

Warsop's New Bye Way

On 6th February, the planning committee at Mansfield District Council met and approved the application to rename the A60 inner relief road through Warsop from the junction of Surestart to Carr Lane the Robert Bye Way. This is in honour of Warsop's First World War VC hero Sgt. Major Robert Bye.



It will be 100 years ago on 31st July 2017 that Sgt Bye's action at the Tser canal Belguim at the third battle of Ypres, led to him being awarded the Victoria Cross.

The citation for Sgt. Major Bye reads as follows:

For most conspicuous bravery. Sgt. Major Bye displayed the utmost courage and devotion to duty during an attack on the enemy's position. Seeing that the leading waves were being troubled by two enemy blockhouses, he, on his own initiative, rushed at one of them and put the garrison out of action.

He then rejoined his company and went forward to the assault of the second objective. When the troops had gone forward to the attack on the third objective, a party was detailed to clear up a line of blockhouses which had been passed. Sgt. Major Bye volunteered to take charge of this party, accomplished his objective, and took many prisoners.

He subsequently advanced to the third objective, capturing a number of prisoners, thus rendering invaluable assistance to the assaulting companies. He displayed throughout the most remarkable initiative.

"In honouring me you are honouring my comrades out in France for they all did well that day."



The Parish Council have kindly agreed to fund and erect the signposts on Robert Bye Way and there will be a formal unveiling ceremony by Sgt Bye's surviving daughter Mrs Mary Moody at a later date.

About the Victoria Cross

The Victoria Cross is the highest award for gallantry that a British and Commonwealth serviceman can achieve. It originates from the Crimean War which was the first war to be reported by newspaper war correspondents.

Reporter William Howard Russell of The Times reported on the bravery of the common soldier and pushed for a bravery award that could be given in recognition of bravery. Only senior officers at this time were awarded medals for bravery as it was deemed that it was their leadership that drove men on to victory.

The House of Commons took up Russell's idea and parliament decided in, 1854, that the Queen, Victoria, should create a medal: "an order of merit for distinguished and prominent personal gallantry to which every grade and individual from the highest to the lowest may be admissible and this resulted in the Victoria Cross .During the First World War, 634 Victoria Crosses were awarded of which Sgt. Major Bye was one of the recipients.

GARDENING MONTHLY...



General tasks and garden maintenance

Frosts can still be a hazard, so keep vulnerable plants protected at night if frost is forecast. March winds are also notorious for their ferocity so check exposed plants are well supported.

Now is the time for a thorough spring clean; weed and dig over your borders incorporating as much organic matter as you can - those chilly winds will really help to dry out the soil. Mulch bare soil once you have done the work and remove moss and weeds from paths, terraces and driveways. They may be boring tasks but if you don't get on top of the garden now (especially the weeds!) it will be a nightmare for the rest of the season.

Make new beds and borders - mark the shape with sand trickled from a bottle, remove the top layer of growing vegetation and dig the ground over, incorporating as much organic matter as possible. If you are making a bed in the lawn, remove the turf and stack it upside down somewhere out of the way - after a year or two it will rot down into fantastic compost. Alternatively chop it up and bury upside down in the planting hole a good spade's depth down. Beware - if you just dig it in the buried grass will regrow and regrow and...

Clean and repair your garden tools, book the lawn mower in for a service and check garden furniture for any rot. When it is warm enough, treat sheds, fences and trellis with wood preservative: brushes and rollers are fine for most things, however a sprayer is well worth buying for tricky projects such as woven panels!

If it is very wet keep off the lawn as much as possible - damage to waterlogged lawns is easily inflicted and irritatingly hard to rectify. When the weather improves and the lawn has had a chance to dry out, give it a first cut with the blades on the highest setting - don't be tempted if conditions are wet! Reseed bare patches, neaten the edges with a half moon cutter or spade and remove molehills and wormcasts. If you are planning a new lawn, start preparing the ground for seeding or laying turf. Ask for advice in your local garden centre if you are unsure of how to begin.

Trees, shrubs and climbers

Plant and move evergreen shrubs, conifers and trees and remember to water them well until firmly rooted in. Plant evergreen hedges such as laurel, yew and box and again keep them well watered in dry spells. A good soak once a week is better than superficial watering on a regular basis.

Feed woody plants with general purpose fertiliser - this applies to roses, trees, climbers, hedges and shrubs.

Feed acid loving plants such as camellias and rhododendrons with ericaceous feed if you are on neutral or alkaline soil. A dose of sequestered iron also helps prevent the leaves turning yellow. (Tip - mulch regularly with fresh or composted pine needles. This can acidify the ground slightly.)

Finish pruning your roses and start spraying them with fungicide to ward against black spot and mildew. Repeat every fortnight until the autumn. Remember that if an infection sets in, all the stricken leaves must be burnt - do not leave them on the compost heap as this will become the perfect incubation site.

Prune hydrangeas - do not remove stems with a bud at the top, but snip off old stems bearing deadheads to just above the topmost healthy bud and remove weak shoots altogether from the base. With established plants, remove some of the older shoots right down to the base - this will keep the plant compact. The latter also applies to forsythia (prune once it has finished flowering by cutting back flowered shoots down to a new shoot further down - all the new growth this season will flower next year) and to flowering currants (Ribes).

A sign of approaching spring is the appearance of the white flowers on blackthorn hedges.

These blooms appear before the leaves, unlike the hawthorn which will come into flower in several weeks time after the leaf buds have burst open. This is also the month when catkins on willows are at their best although they have been visible for quite a time already this year.



On a warm day at this time of year you may spot one of the butterflies that has hibernated as an adult. The Peacock butterfly is one of those, spending winter in outbuildings, attics or hollow trees . The pale yellow Brimstone is another butterfly that may be seen, usually in woodland. Other hibernating insects include female bumblebees. All the males died off when the cold weather set in but the females hibernate through the winter, carrying the eggs for the next generation. They spend the whole winter without food before finding early flowering plants for a drink of nectar and then locating a suitable place to lay their eggs. Ladybirds are another insect that will soon be emerging from hibernation.

Gorse is a plant that has been flowering around Warsop throughout most of the winter adding welcome colour. There are three UK species of gorse and at any time of the year at least one of them is in flower. This plant provides a fine habitat for some birds and insects but can be very invasive. We have problems on parts of the Hills & Holes where gorse is taking over sections of grassland to the detriment of the wildflowers that make the area so special.

The scrape and stream that has been restored by The Friends of The Carrs has been looking even better now that it is holding more water. This is proving to be a fine habitat and is a credit to the efforts of volunteers who worked on this project. It is unfortunate that continuing issues with the management of the Mill Dam that are beyond the group's control are detracting from their many successes.

As spring approaches our hedge management work should be complete, leaving the hedgerows free for nesting birds. We will probably still be combatting the brambles that are threatening to invade several paths. Come along and join us for a couple of hours on a Thursday morning, full protection equipment is available if you are tempted to attack the more vicious plants! Get in touch for more details. Without this work some popular paths would become impassible by

Mayor Rewards Community Heroes

Eight local heroes - including a 94-year-old Neighbourhood Watch volunteer - have been rewarded for their valuable community work by the Executive Mayor of Mansfield, Kate Allsop.

As part of the Mayor's commitment to recognising people who go the extra mile for their communities, the winners were announced at the full council meeting at the Civic Centre.

They were:

- Members of Forest Town Community Council: Sid Owen, Phyllis Gregson, Jim Gregson and Val Moss;
- Charity fundraisers Jessica Simpkin and John Adkin;
- Community volunteers Philip and Pam Bishop;
- Iris Goodall, of Upper Ladybrook Neighbourhood Watch.

"Iris is well known in the community for helping the police, although she is not afraid to hold them to account, too. As well as her Neighbourhood Watch work, Iris is also well known for supporting local groups and causes in any way she can."

Members of Forest Town Community Council were congratulated for their sterling work which includes organising the neighbourhood's Christmas lights, festive market and fundraising for and organising a Christmas party for 100 elderly residents. It has also staged other community events.

The charity fundraising of Jessica Simpkin, who has been fighting brain tumours since she was a child, was highlighted by local businessman John Adkin, when he contacted the Mayor for help with a world record they were trying to break.

Jess was diagnosed with her first brain tumour when she was four years old and was given a 30% chance of survival. On her 19th birthday, another tumour in her brain was discovered. Now, ten years on, she is being treated for five more in the lining of her brain and her future is uncertain.

Despite her illness, in September last year, 539 Triumph motorbikes

squeezed onto the Marr Route between Nottingham and Southwell Road in Mansfield, to set a new world record for the biggest parade of Triumph bikes.

The event, which was opened by Mayor Allsop, raised about £4,000 for the Children's Brain Tumour Research Centre at the Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham. So far Jess has raised more than £30,000 for the charity.

Philip, who has worked with the Samaritans and been secretary of St Mark's Church in the town for many years, has also organised the toddler group and Christian Aid group, edited and printed the weekly leaflet for church and sings in a local choir.

His wife, Pam, helped start the Mansfield Big Snore project for homelessness charity Framework and organises the St Mark's Church breakfasts. She has already been made an Honorary Canon at Southwell Minster in recognition of her faithful and valuable service to the church. Both she and her husband have also been involved in the Maun Valley Citizens group.

Mayor Allsop said:

"All these community champions are a vital part of the life of Mansfield and their help is priceless in maintaining and improving the quality of life in this district so I am delighted to mark their efforts with my commendation award."

Let Warsop Speak

It's been a few months since we provided an update in Warsop & **District News although members of** our facebook page will be aware of what has been happening.

Stonebridge Planning Application:

We are still waiting to hear when this will be presented to the planning committee. The next possible date is 6th March and we will know around the 24th Feb if it will be this date. We have raised a further complaint about the lack of an Environmental Impact Assessment and we are waiting to hear from Mansfield District Council; if this is rejected then we will appeal directly to the Secretary of State regarding this issue. We have also registered our concerns about the quality of some of the reports submitted by the developers especially for ecology and traffic.

Our planning consultant is continuing to work on our behalf and will be speaking at the planning meeting as one of the objectors to the application. They are also trying to arrange a separate meeting to discuss this between MDC and NCC.

Petition:

After discussion with MDC this has been rejected as they argue that sufficient consultation was done. We will progress this with the Ombudsman. However, it is likely there will be further consultation on the Local Plan later this year.

Carrs' Ward By-Election:

Debra Barlow was a very strong runner up to the Labour candidate who won this seat in November. Thank you to everyone who helped and voted for Debra we certainly made people sit up and notice. The Friends of Thynghowe Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

In the days when wheeled transport was only available to very few privileged people, most folk moved between communities on foot along trackways.

Some of these routes became public roads, bridleways or footpaths but many disappeared following enclosure acts and changes in land ownership.

Over the past few years, The Friends of Thynghowe have been investigating the old trackways through the Forest between Edwinstowe and Warsop. We now believe that we have identified the line of 'Nether Warsop Gate' using old maps, cropmark images and LiDAR data. For part of the way depressions indicate the line through woodlands although along other sections it has disappeared beneath recent forestry plantations and farmland.

There are few surviving traces of another trackway, 'Upper Warsop Gate'. It ran through Birklands passing close to the Black Pool but closer to Warsop its line remains unclear. However, a third track named 'Gleadthorpe Gate' closely follows a modern bridleway along part of the way close to Edwinstowe. Nearer to Warsop, it is a very distinct track through the woodlands but the final section to Gleadthorpe is not yet clear.

These three routes were shown on a 18th century map of Birklands and fourth track named 'Greene Gate' is shown leaving the woodlands near Blakely Hill on an early 17th century map. This could have once joined with Sandy Lane in Warsop. Interestingly the use of the term 'Gate' for roads and paths take us back to the time of the Viking settlers in this area.

Preparations are under way for our Viking Spring Thing re-enactment event at Sherwood Pines over the weekend of 22nd and 23rd April. Put this date in your diary, it is a great event and well worth supporting.



Man Ordered to pay £540 Over **Fly-tipped Waste**

A Mansfield man has been ordered by magistrates to pay £540 in fines and costs for an offence prosecuted by Mansfield **District Council in connection** to fly-tipped waste found in a recreation ground car park.

Jason Hall, of Mapletoft Avenue, admitted a charge of failing to comply with his householder duty of care in respect of waste, contrary to section 34(2A) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Mansfield Magistrates on Friday 27 January imposed a fine of £140 and ordered him to pay a victim surcharge of £30 and

The court was told the offence stemmed from the discovery of a large amount of waste found by a council neighbourhood warden on 21 July 2016 in the car park of Lords Recreation Ground in Slant Lane, Mansfield Woodhouse.

The waste contained documents addressed to Jason Hall, then living in Charles Street, Mansfield, and in an interview, he admitted the waste was his and said he had given it to a scrap dealer to dispose of without checking if the dealer had a waste carrier licence.

After the case, Portfolio Holder for Public Protection Cllr Mick Barton said:

"Time and again people are giving their waste to unlicensed carriers to dispose of and then end up in court because of fly tipping.

"Residents have to understand that they have this duty of care to ensure that any waste from their household is disposed of properly, and this means that when you employ someone to remove waste, that scrap man must have a waste carrier licence.

"To protect yourself from this kind of offence, get a receipt and the address of the trader you are using because if the council finds fly tipped waste, we will prosecute whenever we can.

"Using an unlicensed waste carrier might seem cheaper but it can be a very expensive way to dispose of your waste if a case like this aoes to court."

Over £1800 Awarded to **High Achieving Individuals**

Mansfield District Council has awarded a total of £1850 in grants to six individuals in the Mansfield district in the 2016/17 financial year.

Grant in Aid (GIA) is a discretionary financial contribution awarded by the council to support individuals who contribute to the council's priorities, like for example, regeneration and employment, supporting vulnerable people or protecting the environment.

Grants are given specifically in line with the GIA policy and the financial support is for individuals who excel in sports or the arts. Consideration is given to amateurs whose excellence is of national or international significance and where financial support is required to allow the individual to take part in a national or international event or to achieve that status.

Money awarded to them can be used to cover expenses such as buying equipment, paying for coaching or paying for subs or hire of community space.

The high achievers are aged from just 14 years old and are well on their way to putting Mansfield on the map thanks to their dedication and hard work in their field.

Ethan Davis (aged 14 years)

Ethan is a freestyle skier and is part of the Park and Pipe Academy. He competes in Europe and is currently second place in UK riders within the international circuit.

Luke Walters (aged 18 years)

Luke is a rugby player who plays in the rugby league for Scotland's U19s and won Player of the Year 2015. Last year he was also nominated for Mansfield Sports Personality of

Lee Shepherd (aged 22 years)

Plays golf and attends a golf scholarship in the USA. He competes nationally when back home in competitions throughout the UK and is an international sports person's pass holder.

Alexandra Stenson (aged 22 years)

A former member of Cantamus, she is an opera singer with a very impressive track record in her work with Opera North and English National Opera. She will be going on to study on the Guildhall Artist Masters programme.

Katie Offiler (aged 19 years)

Katie is a drama student who was awarded a place at the prestigious Urdang Academy in London after graduating from Funky Studios, Mansfield.

Jayne Williams (aged 38 years)

Another individual who also benefitted from the council's Grant in Aid contribution as it enabled her to produce a WW1 play called 'The First' and bring it to young audiences in Mansfield.

She is a freelance writer and theatre maker who currently works with The Spark Arts for Children as Writer in Residence. She is also Creative Director for Unanima, an integrated theatre company based at The Old Library Arts Venue on Leeming Street, Mansfield, and has worked with The Palace Theatre and Mansfield Museum for many years on their arts engagement projects.

Portfolio Holder for Resources, Councillor Roger Sutcliffe, said:

"We aim to encourage young people who strive for success and are very pleased to have been able to support them in their achievements so far.

"They act as role models and inspire others to strive for high performance standards. They are ambassadors for the town and are a credit to our district."

Ninety two per cent of passengers are happy with local bus services up from 60 per cent being satisfied with services before the new Mansfield **Bus Station was built.**

Town bus shelters display information posters giving details about local bus services and other nearby facilities, and Mansfield Bus Station offers passengers useful information such as timetables for local bus routes and an electronic journey planning kiosk. Ninety five per cent of passengers rated the provision of information as

The bus station has 16 bays fitted with Real Time information displays, along with a further 14 Real Time information displays at bus stops in the town centre, taking away some of the uncertainties related to bus travel. Eighty six per cent of passengers said they would welcome more real time information displays in the town.

Ninety eight per cent of passengers rate the appearance of the bus station as good or very good in terms of its maintenance and

These figures are taken from Nottinghamshire County Council's annual passenger survey in Mansfield, measuring performance and satisfaction with bus services and facilities.

New or refurbished bus stops or bus shelters, work to highways, the installation of bus lanes and the relocation of the bus station have together improved punctuality across the network, improving travel times for passengers.

In addition, further investment has seen several bus services upgraded, with services from Mansfield to Nottingham providing superfast Wi Fi as standard, further enhancing passengers' travel

Kate Allsop, Executive Mayor at Mansfield District Council, says:

"The investment in bus services is great news for the people of Mansfield. Bus travel is a key part of local people's day to day activities, whether it's travelling to work, school or college, heading into town, going shopping, visiting family and friends or just enjoying the district's parks and open spaces.

Council Remembers Holocaust


Mansfield District Council marked Holocaust Memorial Day with a short ceremony at the Civic Centre.




