

NEW HEALTH HUB OPENS IN WARSOP PARISH

The Warsop Health Hub, off Carr Lane in Warsop, was officially opened by the Executive Mayor of Mansfield and local community champion Graham Hall, MBE, at a ribbon-cutting ceremony (18 June). Also in attendance at the event was Tour of Britain cyclist Ross Lamb, as well as Mansfield Harriers representatives, Deputy Lord Lieutenant Tracey Davenport, pupils from Birklands Primary School, and wider strategic stakeholder partners.

The hub is now home to various new facilities, including a 15×8 -metre swimming pool and splash play area, a changing village, a gym, a multi-purpose hall, a café, and a community space area. Also, the newly tarmacked multi-use games area to play sports outdoors is now open to residents, still free of charge, just behind the new building. The delivery of the council's £9.1 million health hub was made possible thanks to funding agreements secured from various partners and agencies. This includes up to £5 million from the council, a £1.8 million capital grant from Sport England, a £3 million allocation from the Government's Towns Fund, and £103,967 from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government to create a dedicated changing place within the building.

Executive Mayor of Mansfield, Andy Abrahams, said: "I am thrilled that we are finally at the opening event for Warsop Health Hub, months ahead of schedule. In the last year, it has been a dream come true to see such progress being made to bring a community facility to the people of Warsop.

"It has been a labour of love and wouldn't have been possible without the commitment from fellow councillors, officers, funding partners, and, of course, the parish residents.

"I look forward to seeing the community embrace the new facility and make the most of all the opportunities it will bring in terms of employment, aspiration, and health and wellbeing."

Pupils from Birklands Primary School came along to sing to attendees at the opening event. Members of its school council then unveiled a plaque to commemorate a time capsule that pupils had filled with artwork and drawings before burying there in October last year. The hub is now operated by Serco Leisure/More Leisure Community Trust (MLCT), who are also responsible for the Mansfield district council's three other leisure facility sites in Mansfield: Rebecca Adlington, Oak Tree, and Water Meadows.

There are already more than 500 members signed up to the hub and most local schools have also enrolled in swimming sessions from September. A range of programmes to suit all ages and abilities has been developed to encourage residents in Warsop and beyond to get involved and use the new facility. Brian Taylor, Chair of MLCT said: "As a leisure trust, working with our partner Serco Leisure, we're very proud to have been chosen to operate this fantastic new facility, which offers such a broad range of fitness, wellbeing and community-focused amenities for the people of this region."

To ensure the long-term sustainability of the new centre, solar panels have been installed along with a new detention basin as part of Severn Trent's Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) programme. The water company partnered with the council to divert the existing car park surface water out of its combined sewer network and into sustainable drainage. The hub is just one of five projects funded from the £12.3m awarded to Mansfield District Council in 2021 from the Towns Fund allocation

Lisa Dodd-Mayne, Executive Director of Place at Sport England, said: "The Warsop Health Hub provides so many ways for local people of all ages and abilities to get active and connect to their community. It's the first facility to open following our 'Leisure Local concept' - co-created with the local community with a wide range of facilities available and also including measures to make it as environmentally sustainable as possible.



What a busy first year it has been for me in my role as District Councillor and Parish Councillor for Netherfield Ward. I have funded the relocation and refurbishment of the Parish notice board at the entrance to Pencil Park. Replacement bins are on order and MDC are sourcing the timbers for repairs to the seats and flower beds in the park.

Thanks to the individuals for help with litter picking round the area - it's a constant activity for me and I'm so glad of any help.

It's been a very successful year for Meden Vale Football club, including Colts teams - all of their achievements can be seen on their social media pages

The 1816 group continue their sterling work maintaining public footpaths round the Parish. Vibrant Warsop holds coffee mornings at The Meden (Methodist Church) every Friday 9.30 – 11.30 where people meet to chat, enjoy table top and indoor games and have a good old natter. I have secured a cornet player for the Remembrance Day service at the Meden Methodist Church this year. There is now a bottle bank in the recycling centre at the car park. I have made links with Netherfield Infants and Eastlands Junior schools, which will lead hopefully to participation in some fun activities.

I have been impressed by local company, Power Saving Solutions, who are keen to work with local people for employment and made a donation to the schools for new books.

I am still working to get Nottinghamshire County Council to review the speed limit between Old Church Warsop and Meden Vale, and have been informed that following my intervention work is scheduled to clear the path along Netherfield Lane to Gleadthorpe cottages - though I don't have a date to share as yet. I have asked for height signs to be installed for the railway bridge, to ensure oversized vehicles are not coming through the village. I've spoken to lots of residents during the recent General Election campaign, and I'm happy to speak with anyone in the community. You'll still see me doing my rounds with my litter grabber and blue bin baas!

It's been great to continue working with the local community groups throughout the year, I have really enjoyed helping the Friends of Warsop Vale to put on events at The Centre. I also want to take this opportunity to personally thank the Friends of The Carrs for everything they do on the park, they do some fantastic work to keep the park looking so good for everyone to enjoy.

The tree planting event I helped to arrange earlier in the year at Warsop Vale was very successful, a huge thank you to all the people that came along and helped to plant all the trees. I am really looking forward to seeing them grow in the future.

Lastly, as you know there have been a few elections this year, congratulations to Claire Ward and Gary Godden on successfully being elected to their roles as our Regional Mayor and Police & Crime Commissioner for Nottinghamshire in the May elections, and Steve Yemm on being elected as the MP for Mansfield & Warsop in the general election.
