-release fertiliser.

Keep off the lawn as much as possible whilst it is still wet - damage to waterlogged lawns is easily inflicted. If, towards the end of the month, the weather turns dry and mild, the lawn is firm and the grass is starting to look a little shaggy, give it a very gentle mow with the blades on the highest setting - don't be tempted if conditions are wet! Also, if you are planning a new lawn, now is probably the earliest you could start preparing the ground for seeding or laying turf. Ask for advice in your local garden centre if you are unsure as to how to begin!

It's another lean month for wildlife and especially birds. Putting out fresh water and food is really important, especially on cold days. You've heard it all before, but please do buy good quality bird food or fat/suet balls and check that water is not frozen.

## **WARSOP** Footpath & Countryside Group

As is usual at this time of year we have enjoyed some beautiful clear, sunny days when a walk around our local countryside reminds us that we are fortunate to live in such a beautiful area.

I hope that 2017 will bring no new threats to our special places although following recent developments this may be rather optimistic.



There are already signs of spring to be seen with catkins appearing in December! Although February may not be a month that we normally associate with wildflowers, look out for Snowdrops, Lesser Celandine, Dog's Mercury, Germander Speedwell and Red Dead-nettle. If the weather is mild at the end of February, keep an eye open for the first frog spawn of the year. In recent years far fewer frogs have been visiting my garden pond and this mirrors the national situation with building development, loss of wetland habitats and viral disease all contributing to the decline. If you have a problem with slugs in your garden why not create a pond as resident frogs may help control them?

On our weekly work sessions, we should have almost finished hedge management alongside Warsop's footpaths, making the most of the short period between the birds eating most of the hedgerow fruits and starting to look for this year's nesting sites. Our next targets are several bramble patches that need attention before they spread across paths. Get in touch if you would like to join us for a couple of hours of gentle exercise on a Thursday morning.

The plans by the fracking company Ineos to carry out seismic surveying in the woodlands in eastern Warsop are a concern. At the start of 2017 the attitude of the landowners was unclear, only the Thoresby Estate had spoken out against the plans with no word from the Warsop (Fitzherbert) and Welbeck Estates. However, under the terms of the licence granted to Ineos by the government, the seismic survey can be carried out without the consent of the landowners. Planning permission is only required if they wish to proceed with fracking for shale gas.

Our next group walk will be on Saturday 18th February. We will meet at 10am and then set off on a walk around the local countryside. Contact us if you would like to

Celebrations got off to a good start with a talk by Trevor Lee on 'The Legends of the Fifties' with all the audience enjoying the morning and joining in.



#### In the early part of 2017 our focus will be on the landscape around Gleadthorpe, the area to the north-west of Thynghowe.

On Saturday February 25th we plan to survey a section of an ancient trackway that may have survived in Budby Forest. This will involve the use of a dumpy level, a staff and a tape to record the profile of the trackway and the adjoining land. This may help us determine whether the parallel depressions were formed at times when the original route became impassible or if they were formed by later forestry operations. Check our Facebook page for more information if you would like to join us. No skills are required, you are welcome to come along and see what we are doing and have a go. If you are out walking in the Forest that day, come and say hello - we will be near the junction of Hanger Hill Drive and the path from the sewage works to Budby.

On Friday 17th February, we will be assisting the Forestry  ${\color{blue} \textbf{Commission with landscape management around Thynghowe.}}$ This could involve birch coppicing, hedgerow restoration, rhododendron control and cake consumption. Tasks are suitable for all levels of fitness, it's a great way to enjoy the countryside! Check Facebook.com/Thynghowe for more details is you would like to take part.

On March 25th, we are holding a LiDAR workshop giving an opportunity to investigate the landscape using a range of computer software. In 2013 we commissioned a LiDAR survey of Birklands that involved an aircraft recording laser signals reflected from the ground. From this data, computer software can create an image of the woodlands with the trees and other vegetation filtered out enabling us to locate humps and holes that would otherwise be hidden. By changing the colours, lighting and viewing angle of these digital models we can reveal details of significant archaeological features. Places will be limited with members of the Friends of Thynghowe having priority but if you check our Facebook page there may be





## Mansfield sees an increase in rough sleepers

In a snapshot taken in autumn 2016; Mansfield District Council has reported an increase in known rough sleepers from eight to 27 in the past year.

The report compiles information from agencies who work with vulnerable people in the district including members of the Mansfield Homeless Network, Nottinghamshire Police and a range of voluntary sector and outreach workers.

Councillor Barry Answer, Mansfield District Council's Portfolio Holder for Housing said:

"Unfortunately there are more vulnerable people sleeping on our streets this year. This is a national issue but locally we are working with members of the Mansfield Homeless Network to support those who need help the most".

## Woman fined for failing to clean up after her dog

A Mansfield woman has been fined and ordered to pay costs totalling £783.87 for failing to clear up dog mess and for littering after failing to pay a Fixed Penalty notice issued to her on 24 June, 2016 at Tuxford Court.

Josephine Jordan of Scarrington Court, Mansfield was witnessed by a neighbourhood warden failing to pick up after her dog had fouled. A further offence of littering was committed when Jordan used a small white piece of paper to wipe the dog's bottom and threw the paper onto the ground.

Ms Jordan failed to attend court on 6 January and an application was made to prove the case in her absence, which was granted. She was found guilty in her absence and ordered by magistrates to pay a fine £220 for each offence, a victim surcharge of £30 and legal costs of £313.87.

Cllr Mick Barton, Portfolio Holder for Public Protection, said: "It is totally unacceptable that dog owners refuse to clean up after their dogs when walking in public. Dog mess not only looks unsightly, but poses a real health risk. It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of the dog to clear up any mess.'

In a recent meeting of the Mansfield Homeless Network, agencies pledged their increased support in 2017 to work with rough sleepers in the town and provide more help at the point of need. Mansfield District Council is working in partnership with Framework to introduce a street outreach team to make contact with persons sleeping rough. The team will be based in Mansfield and should be in place early 2017. The YMCA has recently extended support to provide accommodation for homeless people up to the age of 35.

Members of the network will continue to provide support services in Mansfield including soup kitchens, signposting and outreach and Mansfield District Council will once again be running a weekend winter shelter until February 2017 to provide shelter and hot food. The Winter Shelter gives the Housing Solutions team an opportunity to engage with rough sleepers and try to assist them into settled accommodation.

Mansfield District Council will continue to provide prevention services to help people who are at risk of becoming homeless. The authority is also part of a county wide project that has been successful in bidding for new funding to intervene early with rough sleepers before their problems become entrenched.

Mansfield District Council and Mansfield Police force have formed a task group to work in the town centre with homeless people and rough sleepers. The group brings together officers from the Mansfield Community Partnership Hub, Town Team and the district council's Housing Solutions team each month to discuss and agree on action to be taken in the town centre to help rough sleepers get back on their feet.

## Wellington Close Community Raises Funds for Defibrillator

# Residents in the Warsop area have purchased a new defibrillator for the Wellington Close community centre.

Kay Chant and Sallie Lamb from Warsop have raised £1688 through fundraising activities, which have been ongoing since February this year and supported by family, friends and the community including local school Birklands Primary, who held a non-uniform day and contributed £222.

The defibrillators alone cost £780 each so fundraisers have money left over to buy a second unit which will be purchased and installed over the coming months at Birklands Primary School.

Sallie Lamb said: "We saw that Meden Vale held some fundraising events to get their own equipment and found out that Warsop only had one defibrillator in the town, which was located in the fire station. We thought we would see how far we could go so that we could put another lifesaving piece of equipment into our community. My six year old son Caeleb even got involved and helped to raise £200."

Wellington Close centre is a Mansfield District Council owned building within Warsop. There are 37 predominantly elderly residents around Wellington Close who use the centre for events such as bingo, social evenings and parties.

Self-funded Mansfield Community First Responder Group provides the equipment whilst also providing lifesaving help across the district in support of East Midlands Ambulance Service. They visited the community centre to give a demonstration on how to use the defibrillator and to show how to respond to a person experiencing a

Mansfield District Council's Cllr Andy Wetton of Meden ward, who helped the fundraisers to facilitate the installation of the defibrillator in the community centre, said: "This is an excellent tool to have in the local community and Wellington Close is a sensible location to install it. The training provided by Mansfield Community First Responder Group was most valuable and I'm sure lives will be saved because of it."



## The friends group held an executive meeting to discuss MDC decision to remove the boards from the Weir and Dam.

Complaints from the owner of the Mill that they are the cause of flooding in the Mill and a threat to sue for damages has led MDC insurers to advise the removal of the said boards.

We, as a group, do not agree that this is the main cause of the problem as the boards are AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE DAM being in existence since the mill was built as photo opposite and witnesses prove.

The group agreed to cut the size of the boards from 12" to 4" to accommodate MDC to no avail. The waters of the dam have now dropped over a foot leaving a future mud bowl, having no lip allows the fish to wash down stream. Complaints from the anglers of levels and height of the fishing pegs which incidentally were erected at a lower level are now far to high. Again losing money and time spent planting along the banks and restocking the fish.


MDC deny that the boards were ever on the weir or the waters were above the arches and over the years have denied and ignored any responsibility for the flooding of the mill despite complaints appearing periodically for many years.

Although we have better communication with parks officers and good work has proceeded to improve the park, we cannot understand why they wish to take this stand. Also the project to renovate the weir and bridge, which has been classed as dangerous to the public, is now on hold as MDC does not seem interested.

**Question** - Do the residents of the parish want to preserve the dam and weir or step back, as MDC seem to want to, and let it fall into disrepair?

## **Lead Help for Veterans**

## The Ministry Of Defence has chosen The Royal British Legion to lead help for veterans

The Ministry of Defence (MOD) has announced that the Covenant Fund will work with The Royal British Legion and other charities to set up a one-stop service to better support the UK's Armed Forces veteran's community. The £2 million Veterans Gateway programme will help veterans find and access advice and support on a broad range of issues, including healthcare and housing.

The new service will provide a 24/7 phone number, with an empathetic and professional voice at the end of the line, a dedicated website and a mobile app to make it easier for former service personnel to access support on a range of issues including housing, employability and health.

It will give veterans, regardless of age or location, a simple point of contact to turn to for advice and help in accessing an array of public, private and charitable services which are out there. This move responds to calls from veterans' charities and groups for help in navigating the wide range of services and organisations set up to support those who have served in the Forces.

As part of the Armed Forces Covenant, which the Government enshrined in law to ensure that service personnel are not disadvantaged by their service, £2 million was set aside to set up the service. The £10 million-a-year Covenant Fund is supported by LIBOR fines

It has now been decided to award a grant to a group of charities led by The Royal British Legion, with support from other charities Combat Stress, SSAFA, the Armed Forces Charity, Connect Assist and Poppyscotland, who will provide the service to ensure no veteran is left behind.

The seven wonders of the ancient world, including the Lighthouse at Alexandria and The Hanging Gardens of Babylon, are recreated in full to great effect. In all, the show will present more than 70 fantastically detailed models.

As well as ancient wonders, visitors can marvel at the recreation in miniature of some of the world's most spectacular natural landmarks from The Great Barrier Reef and The Great Wall of China to the Matterhorn. Seven modern inventions are also represented through the LEGO creations - from a Model T car and a light bulb to the international space station.

This exhibition includes a LEGO brick model of the 'British Antarctic Survey's Halley VI Research Station', designed by Hugh Broughton. Hugh also designed The Portland Collection gallery at Welbeck, which has won four regional RIBA (Royal Institute of British Architects) awards, including East Midlands Building of the Year 2016, and a national RIBA award.

The Object is Alive has invited British artist Matthew Darbyshire to develop a new exhibition that actively engages with Nottingham Castle Museum & Art Gallery and its collection, and is influenced by the work of Polish artist and theatre maker Tadeusz Kantor, who was interested in the role and status of the object. Matthew has reimagined 14 objects from Nottingham Castle's collections – including 18th century Wedgwood, 20th century studio pottery, modernist sculpture and even a grenade from the Regimental Museum.
