

Plea to Reach **Knitted Poppy Display Target**

A further 4,000 knitted and crocheted poppies are needed to help create an extra-special Remembrance Sunday display in Mansfield Town Centre.

More than 6,000 poppies have been knitted this year, which will be added to the 8.000 that were made by hundreds of local volunteers for last year's display on the front of the Old Town Hall.

Mansfield District Council is appealing for more people to get involved to help reach the target of 18,000 to help mark the centenary of the end of the First World War.

Poppy decorations will also adorn part of the route for the Remembrance Day parade involving various community groups, which will start with a wreath laying ceremony at the Civic Centre war memorial at 10am before heading to St Peter's Church for a memorial service at 10.55am, and then continuing after the service to the Market Palace at noon where there will be a military salute. It will be followed by a veterans' 1940s tea dance. A wreath will also be laid at Carr Bank Park at 1.15pm.

Deputy Mayor of Mansfield Cllr Mick Barton, who has been spearheading the council's poppy appeal, said:

"This year is an extra special Remembrance Sunday, marking a centenary to the day since peace was declared after four terrible years of war.

"We aim to reflect that in Mansfield with what will be a magnificent display and in order to make that display really spectacular, we still need your poppies. It is not too late to get involved so please get knitting - even if you make just ten poppies, it will help."

The council will then be offering people the chance to help attach the poppies to the camouflage nets in the Market Place in the week beginning 22 October. People can also come along and write messages on a commemoration board at the same time, and donate a pound or two to the Royal British Legion's poppy appeal.

The displays will be installed during the week prior to Remembrance Sunday on 11 November.

GARDENING MONTHLY...



General tasks and garden maintenance

Tidy borders

Cut down herbaceous stems and clear the tatty remains of annuals, but do leave a little cover of the perennials that fade relatively elegantly (sedum, astilbes and grasses for example).

They will provide winter interest as well as some much needed wildlife shelter ladybirds especially appreciate winter quarters and will repay your hospitality by disposing of aphids in industrial quantities next year. Leaving sodden debris and fallen aves around plants will only encourage pests and disease.

Clean out the greenhouse

Clear out the greenhouse, wash pots and trays, clean, mend and oil your tools and throw away anything that is beyond hope or reasonable repair! Cleaning your greenhouse thoroughly will prevent pests from hibernating and leaping into action next spring. Wash the windows inside and out to allow maximum light in over the winter and scrub benches, fixtures and glazing bars with disinfectant, making sure you hose the whole place down really well, especially dark and dusty corners.

For really effective pest elimination, fumigation is the ticket. Move all plants outside, shut the windows, light a sulphur candle in the middle of the floor, (retreat at speed!), shut the door and wait until the smoke and fumes have completely dispersed several hours later. Your greenhouse should now be delightfully pest free!

Drain and lag...

Save yourself untold irritation and expense by draining and lagging standpipes, outdoor taps, irrigation lines and water pumps in advance of sudden hard frosts.

Prepare your soil for next year

For beds that lie bare in winter, carry on with the winter digging until the soil is too hard - use compost, manure, leaf mould - in fact as much organic matter as you can lay your hands on to replace the goodness in it. It can be left in a pretty rough state over the winter when the elements will break the clods down, making spring planting

For text book soil improvement, you should add a layer of organic matter and dig it in by turning over spadefuls so it is buried below the surface. If this seems too much like hard work, just mulch the bed and leave the rest to the worms! If your soil is thin or heavy clay, just fork it over now; too much digging on the former will bring up infertile matter from below whilst great chunks of wet clay will remain rock solid over the winter and become nigh on impossible to break up next year.

Planting

Plant bare-rooted trees, shrubs, hedging and roses as well as fruit trees and bushes (see later). Soak the roots in a bucket of water for an hour first and protect against frost and wind if exposed.

Rake fallen leaves

Fallen leaves prevent light and air getting to plants and lawns and these dark, damp conditions are also heaven on earth for slugs, snails and an unwholesome array of fungal diseases. However, don't waste these tumbled treasures - given time they will decompose into fabulously rich leaf mould - aka 'nature's soil conditioner of choice'! Rake them up and throw into a simple frame made of chicken wire or wood. Failing that, black bin liners spiked with air holes will do if you can bear the sight, but remember to dampen the leaves first should they be dry (some hope!). Leaf mould takes about a year to mature (2 in the case of oak leaves), makes a great top dressing for woodland plants such as rhododendrons and is an excellent and FREE home grown substitute for peat. Don't be tempted to use rose leaves, which can easily carry infection, or evergreens, which take too long to rot down.

Rule one - keep off the lawn when it is sodden or frozen - a startling degree of damage is remarkably easily inflicted.

Rake up fallen leaves regularly - left in place they will encourage fungal disease and bare patches and make your final cut when the grass is reasonably dry with the blades

Scarify and spike to improve surface drainage and aeration and apply autumn feed and moss killer if you didn't do it last month.

New turf can be laid, weather permitting, and if you are planning to sow or lay a new lawn next spring, there is still time to prepare the ground so it is in tip top condition.

Book your mower in for servicing - leaving it until spring just places your machine firmly at the back of a long queue!

Birds

Winter is tough for birds - as temperatures fall, regular supplies of food and fresh water become ever more important to help them survive the cold months and emerge in good condition for the breeding season next year.

Do make sure clean water is available, especially in freezing conditions. Buy good $\,$ quality bird food and fat or suet balls, ensure feeding stations are well out of the way of cats and enjoy the company of our feathered friends throughout the winter!

FIGHT FOR A FRACK FREE WARSO



Will you fight to protect our countryside?

Pictured above is The Lings, a beautiful location on the edge of Warsop Parish boundary and Sherwood Forest, close to the Thynghowe Viking Assembly site, steeped in history and rural farming activities.

Any housing developer would pay a premium for views like this. This is, however, one of several sites looked at by lneos as a possible location for exploratory drill rigs (information obtained through Freedom of Information). Where we see beauty and heritage, they see profit through industrialization.



This is the view from The Lings, looking towards Cuckney Hill.



If an exploratory drill pad was constructed, this is the view that the frackers would have. We, however, would find our view transformed into this:

A lot of people feel very strongly that our environment and the public should be protected against the onslaught of the shale gas industry; the risks it would bring have been mentioned here many

It does pose the question, why should we have to fight our own government in order to protect the air that we breathe and the water that we drink from those who would damage it?

Fracking was mentioned at several of the recent Conservative Party conference fringe events: Lee Rowley, Conservative MP for North East Derbyshire, warned that the government could lose the next general election and parliamentary seats unless it drops its backing for fracking. Mr Rowley, a former oil and gas analyst, echoes rumblings on the Conservative backbench of rebellion against the government's policies on fracking, with the Permitted Development and Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) consultation plans to remove local democracy from fracking planning applications, drawing objections from councils and MPs across the country.

One of the reasons the government is looking at making shale gas extraction a NSIP is because of the sheer scale of industrialisation it will bring. We are not just talking about the odd drill site nestling into a local field; the intention is to have as many as is needed to make the industry commercially viable; Lee Rowley in his abovementioned speech talked about 6000-10,000 wells, each site requiring ancillary equipment, compressor stations, pipelines, HGV servicing, etc. This would mean creating a gas field to resemble those in the USA, but without the same vast tracts of land with low population:

Thankfully, our own local authorities, after protest from the public, are objecting to these government proposals which will effectively make planning law easier for the fracking industry. Making exploratory drill sites "permitted development" and part of the NSIP regime will take away our right to object at planning application stage but this blatant attack on democracy is being opposed by Warsop Parish Council, Mansfield District Council and, at its full council meeting in September, Notts County Council, by a vote of 29-1. All three councils intend to submit responses to the government consultation to oppose the changes.

Our MP, Ben Bradley, stated his opposition to the proposals on his

"I wanted to raise my objection to proposals that could see elements of fracking become "permitted development". I think taking away opportunities for local people to have a say would be bad for people's trust in Government and risk giving the companies involved too much power. We'll be working to make this case to Government over the coming months."

This is a positive step for democracy and we hope that the impetus of these objections will change the government's thinking on this issue. The government consultation ended on 25 October, 2018.



Proposed Closure of Meden Vale Surgery

Background to the engagement

The practice operates over two sites, The Medical Centre in Meden Vale and in the Primary Care Centre Warsop with a patient population of around 6135.

In July 2018 Meden Medical Services made the decision to apply to Mansfield and Ashfield Clinical Commissioning Group for permission to engage with patients regarding a proposal to close the surgery at Meden Vale. This can be done without losing any appointments or services and future proof the practice in the long term.

The rationale for the proposal was to:

The current rental lease is due to expire on 31/12/18. Therefore the practice has been reviewing the provision of core services and has concluded that it does not have sustainable capacity to make commitments of an equitable service.

The practice has been considering the future at this site for over a year, reducing sessions over time as servicing the site has become more difficult for the practice, threatening our ability to remain sustainable over two sites.

Previously the practice had 3 salaried GP's and Dr Allen the

Unfortunately Dr Rubio resigned to move to Spain in December 2016, Dr McCormick retired in June 2016 and Dr Baglee resigned to take up a position nearer to her home in October 2017.

The practice has been unable to recruit either salaried GP's or Partners. This has left Dr Allen as the sole GP to lead the clinical team. Although the practice have excellent regular locum GP's. Dr Allen cannot provide the necessary leadership required whilst working across 2 sites.

Therefore the closure will benefit the medical staff and patients at the practice as they will have a wider pool of clinical knowledge/experience and support at one site.

The surgery at Meden Vale falls short of service standards and compliance. The building is getting older and needs considerable investment to bring it up to the standard of the Warsop Primary Care Centre. Therefore the a level of investment required outweighs the benefits.

We believe that the move to one site will put patient services at the heart of local community and offer an integrated one stop shop.

Additionally the proposed closure will help the practice to grow and expand the services that we are able to offer locally. We intend to work with local commissioners to provide additional services as and when they become available. We believe this will help with GP recruitment i.e. multi skilled staff at one site which is fit for purpose and future expansion.

The premise at Warsop is shared with another practice and offers outreach services from Kings Mill Hospital. We believe this will enhance collaborative working by creating a central hub.

Please check any bonfires for any hedgehogs that may have decided that a pile of wood is a great place to spend the winter.



Since the start of this century hedgehog populations in the countryside have fallen by more than a half and in urban areas they are down by about a third. I am aware that hedgehogs are still around in several parts of Warsop although they no longer regularly visit my garden. In rural areas, hedgehogs live along woodland edges and hedgerows in meadowland and rough pasture. In towns, they make use of gardens and green spaces. Between November and the end of March, when food is scarce, hedgehogs hibernate to conserve energy, remaining largely inactive. During the rest of the year they are mostly nocturnal.

The decline in rural populations is due to larger fields and the loss of hedges and copses. This has resulted in fewer nesting sites and less protection for hedgehogs. The scarcity of food such as earthworms and slugs in agricultural soils has also contributed to the decline. Additionally, it has been estimated that around 100,000 hedgehogs are killed annually on the roads, particularly on rural roads where higher speed limits and reduced lighting means drivers are less able to spot wildlife. This makes the urban population vital to the survival of hedgehogs in this country. We can help by linking our gardens with 'Hedgehog Highway' gaps in the bottom of fences, by creating more wild areas with log piles in gardens and by having hedgehog houses and feeding stations in our gardens.

The grass area in the centre of Church Warsop Doorstep Green has been mown for the first time in several years by the new land managers. As the cut material contained lot of scrubby plants the arisings were not removed. It will be interesting to see how many wildflowers appear next spring. When the green was first established there was a fine display but a lack of maintenance has allowed the coarser grasses to dominate. The mowing also revealed a few years worth of litter but between the Footpaths Group and the Future Greens project we have removed several sacks of litter. The wildflower meadow on the Carrs Local Wildlife Site has also received its autumn cut and bale. This summer's weather resulted in a disappointing number of wildflowers compared with previous years but hopefully enough will have seeded to give an improved display in 2019.

Now that grass cutting is complete for another year our volunteer work sessions will focus on clearance work on local wildlife sites before we move onto hedgerow management once the fruits have been consumed by the birds. New volunteers are welcome to join us on a Thursday morning or you may contact us for details of the 'Future Greens' project that may provide conservation and training opportunities in Warsop at other times.

Our next group walk is scheduled for Saturday 17th November. At this time of year, we usually wander around local woodlands enjoying the late autumn colours. We meet at 10am outside Warsop Library and either walk from there or travel to a starting point by car. More details nearer the time on our Facebook page or by contacting us by phone.

Mansfield's First Mamba Seminar a Success

More than 50 people from a variety of organisations attended a seminar to hear what Mansfield is doing to tackle Mamba and to share their own experiences and ideas.

Mansfield District Council, in conjunction with Bassetlaw District Council, hosted a learning workshop - 'Mamba and our towns: what is working and where are the gaps? - at Mansfield Civic Centre yesterday (4 October). Following its great success, there are plans for other similar events in the future.

The seminar attracted representatives from various agencies including the Police, NHS, Framework, Change Grow Live (CGL), plus representatives from Leeds City Council's street outreach team.

The aim of the event was to share experiences and ideas on how to tackle the issue. There were presentations on outreach work, police enforcement and the challenges faced including the high level of mental health issues among the street community.



MP Aims to Raise Profile of Mansfield Community Hospital

The Member of Parliament for Mansfield and Warsop, Ben Bradley, invited the Chief Secretary to the **Treasury Liz Truss to Mansfield Community Centre.**

Cllr Bill Drewett, Portfolio Holder for Safer Communities at Mansfield District Council, said:

"It was very useful to hear other experiences and was extremely reassuring to know that here in Mansfield we are doing everything we possibly can.

"We are focusing on the individuals and offering them all the help and support possible to help them turn their lives around, alongside a strong police response to ensure enforcement action is taken where needed.

"It was acknowledged that this is a complex problem that requires joined-up commitment not just from councils and their community safety and outreach teams but also from public health and clinical commissioning groups (CCGs – which are part of the NHS).

"We need to keep working together and learning from each other to ensure we continue to make good progress tackling this national issue." Inspector Nick Butler of Nottinghamshire Police, said:

Autumn Get Together will be held at Sherwood Pines, starting at 10am. We will focus on the archaeology in the woodlands of Sherwood Pines connected to the training of soldiers based at Clipstone Camp. We are holding a walk around the forest on Saturday 1st December visiting sites that tell the story of the impact of the Dukes of Newcastle upon Tyne and Portland on the local woodlands. We will see evidence of their changes to the forest for pleasure and profit by telling the stories of sites including the Russian Log Cabin, the cross marking St Edwin's Chapel, the 19th century plantations and the rides through the woods. Meet at 10am at the Warsop Windmill forest barrier. This walk will take about 3 or 4 hours, wear appropriate footwear and clothing for winter in a forest and bring a hot drink!



How Helen Became Mansfield's First Five Star Tattoo Artist

A tattoo studio in Mansfield has become the first in the area to be registered with a new county-wide registration scheme - and has achieved the top rating of five stars.

Helen Molloy has been a tattoo artist for two years and has been running her own business, Trinity Ink, from her home in Eakring Road for the past three months.

She said: "I feel that the star rating gives the customer a better opportunity to make an informed decision about where they would like to be tattooed. I decided to apply because I thought it was important to set a high standard when it comes to cleanliness, hygiene and safety, due to it being a home studio.

"In the past home studios have been frowned upon but by setting high standards, I feel that clients can feel reassured when they visit. No customer should have health concerns when getting a tattoo."

Other businesses that use needles and blades are being urged to sign up to the Nottinghamshire Hygiene Accreditation Scheme which is being co-ordinated by local authorities across the county who are responsible for licensing tattoo, body piercing and beauty treatment businesses.

The voluntary scheme aims to improve hygiene and safety standards and is part of a wider strategy by Mansfield District Council to make the district a safer place to live, work and visit and improve the wellbeing of its citizens.

It supplements the inspections of tattoo studios which are carried out by the council as part of the required licensing process for these types of businesses to ensure a mimimum standard of hygiene is achieved.

Operating in a similar way to the national food hygiene scheme for restaurants, the scheme costs £120 to join and for the initial inspection, and £60 for a re-inspection and re-rating.

The process last month of becoming rated took Helen about two weeks from application to being accredited.

"The inspection itself took about an hour and was really informative," she said. "Even though I got five stars I learned a lot about other techniques and practices which I found very helpful.

"I was a bit nervous as this was my first business and I really wanted to break the stigma that surrounds home studios. I am very pleased to

Have You Completed Your Household Enquiry Form?

Residents in Mansfield district are being urged to make sure they can vote at future elections by ensuring they are on the electoral register.

People who have not returned the Household Enquiry Form that was sent to every house in July, or responded to reminders will soon be visited at home by a canvasser.

The canvassers, who carry official Mansfield District Council identification, will not ask to enter residents' properties and will assist householders to complete the form on the doorstep. Some canvassers will be using portable electronic devices to collect

The aim of the form is to ensure that the electoral register is up to date and to identify any residents who are not registered so that they can be encouraged to do so.

The easiest thing to do is respond to the original form or a reminder online, by telephone or by post, using the pre-paid reply envelope. It is especially relevant for people who may have moved home in the past year.

Completing the Household Enquiry Form is a legal requirement and failure to do so could result in a £1,000 fine.

With Mayoral, District and Parish elections due to take place in Mansfield in May 2019, this is an opportunity for residents to make sure they will be able to vote.

Hayley Barsby, Electoral Registration Officer at Mansfield District Council, said:

"I would encourage everyone to register to vote to ensure that you are able to have your say at future elections. To do this, simply check the form and respond as quickly as possible".




