
Carnival 2017 District News

GARDENING MONTHLY...



General Tasks and garden maintenance

Water thoroughly once or twice a week rather than little and often - this encourages plants to put down roots in search of water rather than coming up to the surface. Remember, though, that containers and hanging baskets need watering every day and sometimes even twice a day if it is hot and windy.

For recently planted large shrubs or trees, leave a hose trickling around the base for an hour. The same goes for established plants in very dry periods - pay particular attention to camellias, rhododendrons, azaleas and hydrangeas which will abort next season's flowers if they get too dry. Mulch around the roots when moist to help avoid this. Recently planted hedges are best watered with a trickle hose (a length of old hose punctured with little holes) left running for an hour or so.

Ensure trees or shrubs planted in the last couple of years on lawns or in areas of rough grass have a circle of clear earth around them - this must be kept clear or grass wil prevent essential moisture getting through. Mulching with bark or compost will help.

Water is a precious commodity - instigate good practices such as using kitchen and bath water (as long as it is neither too dirty, greasy nor full of detergent) for watering, collect rainwater in butts (available from the centre) and investigate ways to recycle water for your irrigation. Avoid using tap water for lime-hating plants such as camellias, rhododendrons and azaleas - they will not thank you for it!

The key to successful planting, whether it be a shrub, tree, perennial or bedding plant is to water in well. Soak the rootball in a bucket until no air bubbles come to the surface, dig the planting hole, fill with water and allow to drain away. Place the plant in the hole, fill with soil, firm gently and water well with a watering can - this will give the plant a huge advantage over one planted with a dry rootball in a dry hole and watered

Hoe beds and borders to get rid of annual weeds, like bitter cress and chickweed. If it's dry, attack perennial weeds like ground elder and the like with systemic weed killer painted onto the leaves and trail tips of bindweed into jam jars full of the same. Remember systemic weed killers are indiscriminate and will kill anything they contact. If you don't have time to do this, at least cut the culprits down to prevent them from

Keep your pond topped up with fresh water - a build up of algae in warm weather can be toxic, if not fatal, for animals.

As summer wears on and the ground hardens, it becomes more difficult for birds to forage for food. So do please put out food to supplement their diet and help build reserves for winter

Flowers and containers

Divide old clumps of bearded irises and replant. Chop oriental poppies, Jupins, delphiniums and geraniums right down to the ground once they have finished flowering - be brave and be brutal - the new leaves will be an ornament and some may flower again. Support tall delphinium stems with individual canes.

Cheat and fill any gaps in your borders with container-grown perennials. Dahlias will keep colour going until the first frosts so are a great autumn brightener in mixed borders. Pick sweet peas regularly - this is in effect early deadheading and will ensure continued flowering. Remember sweet peas are thirsty plants so keep them well watered.

Lawns

Keep mowing your lawn but raise the height of your blades if the weather remains hot. Feed established lawns if you haven't already done so with a summer lawn feed. If your lawn is mossy or full of weeds, use a feed with mosskiller or weedkiller, although this will also kill any wild flowers. If you have the lot, use combined feed, weed and

Add your grass clippings to the compost heap in shallow layers. A huge dollop will only turn slimy and spoil your compost.

Don't let newly laid lawns dry out in hot weather - water in the evenings and if there is a heat wave, consider leaving the lawn longer than usual just to help it through the hot weather.

If you are planning to seed a new lawn in the autumn, start preparing the area to allow the earth time to settle.

TO INEOS EISMIC SURVEY

- Have you seen these posters and wondered what they are talking about and "why should it affect me"?
- Have you heard of fracking and thought, well, it's a new way of getting the energy we need, so what is wrong with that?
- Have you heard that they are wanting to frack Warsop but don't really know much about what is involved?
- Have you heard that fracking has been halted or banned in Wales, Scotland, the Netherlands, France, Bulgaria and in the **US in New York State and Vermont** because of evidence relating to "significant public health risks" but our government wants to go "all out" for shale gas?
- · Have you heard that there is a new group called FrackFree Warsop which has recently formed to try to stop the fracking industry from taking a hold in our area?

With the support of Frack Free Mansfield and Frack Free Nottinghamshire, the group Frack Free Warsop has started meeting regularly to find out more, share information and do something about the threat that fracking brings to our locality anyone interested in keeping Warsop frack free is most welcome!

What is fracking?

Fracking, or hydraulic fracturing, is a process used to extract fossil fuels locked in rock formations thousands of metres below the Earth's surface.

The process starts with seismic surveys of the area to understand what the rock formations and the shale deposits look like underground. No planning permission is required for this, just the landowner's permission. Surveys can involve the use of explosive charges and/or "thumper" trucks to create the acoustic scan and the noise generated can cause disruption to wildlife and impact nearby habitats.

The landowner has every right to refuse permission!

Next step is for the company to obtain planning permission for an exploratory test site, then for the full fracking process.

Planning permission being granted in our area would mean hundreds of wells being drilled through the Sherwood aquifer, an area already pitted with abandoned coal mines, to reach the shale layer deep underground. The Sherwood aquifer supplies fresh water to over 8 million people.

The fracking process involves millions of gallons of fresh water, mixed with sand and chemicals, being injected deep underground at high pressure to fracture the rocks and release the shale gas.

Some of the chemical laden water stays underground, most comes back up to the surface as a toxic waste product containing a mixture of fracking chemicals, toxic heavy metals, carcinogenic hydrocarbons and radioactive elements leached from the shale.

This then has to be tankered by road to specific disposal sites across the country, causing approximately 20,000 vehicle movements per site. Once used in the fracking process, the water is toxic and cannot be recovered. Methane is also released.


Flares are often lit to burn off excess methane lasting for months, adding to greenhouse emissions and contaminating the air we breathe.

At the end of its productive life, typically about 3 years, the well is capped off and abandoned.

How does it affect Warsop?

Ineos, a large petro-chemical company, has obtained PEDLs (Petroleum Exploration and Development Licence) in order to develop large areas of central Notts and Sherwood Forest as an unconventional GAS FIELD. The section of map above right from the Friends of the Earth website gives an idea of scale.

Ineos hope that gas obtained from the gas field will be available



to meet their energy requirements at their plants - for example to generate the electricity to electrolyse brine in order to create chlorine, as well as using natural gas as a source of feedstock for chemicals products like plastic. This would be in addition to whatever they sell into the national gas grid.

In order to do this, Ineos plan to drill multiple wells across all their licenced areas.

Ineos began their seismic surveys across North Notts on 5 June 2017 which will last for six months. This will cover an area from Shirebrook, Holbeck, Warsop, Worksop and Shireoaks.

Nottinghamshire County Council is currently considering whether or not to allow seismic surveys on NCC land.

The National Trust at Clumber Park has not allowed seismic testing.

Ineos plan to put at least one exploratory drill rig in The Lings, on the western edge of Sherwood Forest, near Blakeley Lane and within 500 m of the Thynghowe Viking assembly site, an area considered to have international archaeological significance. The planned access road is through the forest, off the A6075 near Warsop Windmill.

Facelift for Warsop's Town Hall Clock



The eagle-eyed amongst you may have noticed something different about the town hall clock.

Contrary to rumours circulating the district, The Parish Council have not spent thousands of pounds purchasing a new clock and mechanism. The old clock has been fully refurbished included a full clean and repaint.

The dial (which has always had the potential to be illuminated) has now been restored with energy efficient lighting meaning that it can now shine proudly.

The antique gear mechanism that powers the clock is still in existence and functioning well after being refurbished along with the clock face.

The refurbishment works mean the clock is now much more efficient and attractive whilst still retaining its antique charm. The total bill is less than £2000.





Dedication to Robert Bye Way

After two years of planning I am pleased to announce that a dedication service to mark the renaming of the Warsop inner relief road, the 'Robert Bye Way,' will take place on Sunday 30th July, 2017 at 3pm in the Suretart carpark.

The unveiling will be carried out by the Sheriff of Nottingham, Councillor Glyn Jenkins . After the ceremony, there will be a short service of thanksgiving for Sgt Bye in the Parish Church at 4pm when a plaque will be dedicated to Sgt Bye. We hope both events will be well supported.

When the First World War started in 1914 no one could forsee that the whole world would be sucked i to this conflict. Many young men died, believing they were fighting for 'Honour, Justice, Truth and Right, many never came back and those who did were scarred by their experiences and the horrors of what they had seen.

When I interviewed Mrs Moody back in 2006 for the Chad newspaper, she said her Father was a very modest man who hardly ever talked about his bravery and being awarded the Victoria Cross, so that is why the road is simply named 'Robert Bye Way.' I hope that future generations will see the name and wonder who exactly Robert Bye was and that their curiosity will lead them to research him and learn about the First World War and the sacrifices made.

Seigfred Sassoon who was a poet but also served as Captain in the First World War and was himself decorated for bravery with a military cross wrote the following poem about the Great War.

SQUIRE nagged and bullied till I went to fight, (Under Lord Derby's Scheme). I died in hell-(They called it Passchendaele). My wound was slight. And I was hobbling back; and then a shell Burst slick upon the duck boards: so I fell Into the bottomless mud and lost the light

At sermon-time, while Squire is in his pew, He gives my gilded name a thoughtful stare: For, though low down upon the list, I'm there; 'In proud and glorious memory' ... that's my due. Two bleeding years I fought in France, for Squire: I suffered anguish that he's never guessed. Once I came home on leave: and then went west... What greater glory could a man desire?

My thanks go to Warsop Parish Council for their support in helping get the planing application through and to Mr David Pratt of Mansfield District Council for his work in compiling the report for consideration by the planning committee. Thanks also go to the Warsop and District Royal British Legion group especially Bill Power, Jason Hood and George Murfin for their support and efforts in the planning of the dedication events.

WARSOP

Footpath & **Countryside Group**

There is one type of creature that I have not mentioned in over a decade of writing these notes ... the fairy.



Most of us are aware of the activities of the tooth fairy but there are also indications of other fairies in the local countryside. Firstly, the litter fairy appears to be at work in several parts of the parish clearing up rubbish almost as soon as it is dropped. The bramble fairy is particularly helpful along some of our paths, clipping off any brambles that begin to invade the path. A far rarer example is the Himalayan Balsam fairy whose work I have encountered when removing this invasive plant from riverbanks only to discover that someone (or something) has been there before me! I think we should all be grateful that these 'fairies' who care about our countryside and make Warsop an even better place to live or visit. I suspect there are more of them around than we realise!

Our annual water vole survey along the River Meden between the Mill Dam and Stone Bridge had mixed results this year. We look for their burrows, runs, droppings and the grass they have chewed. We discovered much less evidence of their activity between the Mill Dam and the Carrs bridge than in previous years but there are signs of some recovery between the BMX track and Stone Bridge. Overall, there has been a gradual reduction in the number of indicators of these special animals over the five years that we have been surveying this stretch of the river.

If you see a large bird soaring overhead and assume that it is one of the buzzards that are now regularly seen over Warsop, take a closer look. Red Kites have recently been seen over eastern Warsop so they could become more regular visitors.

As the grass has been growing so quickly the volunteers of Warsop Footpaths Group are now well into the second grass cut of the year along most of the footpaths that we mow. In some years we only mow the paths twice but it looks as if they will need an extra cut this year. Get in touch if you would like to help us with this work.

Our next group walk will be on Saturday 15th July. This will be another of our walks celebrating the anniversary of the Charter of the Forests, focussing on the landscape along the rivers that once formed the Sherwood Forest boundary. We will meet outside Warsop Library at 10am before driving (lifts available) to the starting point of the walk to Conjure Alders where the Meden and the Maun meet. 

Members of the public are calling in to the Town Hall to report incidents to the police, this is not the correct way to report crime.

We need to encourage people to call 101 for non-emergency incidents which will be picked up by the local beat team. If incidents are not reported correctly, then they are not recorded therefore crime stastistics will be incorrect. This in turn will lead to staff being reduced as the demand seems less.

Facebook Advert **Fly Tipper Dumps** Fine on Householder

A Mansfield man, who used someone he found on Facebook to dispose of waste, and a Mansfield woman, who used a scrap man to get rid of her waste, have been landed with criminal records after their waste was found fly tipped.

Barry James, 40, of Portland Street, and Mihaela Munteanu, 30, of the Knoll, were prosecuted by Mansfield District Council in separate cases at Mansfield Magistrates' Court on 25 May 2017.

They were ordered to pay a total of more than £660 after each admitted one charge of failing to comply with her householder's duty of care, contrary to section 34(2A) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

In both cases, the defendants had paid traders to remove waste from their homes but had not taken details of the vehicles used, asked for a receipt or asked to see the operator's waste carrier's licence something that commercial waste disposal operators are obliged to have and carry with them.

The court was told that Barry James's offence related to waste found dumped in Newlands Way, Forest Town, on or before 5 January 2017. It included 12 bags of household waste and a number of items linked to the defendant.

He later told council officers that he had responded to an advert on Facebook and had paid a man £40 in cash to take his waste.

He was fined £80 and ordered to pay compensation of £107.28 to the council for clearing up the waste, prosecution costs of £85 and victim surcharge of £30 - a total £302.28.

Mihaela Munteanu's offence related to a large deposit of household waste, clothing, flooring, compost, underlay and carpet found in Peafield Lane, Mansfield. A number of items were linked to the defendant. She later told council officers that she had paid a scrap man £20 to take her waste.

The magistrates fined her £230 and ordered her to pay costs of £100 $\,$ and victim surcharge of £30 - a total £360.

After the cases, Sarah Troman, Interim Director of Communities, said: "Residents should be really wary of using someone advertising on social media, or elsewhere, to dispose of waste cheaply.

"Always check they have a waste carrier's licence and take their credentials and vehicle details, because if your waste ends up fly tipped, it could be you rather than the fly tipper who has to carry the can for what is a criminal offence."

Failing to pay a £75 Fixed Penalty Notice for dropping litter has cost a Mansfield man more than £600 after Mansfield District Council took him to court.

South Derbyshire Magistrates' Court fined Matis Rubis, aged 25, of Lord Street, £220 and ordered him to pay costs of £353.87 and victim surcharge of £30 – a total £603.87 – for one offence of littering contrary to section 87(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The case was proved in his absence.

The court was told that Rubis was spotted by a council neighbourhood warden dropping a can on a path next to the River Maun near James Murray Mews in the town centre on 9 January 2017 and issued with an FPN (fixed penalty notice) for £75.

The FPN was never paid so the council took further action and issued a court summons against Rubis.

Cllr Bill Drewett, Portfolio Holder for Safer Communities, said after the case: "This case makes two things very clear. If you drop litter in this district, you could be facing a fixed penalty notice. If you ignore that £75 FPN, we will take you to court and that could be much more expensive to you, both in terms of a fine and costs but also because you could acquire a criminal record, too.

"The simple answer is, don't drop litter. There are plenty of bins provided and if there isn't one around, take your litter home.

The Friends of Thynahowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

The results of last year's magnetometer survey of Thynghowe have recently been published by Mercian Archaeological Services CIC.

This report reveals more details of this site on Warsop's eastern boundary which is described as a 'complex of monuments', suggesting that the site is "of great importance not only regionally, and nationally, but potentially internationally".

We now await their report on the 2016 Thynghowe community excavation for more evidence of the origins of this remarkable site. The magnetometry report may be accessed online via the Mercian website on www.mercian-as.co.uk/thynghowesfap.html

Once again we will be attending the Nottinghamshire Local History and Archaeology Festival at the Nottingham University Museum on Saturday 8th July. This free event runs from 12 noon to 4pm, you can drop in or come along for the whole day.

We will be there with our display and we will also be giving a brief talk at the start of the day promoting Sherwood's Viking heritage and describing our latest research into the assembly site of Thynghowe.

Now in its 4th year this successful regional festival and celebration will be displaying the wide and varied work taking place throughout Nottinghamshire by local history and archaeology societies, archaeological units, museums and other regional archaeological organisations.

The festival will include displays, activities, handling of original material and talks. In anticipation of The Vikings exhibition in November 2017 there will also be a wide variety of related activities to participate in, including Viking hairstyles; Viking crafts; face painting; understanding runes; and re-enactments.


