Our two biggest events of the year are happening soon. It would be good to see lots of Warsop folk coming along.

#### St George's Day 'Thing' assembly

Each year we 'beat the bounds' of Warsop Parish as we walk to Hanger Hill on the Saturday closest to St George's Day.

The account of the 1816 Warsop perambulation describes how "according to ancient custom" bread, cheese and ale was consumed on the hill. In our modern version we also mark the site's Viking association (its old name was Thynghowe) by holding a 'Thing' assembly. This year the walk will be held on Saturday 25th April.

We will meet at Warsop Windmill forest barrier at 10am (parking is available) and the guided walk through Birklands Forest to Thynghowe will visit historic features along the route to Thynghowe. This walk is a steady 3 to 4 miles, taking around 4 hours. If you bring a cheese sandwich there may be some ale available to keep the "ancient custom" alive!



#### **Regia Anglorum**

Over the weekend of 2nd and 3rd May you will be able to experience life in Sherwood during the Viking Age as the brilliant re-enactors of Regia Anglorum return to Sherwood Pines with their living history camp and superb warrior action in the arena. This is one of the largest re-enactment events of the year with warriors from many countries participating. The opportunity to chat with the experts about their authentic craft skills on display in the camp is a highlight.

The action takes place between 10am and 4pm each day with a major battle usually taking place in the afternoon. This is a FREE event although standard Forestry England parking charges apply. A great family day out!

# Report Highlights Wellbeing Priorities for Warsop

Warsop Parish Council is working as a strategic partner in the recent research into leisure provision in Warsop. The Living Well in Warsop study, funded by Sport England and Mansfield District Council, was conducted last year by sports and leisure consultants Strategic Leisure Ltd on behalf of the council, working in partnership with Warsop Parish Council, Vibrant Warsop and Active Notts.

The report reviewed community sports and leisure provision and suggests improvements that could lead to the right mix of activities, services and facilities to meet the community's needs.

It recommends investment in people, programmes, projects and places and puts the community at the heart of decisions about future investment. The district council and its partners will now look at the recommendations and do further work to ensure any plans are achievable and sustainable.

The study's report identified the key issues preventing people from being more active. They include a need to improve awareness of what activities are currently available, and recognition that they do not always meet local need.

There were also issues with the quality of available facilities and a lack of a joined-up approach to provision. Residents also expressed problems accessing activities due to travel issues, cost, time and not wanting to take part on their own.

Among the priority areas it identified are:

- The need to identify additional resources to enable community groups to proactively support the development of activities
- Improving access to current facilities
- Improving awareness of current activities and facilities
- Exploring the possibility for further development of activity programmes and potentially a free community bus service to other facilities and swimming pools.
- Potential work on a range of facility developments.

Cllr Amanda Fisher, Portfolio Holder for Communities and Wellbeing, said:

"This important piece of work identifies some key challenges, which, along with our partners, we are determined to address.

"Improving the wellbeing of residents is one the council's key priorities and we want people across the whole of the district to live longer and healthier lives by promoting opportunities to be physically active.

"In Warsop, there are high rates of long-term illness, disability and mental health issues, as well as problems with obesity among both adults and children, so it is important that we try to encourage more people to be more active.

"It is clear from the report that there is a widely held view that Warsop has been forgotten and let down. There is a considerable amount of trust to rebuild and we aim to work closely with the community.

"This is not about the council imposing solutions but about working with partners and helping the community to be actively involved in making improvements.

"Any plan has to be achievable and sustainable. Simply building new facilities will not necessarily deliver what the community needs. This is as much about changing hearts, minds and lifestyles.

"It is not that there are no leisure activities in the area but there needs to be a more joined-up approach between all partners. Vibrant Warsop will play a pivotal role so it will be important to support this organisation and other local providers.

"We need to ensure that more people know what is available in Warsop and surrounding villages and that the activities and facilities are accessible. The lack of and cost of public transport was identified as a particular issue in Warsop where nearly one in four people has no private means of transport, so trying to find ways of addressing this will be a priority."

Andy Burgin, Chair of Warsop Parish Council, said:

"We look forward to working together with all the partners and leisure providers in Warsop to help ensure the people of this parish can enjoy and access a variety of leisure opportunities.

"Warsop has tremendous community spirit and I am confident we can all pull together to make real improvements."

Maddy Pritchard, of Vibrant Warsop, said:

"This report sets out really clearly what we all need to focus on to improve leisure provision in Warsop and our organisation welcomes being a central part of how we move plans forward.

"We believe Warsop is already a fantastic community with lots going on and it can be even more brilliant if everyone works together with a united approach."

Ilana Freestone, Chief Executive of Active Notts, said:

"We are delighted to be working closely with Mansfield District Council and specifically as part of the Warsop project.

"We believe physical activity levels will improve if we listen to what people in our communities are telling us and respond by working together across the whole system of services to support what is needed at a local level, and this work is a great example of that."

#### **GARDENING UPDATE**



### Top tips to help you get the best from your spring garden and prepare for the coming season.

After being cooped up all winter most of us can't wait to get outside and start pottering in the garden. With spring bulbs flowering, days lengthening and lambs in the fields, it's time to get out and prepare for the glorious summer ahead. There are lots of little jobs to keep us busy, even if the weather isn't brilliant, says Angela Slater from Hayes Garden World.

#### The flower garden:

This is the time woodland gardens come into their own so if you have an area under deciduous trees or shrubs, why not inject ground colour with hellebores, primroses, winter aconites or wood anemones?

Mulching herbaceous beds can save a lot of time and water by cutting down on the backbreaking job of weeding and watering. Spread a thick layer of coco bark mulch, home-made compost or well-rotted leaf mould to a thickness of about 3 inches. Don't do this if the ground is still frozen.

If you forgot to plant spring bulbs in autumn, there are plenty of pot grown species available in garden centres to inject some instant colour into borders and containers.

Summer flowering bulbs are also in garden centres so pot them up in good quality, peat-free compost and place in cool, bright, frost-free areas. Sink the pots in the border once the weather gets warmer and you know where you have gaps.

Set dahlia tubers in trays of damp compost to shoot, then cut off when about four inches long and place three round the edge of a six inch pot to grow on.

Small herbaceous perennials become available in garden centres now so buy while they are better value; later in the season they will be larger and more expensive. Either plant in the garden if the soil has warmed up sufficiently or pot on in larger pots.

Lots of bedding plants are available now so brighten up your spring pots and hanging baskets.

Sow sweet pea seed and leave somewhere bright and frost-free; use dedicated sweet pea modules or the cardboard middle out of toilet rolls.

If you have gaps in the herbaceous border and are lacking some colour, camellias, azaleas and rhododendrons are all early bloomers. They need an acid soil: if you garden with alkaline soil, grow them in containers using ericaceous compost.

#### The vegetable garden:

Set potatoes to chit and sow First Earlies about the end of March, weather permitting. Sow chilli seeds and place in a heated propagator; they need as long a growing season as possible.

Dig over the veg plot ready to start planting as soon as the soil warms; place fleece tunnels over the soil to warm it faster.

#### Lawn care:

Rake out any moss and scatter some seed mixed with seed compost if there are any bald patches.

If the grass has started to grow, give it a light trim with the mower set on the highest setting. Give an all-in-one weed, feed and moss killer.

#### Indoors:

Start giving houseplants more water and a weak feed.

Sow salad leaves and micro herbs in trays of seed compost and place on a warm, bright windowsill.

Bring some colour into the home with planted containers of spring bulbs and azaleas. Position them somewhere cool and light and keep just damp: too warm and they will quickly go over.

#### Odd jobs:

If you didn't do so in autumn, scrub out the greenhouse with a solution of Jeyes fluid or bleach, paying particular attention to the glass frames where over-wintering bugs hide. Clean the glass and leave the door open to dry thoroughly.

Scrub greenhouse staging, pots and seed trays.

Peruse the seeds in garden centres and plan your vegetable garden and cut flower plot.

After all that hard work, a visit to some spring gardens open to the public is a great way to get inspiration and indulge in tea and scones.

### THE FIGHT FOR A FRACK FREE WA Spring into Action!!

### Spring is fast approaching and we welcome the lengthening days, as spring flowers come into bloom and the season unfolds.

Spring gives us a natural opportunity to make a really positive impact on nature and biodiversity by planting pollinator-friendly plants and re-wilding where we can, to give nature a helping hand.

Sadly, nature needs that helping hand badly. We are now watching our impacts on nature come to fruition, as the scientific predictions of rising global temperatures becoming our reality. Melting polar ice caps and storm/drought/floods have increased in severity and incidence. In the UK, we have seen moor fires in February; torrential rains and flooding followed by one of the hottest summers ever.

As we celebrated the New Year, we also watched Australia burn from bush fires, after it hit its highest temperature ever recorded of 49.7C, and with reports of 500 million animal deaths in New South Wales alone and an estimated billion in total, huge areas of bush eco systems were destroyed.



The science is more than 95% sure that the increased CO2 levels are the result of human activity. Fracking is but one symptom of the disease of human impact on natural global systems. Science's warning of what is now unfolding has been around for decades and still the governments of the world seem to do very little. Pollution, agricultural techniques, food systems, our very way of life is pushing our existence on this world towards the cliff edge.

#### What difference can we, here in Warsop, make on issues of such global significance?

Yes, the big changes need drastic and decisive action by the world's governments, but the longest journeys start with small steps. Don't be disheartened, thinking there is nothing you can do that will make any difference.

Over the last few years, Frack Free Warsop has campaigned and raised awareness of the pollution threats to our beautiful local natural areas, and to our community, from new fossil fuel development plans - news of the moratorium on fracking was

At a time of climate crisis, we were also heartened when our campaigning helped along decisions by local councillors at both District and Parish level to declare a climate emergency, and the decision by our local MP, Ben Bradley, to join the anti-fracking lobby

If just a few of us can achieve these results, just think what we could achieve as a community joining together.

We encourage you to help in campaigning for climate and community action:

- · An end to fossil fuel exploration and reducing our demand in order to meet our climate targets
- · Ensuring Climate Emergency declarations are followed by appropriate action
- Energy saving and local renewable energy generation
- Stronger environmental regulations to protect biodiversity and the health of our countryside
- Better public transport, cycle ways and walkways to encourage us to leave our cars at home; more car-free zones

We can each help by taking our own direct action and joining in with:

- · Projects to increase our tree cover, protect our hedgerows
- Reducing use of pesticides, herbicides and fungicides that are decimating wildlife
- Re-wilding as many areas as possible including spaces in our gardens, road verges where appropriate and planting with bees and other pollinators in mind
- · Reducing our demand for plastic, especially single use; increase recycling
- · Reducing waste and littering
- Shopping locally, ethically and reducing our overall consumption
- Protecting our local waterways and natural wildlife ecosystems from vandalism and littering
- Leaving our cars at home wherever possible, walk the kids to school; walk to the local shops

There are probably as many ideas for how we can improve our surroundings and community climate resilience as there are people in Warsop District – we would love to share those ideas and encourage our community to put them into practise.

We have some amazing citizens already, who spring into action regularly, collecting litter as they dog-walk, fishing vandalized park benches out of the river and litter-picking our river banks. We are lucky to have a few devoted citizens who run volunteer groups keeping our local natural spaces tended – we applaud you all for your community spirit! There is so much that needs to be done to give our countryside, and our future, a fighting chance; all it needs is more people to spring into action!

FFW have found that we cannot do everything we hope to do alone, so have joined forces with Edwinstowe anti-fracking group and Friends of the Earth. We are now fully licenced as Sherwood Forest Friends of the Earth Local Group.

#### Will you join us?

Can you bring your ideas and your hopes to our next meeting and help us to make our future brighter, by **springing into action** today?

We are planning an informal event on Saturday, 28 March at the Age Concern building on High Street, 10am till 12 noon. We will be planting the display area outside with pollinator-friendly plants and will have lots of information on display. There will be a sunflower-growing competition – biggest flower head at the end of the season, grown organically please, will win a prize.



All flower heads grown are entirely re-usable/compostable, of course - seeds can be eaten, used for planting next year or hung out to feed the wild birds through autumn!

Drinks and biscuits will be available, so why not pop in, have a chat and look at the info, pick up some seeds, spend some time in the garden or potting about, and be a pollinator creator!

### FRACKING UPDATE

A report last October by the National Audit Office public spending watchdog, brought criticism of government plans for shale gas industry development, finding:

- Fracking sites could become a permanent blot on the landscape because of weak decommissioning rules, with unclear and untested arrangements
- Government claims that fracking will yield economic benefits called into question, finding no evidence that prices would
- Costs to public bodies of at least £32.7 million since 2011 including in policies and planning applications, with strains on local authorities in fracking areas
- Uncertainty as to whether the industry could viably produce gas in meaningful quantities
- Serial breaches of agreed limits on earth tremors

In November, with public support for fracking at an all-time low, the Government brought in a moratorium on fracking. Widely criticized as an election stunt, it was imposed because "it is not possible with current technology to accurately predict the probability of tremors associated with fracking".

#### The moratorium was also criticized because:

- It is only a temporary pause and will be easy to reverse, when "compelling new evidence is provided
- It only covers some fracking operations and not others,

Matrix acid stimulation is not included in the moratorium, a form of fracking where rock is dissolved by acid rather than fractured under hydraulic pressure. The British Geological Survey says that Surrey, where this method is being used, is now one of the UK's earthquake hot spots.

#### The drill sites nearest to us have so far not been affected by the moratorium:

- Ineos have recently posted protest Injunction notices around its Woodsetts site, near Worksop. The government have announced that a decision on Ineos' appeal against the local council's refusal of planning permission is to be decided by the Secretary of State by 8 April 2020.
- After planning permission was given to Ineos for exploratory drilling at Harthill, the company says the moratorium has no effect as they are not fracking! They are pushing ahead, having fenced the site and are dealing with amendments to the traffic management plan.

Government response to the consultation on permitted development rights for shale gas exploratory drilling was also published just days after the moratorium. Although these proposals are not being taken forward right now, it has left the door open to fast-tracking shale gas, stating:

"There could be considerable merit in taking forward these proposals in the future"

Legislation needs to be passed so that the ban is made permanent – time is running out to avoid catastrophic climate change and we need to leave fossil fuels in the ground. The government also needs to accelerate the transition to a zero carbon economy by ending all support for fossil fuel development both at home and abroad and throw its full weight behind the development of the UK's vast renewable

In just 6 years, the UK upped its renewable electricity output from 7% to 25% and Scotland expects to generate enough renewable energy to power all its electricity needs by the end of 2020. Isn't this where government policy and investment

The fight against fracking is not over yet!



# I hope you all took advantage of the 2 bags of side waste I arranged for Mansfield District Council to collect with your green bin after Christmas.

This is always the time of year that households produce more waste and I wanted to help you dispose of this with your kerbside waste collection and also that as many of you as possible arranged a free bulky waste collection in February, all of this is part of the Be Tidy Together campaign. International Clean Up Mansfield Day is next on Friday 5th June, every year many residents, schools, businesses and community groups join the efforts to keep our district clean. This year the first 40 groups that sign up will receive a compost bin.

As I'm sure you will be aware kerbside glass collections will be starting over the next few months, by the end of May you will have received a new wheelie bin unless you have opted out of this free service. Collections will be every 8 weeks and will be highlighted on the schedule stuck on the inside of the lid of your new bin, you can also sign up to free email reminder service at:

**Netherfield Ward Update** 

## Firstly I would like to give an update on a couple of the contentious issues on the Ward.

1) The proposed Gypsy Traveller Site at the Old Village Hall Site. This site has Outline Planning for housing which was granted early December. A delegated decision was due to be taken on four sites to be put forward, however one of the 4 sites included, what is currently an Allotment site. It was decided to remove this from the site allocation due to their being a waiting list for allotments in the area and also it conflicted with the councils Adopted Allotment Strategy.

A further two sites are now subject to a 6 week consultation period and a decision will be taken as to which of these 2 sites will be put forward along with the 3 already identified sites.

The site at Meden Vale is not one of those 3 sites.

2) The Smells allegedly coming from the Bio Gas Development on the Old Colliery Site. I have been in touch with every department to try to establish who is responsible for the investigation process as to where the smell comes from.

The smell is now being investigated by the Environment Agency to ascertain where and what the problem is.

It was the Environment Agency who issued the Permit and therefore their responsibility to investigate any complaints. Thanks to everyone who rang the Environment Agency to put in a complaint on this issue. I will be getting updates from them on progress which I will pass on to everyone on as I get them.

### Did you know Meden Vale Rugby Club will be 40 years old this year.

I am proud to say I played in the first game the Club took part in and I have rekindled my enthusiasm for supporting the Club. I watched them get through to yet another cup final with the demolishing of Keyworth RFC on Saturday by 43 points to nil.

### **Meden Gets Creative**

I had the pleasure of working for the first time with Vibrant Warsop, co-ordinating three creative arts taster days at Meden school in December for over two hundred and fifty pupils.



Pupils involved in the project included: Oliver Simpson, Ellie Flear, Sophie Delgado, Keelie Thomason, Lana Watson, Annabella Ballinger, Katie Evans, Josh Wilkinson.



The project was funded jointly by the Jones 1986 and Thomas Farr Charitable Trusts and it gave the pupils an opportunity to work with professional arts practitioners in the fields of music, art, drama, and dance. Through the sessions pupils discovered hidden talents and interests and they learned new expressive arts skills. As a member of the Warsop community and as a Drama Practitioner myself, it was fantastic to be able to work within the community to deliver such a project.

Actor, Director and Teacher, Andrew Proctor led Acting for Camera sessions alongside his colleague, film maker John Turell. Vision West Nottinghamshire College supported the sessions by providing a green screen and camera equipment. The college also sent work experience students who were extremely supportive of the pupils and helped them to create and film their scenes. Andrew Proctor and I also delivered Stage Combat sessions, teaching the pupils the secret tricks of the trade resulting in some very convincing fight sequences. It was impressive to see how quickly the pupils picked up the techniques and lost their inhibitions to perform with confidence in front of their peers.



Over the three days other sessions were delivered including Art sessions led by Vibrant's Mike Payne, where pupils used themselves as inspiration for their own graffiti art pieces which unearthed some wonderful talent. Warsop's Vicky Kennedy led

very popular Christmas themed Zumba sessions, combining dance and fitness, and Dr Adam Watkins representing CDO Capoeira Derby gave pupils an introduction to the non contact Brazilian martial art whilst also bringing along his Samba drums, making for a very high energy morning.



The pupils especially enjoyed the Christmas themed singing sessions led by musician Jon Orton and the instrumental sessions led by local guitar teacher Paul Betts (pictured below right).

It was particularly exciting to see other pupils showcasing their own abilities by teaching their friends how to play the guitar or ukulele or to see some of those pupils play and sing songs to the whole class, which is an extremely nerve wracking thing to do.

Kim Hickinbothom, Head of Year nine at Meden School worked closely with Vibrant to organise the programme of Arts taster sessions. She said that 'the sessions for us were fantastic, the students really enjoyed them and it has helped us in our plight to raise aspirations here at Meden. We have had a number of students asking about arts careers and the decision has been made to bring music and singing back to the curriculum which is amazing'.

I look forward to seeing how these taster sessions will kick start even more creative work being carried out in the school and in the community.

## Meden school is working hard to become greener and to improve not only the school environment, but that of the local community.



Being Eco-friendly is a big buzz word at the moment but as a conscientious school we believe it is increasingly important for us to ensure we are leading the way in making positive changes and setting a great example as such a big part of the Warsop community.

In September Meden school embarked on its journey to become an international Green Flag Award Eco-School. The programme is designed to raise environmental awareness among young people and is run by the environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy.

Internationally, the programme is the largest educational programme in the world present in 67 countries and 52,000 schools.

Our school is now part of this global community working to create environmental change for the benefit of future generations.

The Eco-Schools programme empowers students, raises environmental awareness, improves the school environment and can also lead to financial savings for schools. Being an active member of the programme will be something our students will remember for the rest of their lives.

The group in Meden is made up of dedicated students from every year group and teachers from varying subjects, they meet on a weekly basis, learning new things, developing their ideas and putting their plans into action to gain their green flag status.

At Meden School the eco schools club has named themselves the Meden Eco Warriors and they have already established some great recycling habits, one being the crisp packet recycling drive in association with Terra cycle. The Meden Eco warriors have set up Crisp packet recycling points throughout the school and every half term they collect them all, and we ship them off to Terra Cycle.

This scheme has an incentive of earning terra cycle points that are converted to a donation for the school or our chosen charity.

Eco Warriors has also proposed many new ideas to save energy, things as simple as turning of classroom lights when the last person leaves, to sharing resources and encouraging safe cycling and walking to school.

Meden school prides itself on its community involvement and already has close links Vibrant Warsop and Future Greens projects where students involve themselves in community litter



picks, environmental improvements and local conservation projects.

In addition to this positive community involvement and the Meden Eco Warriors club, Meden School is taking part in the BIG SCHOOL CLEAN UP, as part of their big eco project. This will run from the 30th March to the 13th of April 2020 and is supported by Keep Britain Tidy.

Each year group from 7-10 will be responsible for a part of the school and the local vicinity that they will litter pick and they will also take part in me@meden lessons that will further encourage positive change to help our environment.

This whole school approach is going to ensure that a really thorough spring clean takes place and that along with the cosmetic changes that are taking place in the school, we have a clean, fresh and inviting school that we are even more proud of.



**Harold Larwood** (14 November 1904 – 22 July 1995) was a professional cricketer for Nottinghamshire and England between 1924 and 1938. A right-arm fast bowler who combined unusual speed with great accuracy, he was considered by many commentators to be the finest bowler of his generation.

We our course have our own local hero, **Bruce French** (born 13 August 1959 in Market Warsop), a former English cricketer, who played in sixteen Tests and thirteen ODIs for England from 1985 to 1988. A wicket-keeper/batsman, French played his first Test against India at Headingley, Leeds in 1986, and his last Test against New Zealand in Wellington in March 1988.

French played his county cricket exclusively for Nottinghamshire. Cricket writer, Colin Bateman, described French as "a wicketkeeper of the highest calibre". Bruce is still involved in international cricket as England's wicket keeping coach. His nephew Jake Ball also plays test cricket for England.

So for those of us who really don't like these winter months and are fed up of looking at the same four walls we have another option for you. Come and try out our recreational cricket session from 11am on Thursdays.

Anyone above the age of 18 is welcome.

If you have never played cricket before this is your opportunity to learn and have a little gentle exercise at the same time. ### Footpath & **Countryside Group**

The old saying "Ash before Oak - we're in for a soak, Oak before Ash - we're in for a splash" suggests that we should look at trees to check whether this summer is going to be as wet as last winter.



Usually our local oaks are in full leaf whilst the ash's buds are only just bursting but in a cold spring the oaks are more affected than the ash trees, so as springs get warmer the oaks come into leaf earlier, ash trees do too, but not as quickly as do the oaks – they're being left behind. So now it's only in a very cold spring that we are likely to see "Ash before Oak".

Along our hedgerows there will be other signs of spring as the white flowers of blackthorn appear before their leaves whereas the leaf buds of hawthorn will burst ahead of any flowers opening.

Frogs should be mating any time now so, if you have a pond, it is worth checking for their spawn and maybe protecting it from any hungry birds. Resident frogs in your garden are a good way of controlling the slug population. If you haven't got any frogs, try digging a pond!

We will soon be changing our workday focus to our annual programme of mowing along Warsop's footpaths. According to our records the volunteers of Warsop Footpaths & Countryside Group spent 539 volunteer hours maintaing footpaths and managing wildlife sites around Warsop Parish in 2019!, We didn't record how many bags of litter we collected!

Everybody can help us keep the footpaths accessible by walking along them! Boots are an excellent way of keeping the grass short! We have some brilliant routes around Warsop's countryside, we just need more folk to use them. If you regularly walk a particular path you could become an unofficial footpath warden. All you have to do is clip off any brambles or twigs invading the path and carry a bag to pick up any litter. Quite a few folk do this already, their efforts are appreciated.

Soon the damaging Himalayan balsam plants will be appearing along our riverbanks. Over the past few years volunteers have reduced the number of these invasive non-native plants growing between the Mill Dam and Hammerwater Bridge from over 4000 plants to only 2 last year. However, the situation downstream from the mill is not as promising. We need to be vigilant as the winter floods may have spread seeds coming downstream. If you are lucky enough to have a garden bordering on a river or brook please check that none of these plants are growing on your land and preferably pull them up before they flower and definitely do not let them seed.

The Footpaths Group's walks take place on the third Saturday of most months. We usually meet at 10am outside Warsop Library and we either walk around Warsop or travel to a starting point a few miles away by car. On these walks we usually place more emphasis on enjoying the countryside than clocking up the miles!
